I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF
Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:
(A) Second Amendment (Second Amendment) to Term Contract for the Operation and Maintenance of Baggage Handling Systems (BHS) at the Palm Beach International Airport (PBI) (Contract No. 23-015/MD; R2023-0219) (Contract) with Oshkosh AeroTech LLC (Oshkosh) increasing the not to exceed amount by \$7,111,174.03, providing for the renewal of the Contract for one (1) additional one (1) year term, commencing February 28, 2025, and expiring on February 27, 2026, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one (1) year periods; and
(B) A Budget Transfer in the amount of \$4,542,469, in the Airport's Operations Fund to provide budget for the Amendment; and
(C) A Budget Amendment in the amount of \$4,459,639, in the Airport's Improvement an Development Fund to provide budget for the Amendment.
Summary: On February 7, 2023, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approved the Contract for the operation, maintenance and repair of the BHS and related equipment at PE in the amount of \$4,417,698.07 with an initial term of two (2) years. On May 14, 2024, the BC approved the First Amendment to the Contract (R2024-0574), increasing the contract amount by \$2,928,626.63 for a total contract amount of \$7,346,324.70, which provided for replacement of two (2) baggage claim carousel units. The Contract expires on February 27, 2025, with the option to renew for three (3) additional one (1) year periods. The Second Amendment exercises the first renewal term, commencing on February 28, 2025, and expiring on Februar 27, 2026, and increases the contract amount by \$7,111,174.03 for a total contract amount \$14,457,498.73. The Second Amendment includes funding for the operation, maintenance and repair of the BHS and related equipment, including the replacement of two (2) additional baggage claim carousel units. Airlines utilizing the BHS at PBI pay for the full cost of the system through rates and charges established annually in accordance with the Signator Airline Agreement (R2019-1155). Oshkosh's principal place of business is Orlando, Florida This Contract was presented to the Goal Setting Committee on July 6, 2022, and the Committee established an Affirmative Procurement Initiative (API) of Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Evaluation Preference for SBE participation. Oshkosh committed to 17.609 SBE participation achieved on this Contract is 15%. Pursuant to changes to Chapter 332 Florida Statutes, effective July 1, 2023, a governing body of a medium hub commercial servical airport may not approve purchases of contractual services in excess of \$1,000,000 on consent agenda. The Second Amendment exceeds the threshold amount and must be approved on the regular agenda. Countywide (AH)
Background and Policy Issues: The BHS provides for the sortation and conveyance of checked baggage from the ticket counters to baggage makeup areas for pick up by the airline and includes the baggage claim carousels that deliver baggage to arriving passengers. The continued functionality of the BHS is critical to on-going airline operations.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT FOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF BAGGAGE HANDLING SYSTEMS AT PALM BEACH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (Contract No. 23-015/MD)

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT, dated ________, 2025, to Contract No. 23-015/MD, dated February 7, 2023, is made by and between Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of Commissioners ("COUNTY"), and Oshkosh AeroTech, LLC, located at 7300 Presidents Drive, Orlando, FL, a corporation authorized to do business in the State of Florida, ("CONTRACTOR").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and John Beach Technologies Corporation ("JBT") entered into that certain Contract dated February 7, 2023 (R2023-0219) ("Contract"), whereby JBT agreed to operate, maintain, and repair all inbound, outbound automated Checked Baggage Inspection System/Checked Baggage Reconciliation Areas (CBIS/CBRA), and manual sortation Baggage Handling Systems ("BHS") and related equipment at the Palm Beach International Airport; and

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2024, the COUNTY approved the assignment of the Contract from JBT to JBT Aerotech Corporation ("JBT Aerotech"); and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2024, JBT Aerotech changed its name to Oshkosh Aerotech, LLC; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into that certain First Amendment to the Contract, dated May 14, 2024 (R2024-0574), ("First Amendment"); and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Contract as provided for in this Second Amendment.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements expressed herein, the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR agree as follows:

1. RECITALS:

The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated by reference.

2. <u>ARTICLE 3 - SCHEDULE</u>, is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The CONTRACTOR shall commence services on February 28, 2023, and complete all services by February 27, 2026, with two (2) one (1) year options for renewal at the sole discretion of the COUNTY.

Reports and other items shall be delivered and/or completed in accordance with Exhibit A.

- 3. <u>ARTICLE 4 PAYMENTS TO CONTRACTOR</u>, paragraph A, is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
 - A. The total amount to be paid by the COUNTY under this contract shall not exceed Fourteen Million Four Hundred Fifty-Seven Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-Eight Dollars and Seventy-Three Cents (\$14,457,498.73), comprised of Four Million Six Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Sixty-Three Dollars and Eleven Cents (\$4,603,163.11) for the operation and maintenance, and Nine Million Eight Hundred Fifty-Four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-Five Dollars and Sixty-Two Cents (\$9,854,335.62) for special project work, including but not limited to, subcontracted/support work, parts, equipment, supplies and software.

The CONTRACTOR shall notify the COUNTY's representative, in writing, when ninety percent (90%) of the total "not-to-exceed amount" has been reached.

- 4. Exhibit A, Scope of Work/Services, Section 18, <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

 <u>REQUIREMENTS</u>, is hereby amended to add the following services:
 - N. The CONTRACTOR shall provide porter services for baggage on as needed basis as directed by COUNTY.
- 5. <u>ARTICLE 37 HUMAN TRAFFICKING AFFIDAVIT</u>, is hereby added to the Contract to read as follows:

CONTRACTOR warrants and represents that it does not use coercion for labor or services as defined in Section 787.06, Florida Statutes. CONTRACTOR has executed Exhibit D, Nongovernmental Entity Human Trafficking Affidavit, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

- Exhibit A, Scope of Work/Services, subsection B of Section 21, <u>DUTIES THE</u>
 <u>CONTRACTOR IS NOT REQUIRED TO PERFORM</u>, is hereby deleted in its
 entirety.
- 7. Exhibit D, Nongovernmental Entity Human Trafficking Affidavit, attached hereto as Attachment No. 1, is hereby incorporated to the Contract.
- All other provisions of the Contract are hereby confirmed and, except as provided herein, are not otherwise altered or amended and shall remain in full force and effect.
- In accordance with Palm Beach County Code Chapter 2, Article III, Section 2.51, as amended, this Second Amendment shall not take effect until executed by the CONTRACTOR and COUNTY.
