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

Perth awaits you

ith the Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan running through its heart, Perth is a destination like no other, glowing with diversity and dreamlike experiences that will ignite the soul and stimulate connection with the land and life all around you. Throughout Perth, the sun

radiates gloriously by day while city lights and shimmering stars

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illuminate the clear skies by night. Perhaps the most dazzling time of all is dusk, when otherworldly sunsets splash across the horizon, over the ocean to the west.

Dive in and find vibrant, urban life through the cultural and contemporary spaces of Perth City and the eclectic and artsy Fremantle further south – both brimming with unique boutiques, lively music scenes, small bars and refined restaurants.

A short ferry-ride away, Rottnest Island off Perth's coast is a place to slow down and sink into a different frame of mind – with incredible coastal scenes featuring distinctive flora and fauna, and mesmerising marine experiences across its collection of beaches and bays.


For extravagant long-lunches, fine wine and family-friendly days out, the Swan Valley to Perth City's east is renowned; with the Perth Hills nearby offering artisan produce and nature escapes with rustic charm.

The long stretch of glimmering Sunset Coast to the west offers an invigorating sanctuary to cool off amid summer heat. While to the

east in the Avon Valley, rolling hills and sweeping countryside transform into lush fields of colourful blooms following winter rains, and vibrant towns brimming with history and heritage beckon you to come explore.

Venture further south to Rockingham, Mandurah and the Peel region where you'll find aquatic havens blessed with beautiful beaches and waterways to swim, surf, kayak and cruise. The opportunities for both family time and adrenaline-inducing activities here are endless.

Whether you select just a few destinations to discover or choose to explore them all, Perth will leave you starstruck and inspired.





WITH AN ABUNDANCE OF PLACES TO SEE AND THINGS TO DO AROUND PERTH, WE'VE MADE IT FASY TO GET TO FACH DESTINATION SO YOU CAN EXPLORE IT ALL.

PERTH CITY

From Perth Airport, it's a 25-minute drive by taxi or rideshare service to Perth City, or you can take the new Airport Link service to arrive in just 18 minutes. Regular bus services are also available, which you can plan using Transperth Journey Planner. Once in the city, get around with convenience by catching the free CAT buses. You can also take the ferry from Elizabeth Quay for a scenic route to South Perth.

FREMANTLE

Located 35 minutes south of Perth City by car – drive, catch a bus, take the train following the Fremantle line, or cruise from Elizabeth Quay. Once in Fremantle, the city is easily walkable.

ROTTNEST ISLAND

The most common means of arriving on Rottnest Island is by ferry from either Fremantle, Hillarys Boat Harbour, or Barrack Street Jetty in the Perth CBD; taking approximately 30, 45, or 90 minutes respectively.

Book through Rottnest Express, Rottnest Fast Ferries, or SeaLink Rottnest Island. Alternatively, catch a swift, 20-minute flight with Swan River Seaplanes for breath-taking scenery from another vantage point, landing directly in front of Thomson Bay. Once on the island, cycling is a great way to get around, or jump aboard the regular hop-on, hop-off Rottnest Island Explorer Bus that circuits the island. The private, sevenseater electric Quokka Hopper transfer also runs on-demand from Thomson Bay to Geordie Bay, stopping at a dozen convenient locations in between.

SWAN VALLEY

Located 25 minutes northeast of Perth City by car - drive, or catch the train following the Midland line to Guildford Station to take a 15-minute taxi or rideshare service into the heart of the valley. If it's convenience you seek, rent a vehicle and visit any attraction or venue, at your leisure. Alternatively,

book a day tour for a hassle-free journey or, make your way in style on a cruise up the Swan River, departing Elizabeth Quay with Captain Cook Cruises.

SUNSET COAST

The closest beach to Perth City, City Beach, is located 15 minutes away by car. Head up or down the coast by car or bus to explore the breadth of Perth's beaches.

ROCKINGHAM

Located 45 minutes south of Perth City by car - drive or take the train following the Mandurah line. Once you arrive, get around easily with the assistance of frequent buses. Bus route 555 (Rockingham Shuttle) will take you direct to the foreshore.

MANDURAH & THE PEEL REGION

Located an hour's drive from Perth City - drive or take the train following the Mandurah line. Get around by car or book a day tour.

PERTH HILLS

Located 45 minutes southeast of Perth City by car - drive or book a day tour for a hassle-free journey.

AVON VALLEY

Located just over an hours' drive northeast of Perth City by car drive, catch the weekly AvonLink train to Toodyay or Northam, or book a day tour of the Avon Valley for a hassle-free journey.

STAY CONNECTED

Perth has recently upscaled its transport system with a major investment into the Perth METRONET. With 23 new stations added, transport from Yanchep all the way to Mandurah will become more accessible for all. The new Airport Link was also a major addition to transport developments, providing swift, reliable and cheaper connections into Perth.

lowing through the heart of Perth City / Boorloo, the Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan has forever been at the core of life in this beautiful and bountiful destination, well before modern streetscapes and contemporary buildings came to be. According to Noongar Dreamtime, the Waugul (giant rainbow serpent) wove its way through the land and carved out the sacred Derbarl Yerrigan at the beginning of creation, giving life to all around. Being a primary food source for the Whadjuk Noongar people of the Boorloo plains, less than 200 years ago, the river's banks were lined with paperbark trees and fish, frogs, turtles and crustaceans abounded. The rich swampland tracks of Boorloo Bilya, trodden for thousands of years by Noongar people, have over time been transformed into Perth's urban cityscape, where the river remains a fundamental element and lifegiving asset to the area. There is an endless fountain of knowledge to learn from the traditional owners of this land.

Learn about Noongar culture, connection to Country, history, Dreamtime stories and Aboriginal art from one of the many inspiring and educational Aboriginal tour guides within Perth, offering a diverse mix of authentic and immersive experiences accessible to all.

Experience Kings Park / Karrgatup, Elizabeth Quay / Goomup, or Yagan Square / Goologolup through a Noongar lens on an immersive walking tour with Go Cultural **Aboriginal Tours & Experiences** For a truly rich experience, make your way to Rottnest Island / Wadjemup where its lead guides, Noongar man Walter McGuire and Kungarakan woman Meg McGuire, will share with you the Noongar connection to Wadjemup, the island's complex past, and welcome you to participate in sand and smoking ceremonies.

In Perth City, Mervyn Abraham of Warrang-Bridil (meaning 'enlighten to acknowledge') will

take you on an inspirational and educational tour. Learn of Noongar language and traditional Aboriginal lifestyle, while identifying the positive cultural influence in the development of the Optus Stadium Precinct and Matagarup Bridge along the way.

In Mandurah, slow down on an overnight camping tour with Goolamwiin to truly experience the ways of local Aboriginal culture and connection to Country. An authentic Welcome to Country, immersive walking tour, bushfoods tasting, Noongar language session, interactive artefacts experience, and a campfire dinner with Dreamtime stories under the stars are all part of the journey; with an artist workshop and traditional performance optional. Hosted by Noongar woman Kerry Stack and Noongar man Trevor Stack, expect everlasting memories from this enriching experience.



THE SIX NOONGAR SEASONS

The Aboriginal six-season calendar varies for different groups throughout the state and across Australia, acting as an extremely important guide for what nature is doing at every stage of the year. By listening to the seasons, learning how to live safely, sustainably, and respectfully in relation to the land, animals, and plant cycles, Aboriginal culture ensures the natural preservation of ecosystems.

Look to Wardandi Bibbulmun woman Dale Tilbrook and book one of her Dale Tilbrook Experiences to taste the incredible breadth of bush tucker foods found across the Swan Valley, or try your hand at intricate Aboriginal dot painting. Drop in to Maalinup Aboriginal Gallery at Mandoon Estate to admire the artworks on display and sample native bush tucker. The healing properties of various bush medicines and how to work sustainability with the Noongar six seasons are another specialty of Dale.





Explore Elizabeth Quay, Rockingham's Point Peron, Lake Richmond / Walyungup, or Kings Park on a walking tour with Djurandi Dreaming led by Whadjuk man Justin Martin. Learn of the spiritual significance of certain landmarks and locations to Aboriginal people and envision another way of living as you hear the stories of life prior to colonisation.

FRINGE WORLD

Kicking off in January until late-February each year, FRINGE WORLD showcases on eclectic mix of artists and acts, from quirky circus, cabaret and comedy to theatre, film, visual arts and contemporary dance. Its leading precinct, 'The Pleasure Garden' at Russell Square, captures the essence of FRINGE with its vibrant carnival of food, beverage, and creative acts. There's also hubs 'The Urban Orchid' at Perth Cultural Centre and 'Liberty Fringe', taking over the old Liberty Theatre on Barrack Street, too.

PERTH FESTIVAL

Perth's longest running and fully curated arts festival Perth Festival, converges with FRINGE on the summer calendar, running from February to March each year. Showcasing a carefully considered range of artists, musicians, writers, and films, Perth Festival brings world-class performances to the city's stages. For the first time, The Rechabite will be home to Perth Festival's 2023 contemporary Music Program across 20 dazzling nights.





Perth City - BOORLOO

SUN-KISSED AND INTOXICATING, PERTH CITY / BOORLOO LIGHTS UP LIKE NO OTHER PLACE. ITS SLOWER-PACED ATMOSPHERE MERGED WITH CULTURAL VIBRANCY SENDS A THREAD OF CONNECTION PULSING THROUGH ITS STREETS.

IN PERTH, YOU'LL find a destination draped in natural beauty offering the best parts of urban life at a relaxed pace - with enough spellbinding green open space to breathe deeply, thanks to its 26 parkland areas and reserves.

The mesmerising Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan that flows and glimmers daily under the piercing Western Australian sky is fundamental to our capital city's origins.

Today, the Swan River remains an integral part of Noongar spirit

and culture and with the city set beside it, it's at the heart of Perth's activities and ecology.

There's no spot to appreciate the ethereal beauty of 'The Swan' quite like **Elizabeth Quay**, a picturesque recreational precinct located along the waterfront.

In Elizabeth Quay, you'll be welcomed by luxury accommodation like The Ritz Carlton, DoubleTree by Hilton Perth Waterfront and Quay Perth. Find yourself in awe of million-dollar views as you wine and dine at the

range of waterside restaurants and rooftop bars, including 18 Knots and Henry's Rooftop @ The Reveley.

Did you know, Perth is the only place within Australia where you can depart by boat from a capital city and arrive in an award-winning wine region on the same day? Set off from Elizabeth Quay's Barrack Street Jetty with Captain Cook Cruises on an indulgent expedition to the Swan Valley wine region, or journey to the port city of Fremantle where this eclectic and artsy town is your oyster to explore.





TIP // Start your holiday with an immersive walking tour with Two Feet & a Heartbeat or Oh Hey WA to familiarise yourself with the city.

Be sure to check out the iconic and distinctively designed Bell Tower at Barrack Square too, offering stunning views of the Swan River from the sixth-floor open air observation deck.

Wander north of The Bell Tower and enter the heart of the CBD, where heritage abounds in Perth's east end.

The State Buildings bordered by Barrack Street and the bustling St Georges Terrace are the jewels in the heritage crown of Perth's enchanting east end. Connecting three iconic heritage buildings into one vibrant cultural destination, the stunning State

Buildings house a collection of contemporary restaurants, cool bars, cutting-edge boutiques, charming cafés, the world-class hotel COMO The Treasury and its Shambhala Wellness Retreat. Start at Petition's Beer Corner or Wine Merchant before dinner at one of the precincts culinary gems such as Petition, Post, Long Chim, or the rooftop venue Wildflower. Nearby at Hibernian Place, you'll


find another exquisite example of an old-meets-new precinct, including luxury accommodation, The Westin Perth.

Visit The Perth Mint along Hay Street and absorb a golden nugget of West Australian history. Founded in 1899 to refine the gold exploding out of the state's goldfields, take a tour at the mint and learn of legends of WA's past, admire a gold coin weighing one tonne and watch a live gold pouring using historic techniques.

Visit the Perth City Visitor Kiosk to pick up a map and embark on a selfguided art, history, or heritage tour; or allow one of their knowledgeable guides to lead the way.

Perth's west end is renowned for its small bar and dining scene, which breathes electricity into the air of the city centre.

Tucked within laneways and elevated upon rooftops, in Perth's west end you'll find young professionals post-work at polished bars boasting cocktails by impressive mixologists – if you



KINGS PARK IS one of the world's largest and most magical inner-city parks. Perched atop a limestone

escarpment overlooking Perth City, from this serene vantage point, you can observe the brilliantly coloured sails of boats on the river by day and the twinkling lights of the city from dusk.

The park is also home to the spellbinding Western Australian Botanic Garden, which showcases over 3,000 species of the state's exquisite flora.

Picnic on grass within cultivated gardens while the kids explore impressive nature playgrounds, jog by the untamed bushland reserves, attend one of the summer outdoor concerts under the stars, or step into Aboriginal Dreamtime and become absorbed in stories from the oldest living culture on earth.

Nyungar Tours and Go Cultural are some of the local guides who welcome you to join them for a tour of their Country.

TIP // Visit in September for the Kings Park Festival and admire the enchanting pink field of everlastings.



TIP// Visit His Majesty's Theatre for first-class performances from comedy and drama to ballet and opera.

know where to look. Perth boasts an enviable collection of intimate drinking dens hidden in plain sight. Along St Georges Terrace alone, seek out prohibition-style Bobeche based downstairs at The Heritage, Foxtrot Unicorn hidden in an underground bank vault where access requires imagination, the chic Terrarium bar where lush greenery envelops the surrounds, and Bar Lafayette situated below ground in the stunning heritagelisted Old Perth Technical School. On Queen Street, the bar Arara, is the place to be if exotic cocktails are up your alley; while the block over, blended into the streetscape, Varnish on King is an underground whiskey bar worth finding. Laneway bar Wolf Lane is one to uncover -



just peek behind the black door and become immersed in latenight mystique.

Enjoy an evening out in this sophisticated side of town. For modern, Australian cuisine with world-class wine and a stunning setting, there's Balthazar based in the art deco 'Lawsons' apartment block, the simple yet elegant Heritage Wine Bar for which the name says it all, and the chic and upbeat Tiny's bar, restaurant and liquor emporium that's all about big flavours and its wood-fired grill.

For international fare, try the underground Lalla Rookh Bar & Eating House for Italian; the sophisticated Miss Mi for modern Asian dining adjoining the Novotel Perth Murray Street hotel; or the Spanish-influenced Ascua where fresh WA produce is theatrically cooked on a wood-fired grill.

Connecting Murray and Hay Street, more multi-cultural dining – like the delicious Rojiura Curry Samurai – can be found down the bustling brick-paved Shafto Lane, also studded with cafés and bars.

Make a day of it and explore the west end's many retail hubs, including Piccadilly Arcade, Wesley Quarter, Trinity Arcade, Raine Square and Forrest Chase where high-end and chic boutiques reside. The quaint London Court laneway is an architectural treasure that will take you back in time to a historic era.

NORTHBRIDGE

Cross over the horseshoe bridge from Perth's centre, or meander through the Yagan Square precinct to find yourself in Northbridge.

Home to Perth's Cultural Centre, Northbridge is oozing with multicultural and creative activity.

Its iconic arts festivals attract acts and audiences from far and wide each year to deliver monumental seasonal bursts of creative talent. Expect a colourful explosion of weird, whacky and wonderful independent acts of all varieties when FRINGE WORLD lands in town; while Perth Festival injects a much-desired dose of artistic excellence into the local scene, with its carefully curated line-up of dance, theatre, music events and more.

TIP // Experience movies with atmosphere in the summer months at Fringe World's Rooftop Movies in Northbridge.

In Northbridge, Perth's nightlife capital, you'll find eclectic crowds enjoying well-crafted cocktails and local tunes. William Street runs through its core with a wealth of restaurants and small bars to explore. For fine, intimate wine bars with tasty share plates, try North Bird, Shadow Wine Bar, Wines of While, or Vincent Wines - a short stroll from one to the next. Discover diverse eateries like Bivouac Canteen & Bar, Double Rainbow and Francoforte Spaghetti Bar; cocktail bars loved by locals like The Bird, Ezra Pound, and Mechanics Institute; as well as ample boutiques, quirky bookshops, and op shopping options. Northbridge is booming with artisan ice-creameries, with Kuld Creamery, Chico Gelato and Whisk Creamery – all found on William Street – serving delicious treats. Around the corner, along Roe Street, you'll also find the local Chinatown where endless oriental options and late-night feeds will leave you feeling satisfied.

Inner City Neighbourhoods

PERTH METROPOLITAN IS home

to many precincts that have developed their own distinct personalities over time, forming village-like districts radiating heart, soul and spirit.

In these vibrant areas, the streets are lined with vintage style boutiques and designer stores, popular wine bars and diverse restaurants. You'll also find lush green parks, playgrounds, and skate parks where the kids can roam free; plus, theatre and film for lovers of art and culture.

CITY OF VINCENT

City of Vincent is home to a collection of humming hubs, with Leederville, Mount Hawthorn, Highgate and North Perth all lively cultural and culinary hives in their own right.

Located conveniently along the train line, just three kilometres from Perth city; Leederville is one of Perth's most well-established inner-city precincts, equipped with a welcoming community skate park and brimming with boutiques, bright cafés, multicultural restaurants, wine bars, beer gardens and lively



clubs. Make your way to Oxford Street to be right in the thick of it. Caffeinate at Queen of Leeds or Pixel Coffee Brewers before browsing the myriad of boutiques on the main strip. Urban Depot has it all, from vinyl records and kitsch collectables to fashionable fits and accessories. Discover high-class labels at Hunter Store and Perlu, or luxurious skincare and scents over at Remedy.

With no shortage of small bars and lively restaurants, liven up the night with tapas at Duende or Pinchos, dine on authentic Italian at



Pappagallo, or treat yourself to a modern mix of shares at Naber or the new Powell's Fromagerie and Wine Bar.

TIP// Beaufort Street is another hotspot, day and night, for lively cafés diverse eateries, endless bars and boutiques.

A cultural institution for film lovers, you can't miss Leederville's Luna Palace Cinema with its retro red façade on the corner of Oxford and Vincent Street. This boutique movie theatre shows the best mix of arthouse, contemporary and classic films. Grab your popcorn, and perhaps a vino, and settle in.

SUBIACO

Just five kilometres from Perth city, Subiaco, affectionately known as "Subi," pulsates with character and local charm. Over recent years it's surged with stylish boutiques, vibrant bars and fine eateries — centred around the main strip, Rokeby Road. A prime destination for events, check what's on at the Subiaco Arts Centre and the artdeco Regal Theatre — captivating audiences since 1938 with its mix of music, comedy and theatre.

Lovers of culture will feel at home in Subiaco. The Subi Farmers Market holds a sense of nostalgia for many locals who faithfully source the freshest fruit and veg from its exhibiting farmers and producers. Held every Saturday from 8am to 12pm, make a morning of it and explore the explosion of colours, tastes and smells as you peruse artisanal stores featuring baked goods, handmade soaps, and serving multicultural cuisines.

TIP Discover Subi's own mesmerising sculptural giant, Bille Bob, somewhere among the streets - part of the Giants of Mandurah outdoor exhibition by Danish artist Thomas Dambo.

A hotspot for foodies, book in at one of the many notable restaurants for an evening of delicious dining. At Shui (like feng shui), you can expect to dine on moreish Asian-fusion share plates, exploding with flavour. Lulu La Delizia is renowned as the go-to for high quality yet comforting Italian, with fine wines to match; while Dilly Dally nearby is another Italian favourite, beckoning with its relaxed vibe. Missing Europe? Yiamas Greek Restaurant is the new kid on the block and justifiably buzzing.

There is no shortage of respectable drinking dens in Subi to hop your way through either. From the high-class Cherubino City Cellar, tucked away intimately upstairs; to the neighbourhood favourite hangout, Bark; to the chic Bar Amelie with its comprehensive but carefully curated drinks list plus morsels to match; to the cool, heritage-haven, Lums, where wine is the word on the street – there's an option for all occasions.

VICTORIA PARK

A 'south of the Swan River' gem, you can reach Victoria Park – or 'Vic' Park as the locals call it - by train, bus or foot from Perth city, which resides

just three kilometres to the west.

Vic Park really is a melting pot of multi-cultural cuisines, so hit Albany Highway and let your nose lead the way. From Asian fusion Neho Asian Tapas and ramen at multiple corners; to Burmese diner Mango Café; to authentic Middle Eastern all around, including premium Lebanese food at The Prophet - diversity of fare floods the streets.

Time for a beverage? Hailing from Denmark in the South West, Boston Brewing Co. has become



a hotspot for grabbing a fresh brew and gastropub fare; while you can't look past Victoria Park Hotel as an iconic institution with polished heritage. If you're a beer connoisseur, The Dutch Trading Co is 'the' place within the beer community – with 22 rotating taps profiling a range of brews from around the world. Venturing beyond the suburb of Vic Park, Blasta Brewing Co. in **Burswood** is another beer hall worthy of attention.

TIP// In **Lathlain** nearby, Laika is a cult café favourite for those in the know, while by night, soak up the sophisticated ambiance of Italian-inspired wine bar, Cosy Del's, next door.

Across the Swan River, to the east of the city, Optus Stadium is the world's most beautiful sporting facility and a multi-purpose venue for entertainment events, offering behind the scenes stadium tours. Immerse yourself in Aussie culture as you become one with the crowd watching AFL, roaring with every goal scored. It's a revered ground for international cricket too, another national favourite. When the sports stars take a break, blockbuster concerts take centre stage as the



stadium lights up with impressive effects – envision the crowds come alive to the sounds of major music acts.

Not only can you strap yourself in and tour Optus Stadium from the top but, here, on the Burswood Peninsula you can also climb to the top of Perth's landmark Matagarup Bridge and enjoy 360-degree views of the city from 72 metres above the river, before zip-lining back down to the Swan riverside.

While in Burswood, stay at Crown Perth and experience true luxury. Pamper yourself at the spa or lounge by the poolside, dine on fine food at one of its many impressive restaurants, watch a live performance at its world-class theatre, or hit the casino for a night of entertainment. It's the complete package.

SOUTH PERTH

South Perth is a vibrant suburb poised along the southern banks of the Swan River, acclaimed for its lush South Perth Foreshore – the most picturesque spot to admire the Perth city skyline. For those seeking a unique perspective of the city, Swan River Seaplanes offer exhilarating Perth City Scenic Flights paired with exclusive picnic packages, departing from Queen



Street Jetty.

Embrace the cool splash of water with an afternoon at Funcats Watersports, offering an array of aquatic activities - from catamaran boat hire to stand up paddle boards (SUPs). Bask in the sun while enjoying the dazzling views of the riverside surroundings as you work up an appetite. Another equally active and scenic means to experience the foreshore is on GoGo Active's Majestic Foreshore & East Perth Bike Tour. Begin at the Mindeerup Piazza



on Mends Street, the foreshore gateway of South Perth, and return back over the Narrows Bridge after a morning of guided riding.

Mends Street and Angelo Street are both vibrant strips buzzing with shops, cafés, restaurants and bars to experience. The Mends Street Arcade is home to it all, while the Angelo Street Market is a South Perth institution. Operating since 1988, it's oozing culture and its freshly made rolls are a must-try.

A trip to South Perth would not be complete without exploring the iconic Perth Zoo. This haven of diverse fauna from around the globe provides engaging experiences for all ages. South Perth is conveniently connected to Elizabeth Quay via regular ferry services, allowing for seamless exploration of the area's eclectic mix of attractions from Perth City. Or, stay in South Perth to experience it all – The Peninsula Riverside Serviced Apartments and Pagoda Resort & Spa are stand-out accommodation options.



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

Fremantle - WALYALUP

IN FREMANTLE / WALYALUP, BECOME CAPTIVATED BY A SPIRITED MARITIME CITY RADIATING CULTURE AND CHARACTER.

THERE'S SOMETHING IN the

air of Fremantle that sends a ripple of creativity, culture, and connection pulsing through the streets. Perhaps it's the salty westerly blowing in from the portside; wafts of incense, freshly roasted coffee and sweet honey cake mingling in the markets; the sound of buskers performing with soul, or the roar of punters echoing beyond beer gardens as the 'Freo' Dockers score an epic goal. Whatever it may be, discover it for yourself when you get lost in this diverse and charismatic destination.

Begin your journey at Fremantle's most central point, Walyalup Koort – meaning Fremantle's heart in Noongar language. In Walyalup Koort, get lost within FOMO, an impressive cultural hub that unites dining

and entertainment under one roof. Featuring an arcade, bowling centre, retro bar, mini golf centre, an alley of oriental street eats, and much more – there's something for the entire family here.

TIP // Short on time? Let the locals help you make the most of it on a vibrant and engaging chariot-ride with Peddle Perth or an immersive walking tour with Oh Hey WA.

Affectionately known as the 'Cappuccino Strip', South Terrace has a distinct Italian influence and has long been a Freolocals tradition for dining and entertainment options with cafés, restaurants, games arcades and pubs abound. Take time to walk from South Terrace through Market Street to discover endless

boutiques filled with shoes, books, local fashion labels and artisan goods.

Off the Cappuccino Strip, you'll find the enchanting and iconic Fremantle Markets. Having first opened in 1897, the Victorian era markets are abuzz with activity from Friday to Sunday with over 150 stalls offering fresh produce, jewellery, fashion, and craft wares. Stay close at the heritage hotel, Warders Hotel where you'll find the Asian inspired Emily Taylor restaurant and quaint Gimlet bar.

A dive into Fremantle history and heritage wouldn't be complete without a tour of the infamous Fremantle Prison. This UNESCO World Heritage-listed building was built by convict labour in the 1850s and incarcerated WA's most dangerous criminals right up to 1991. If the stories on offer don't

send an eerie chill down your spine, perhaps a chance ghost sighting will! Delve underground and explore the labyrinth of tunnels built by prisoners on a Fremantle Prison Tunnels Tour, to envision life doing tough time.

A 15 – 20-minute walk north of Fremantle Prison, you can discover another of Fremantle's original and gothic heritage jewels, the Fremantle Arts Centre. This is a must-visit attraction, housing visual art exhibitions and a stunning retail store, FOUND, stocked with handmade creations by local WA artisans. The arts centre also hosts epic summer concerts on its South Lawn, as well as Sunday summer music sessions in the front garden - true to the culture of Fremantle that sees musicians celebrated and supported across its rich mix of pubs and arts venues.

THE WEST END & VICTORIA QUAY

As a port city, Fremantle's maritime history runs deep and especially so in Victoria Quay the gateway to Rottnest Island / Wadjemup. Discover the vast riches of its history at the WA Maritime Museum and absorb the activity of the industry at present from the ultimate vantage point - Gage Roads Brewery. Situated on the edge of Victoria Quay within Fremantle Harbour, watch ships cruise into port and the sun sparkle across the waterfront with a locally brewed beer in hand and gastropub fare on your plate. With DJ sets every Friday and events regularly on the horizon, it's the place to stop to elevate your mood.

Departing Victoria Quay, jump on board one of Captain Cook's Cruises to explore the water from a new perspective while journeying further afield. Allow the luxury vessel to transport you direct to Perth, opt for a deluxe lunch along the way, or meander up the scenic Swan River.

On the southern side of Fremantle's port, you'll find the historic West End with the





Fremantle Bus & Train Station at its entrance. Marvel at the bestpreserved streetscapes of the 19th century gold rush, encompassing 250 late Georgian and Victorian style heritage buildings, whilst soaking up the youthful activity of its most recent occupiers, the University of Notre Dame.

A haven for creatives, in the West End you'll uncover a bounty of artisan boutiques, bars, modern restaurants and galleries tucked within its various nooks and crannies. To stay among it all, book in at the boutique Hougoumont Hotel or the beautifully restored and award-winning National Hotel. A stone's throw towards the port there's also Quest Fremantle,

among many more centrally based accommodation options across various budgets.

At the West End's westmost point in the Arthurs Head / Manjarree Precinct, wander up the steps to the Round House – the oldest standing building in Western Australia (1886) - and, with a gold coin donation, imagine life here as a prisoner of the Swan River Colony prior to the construction of Fremantle Prison. Breathe in the salty air and experience sweeping views of Cockburn Sound / Derbal Nara to the west and Fremantle Town Hall along High Street to the east.

FISHING BOAT HARBOUR

Further south, perched along the boardwalk, you'll find Fishing Boat Harbour – a vibrant and award-winning waterside where a banquet of seafood fare is on offer across Cicerello's, Kailis, Char Char and more. Gaze out across the glimmering water from the outdoor decks at the internationally acclaimed Little Creatures Brewery and witness the working harbour abuzz with activity, from sailboats to fishing trawlers.

Take to the water and turn the adrenaline up a notch on a jet boat ride with Cicerello's Jet Adventures, departing Fishing Boat Harbour. Exhilarating 270-degree turns, donuts and high-speed fishtails will have you testing new limits. Or, soar through the sky on a parasailing expedition to experience unsurpassable views of the mesmerising Fremantle coastline. For a deep dive into the

maritime activity of years gone by, visit the WA Shipwrecks Museum and admire hundreds of relics collected from ships wrecked along the state's treacherous coastline. The historic 1850s Commissariat building, housing the collection, makes it an exceptionally majestic sight to behold.

TIP // Book in at Be. Fremantle's bright and lofty serviced apartments to stay close to the activity and catch incredible views.

Adjacent to Fishing Boat Harbour, sprawl out under the shade of the Norfolk Island pines at Esplanade Reserve. Let the kids roam free at the popular youth plaza or ride the Fremantle Tourist Wheel for unbeatable vistas that stretch as far as Rottnest Island / Wadjemup.

SOUTH FREMANTLE

In South Fremantle, find a lively culinary and creative hub, ripe for blissful outdoor living. Scents of fresh bread exude from local bakeries like Wild Bakery and Little Loaf, working their magic in the mornings.

By day, bask in the radiant sunlight at South Beach Recreation Reserve, a picturesque oasis where picnics under the azure sky paint memories



of joy. Witness the seasonal pontoon come to life as the sun sets, with slackline walkers showcasing their talent nearby, and resonating tunes from buskers playing in the twilight. Grab fish and chips and a beer nearby and settle in.

Live like a local and satiate your craving for a well-crafted coffee at cafés like Kerfuffle Co and Little Lefroy's, before exploring the streets by foot. Admire the iconic East West Design mural along the stretch of South Terrace, capturing the essence of local culture, and wander through boutiques along Wray Avenue and South Terrace, where each shop is a treasure trove of unique finds and eclectic pieces.


By the afternoon to evening, the gastronomical glory of South Fremantle shines. Indulge with a fine seafood feast at Madelana's Bar & Restaurant or contemporary Mexican bites at the upbeat and colourful La Cabana. Vibrant and eclectic bars – like Percy Flint's, Wild in the Streets, and Patio Bar – abound.

The Local Hotel is an institution and an ideal spot to rest your head if you're seeking a boutique room with character, close by.

NORTH FREMANTLE

North Fremantle, a dynamic hub nestled along the inviting shores of Port and Leighton Beaches, offers a harmonious blend of vibrant live music scenes and varied culinary delights. For beachside dining, Bib & Tucker boasts an atmosphere of refined rascality, serving contemporary cuisine with stunning views of the expansive, golden sands of Leighton Beach. The Orange Box next door is a local's favourite for a casual bite, juice or coffee while soaking up the sun and sea breeze.





SURROUNDED BY THE expanse of the Indian Ocean, just 19km from the coast of Perth, the secluded Rottnest Island is such a profoundly special place. It's a place resonating with a powerful sense of connection pulsating through its brilliant bays and sheltered beaches, untamed bushland, and laidback, simple lifestyle. It's a place to make memories with the family, and to meditate with one's self. Arrive on the island via ferry, or by air, and feel completely at ease with zero traffic, free from crowds and city life. The iconic mode of transport on the island is a bicycle, while regular hop-on-hop-off buses and segway tours are also available.

Get to know Rottnest Island on a hike of the Wadjemup Bidi, comprised of five trails that showcase various landscapes and scenery from coastal headlands to stunning inland lakes. The Hike Collective curate inspiring tours, with The West End Guided Hike a favourite for its access to views of playful long-nosed fur seals from Cathedral Rocks.

TIP // Catch a 20-minute flight with Swan River Seaplanes for a swift and exhilarating arrival onto the island, landing right in front of Thomson Bay.

Let the wind whip through your hair and feel the sunshine on your back when cycling around to discover the island's collection of serene lakes and swimming spots.

The breadth of incredible snorkelling opportunities available is unparalleled. After a day of sunshine and soft sand, choose from countless alfresco precincts to settle into. From a beachside bar at dusk, watch the water reflecting oranges and purples in a spectacular sight unique to the western coast.

COTTESLOE BEACH

Known for the sloping grass banks and towering Norfolk pines that back onto its pristine sand and the iconic architecture of the Indiana Teahouse, Cottesloe Beach is a glorious spot for an afternoon swim before spreading a blanket and enjoying a meal alfresco as you

take in the sunset.

The park offers insight into the cultural significance of the land, flora, and fauna to its traditional Aboriginal owners. Nine hiking trails and Perth's only metropolitan cave experience, the Crystal Cave, also attract explorers to the park. With its expansive sand dunes, the Moore River region area, particularly Lancelin, is a popular spot for sandboarding and four-wheel driving, as well as windsurfing and kitesurfing, while sheltered nooks and wrecks home to schools of fish are perfect for avid anglers.

Kick-off a day of surf sports and waterside action at Scarborough or Trigg Beach. If you're new to surfing, book a lesson with the Scarborough Beach Surf School to learn the basics of surfing and surf etiquette. Class times vary but typically start at 7.15am.

For the more experienced surfers, hire your gear at Soul Board Store and head to Trigg Beach renowned as one of Perth's most reliable breaks. If you're not up for hitting the waves, the Scarborough Beach Pool offers a great place to get in a few early-morning laps, while the leisure pool offers a great option for less experienced swimmers or young families to dip their toes in the water.

10AM // BREAKFAST

Fuel up after your bout of activity with a cappuccino or fresh juice at one of the vibrant coffee shops or cafés along Scarborough's beachfront, before heading up Scarborough Hill behind the skate park to watch the locals carve up the surf. Livid Skate Café and Knead are both popular spots with the locals to grab your morning brew and a freshly baked bagel.

12PM // SNORKELLING

Travel a little further to Mettam's Pool, where you'll find coral reefs teeming with marine life to discover. Calm conditions offer a great place

for snorkelling and spotting local fish, starfish and molluscs.

5PM // NIGHTLIFE

As the sun starts to set, Scarborough's nightlife comes alive and sunset drinks in Scarborough means cocktails. Famous for its Spicy Margarita's and fresh Mexican fare, El Grotto is a favourite local hangout – stick around long enough and experience local DJs or live tunes. Try The Peach Pit for a range of fruity cocktails and spritzes, and watch as the dance floor comes to life after dark. The Sandbar has the ultimate sunset vantage point with ample alfresco dining.

WILDLIFE EXPLORER

8AM // YANCHEP LAGOON

The clear waters and warm temperature of northern Yanchep Lagoon Beach offer a perfect opportunity to get up close and personal with some wild marine life. Get an early start to your day to avoid the hot midday sun, and make the 45-minute drive north from Perth to Yanchep. Keep an eye out for crustaceans, octopus and manta-rays enjoying the shallow water, or discover the many rock pools for smaller marine life and coral formations.

12PM // YANCHEP NATIONAL PARK

The crystal caves of nearby Yanchep National Park offer some shelter from the rising sun after a

morning at the beach. Explore the underground limestone caves on a guided tour, winding through the many stalactites, stalagmites and helictites as you learn about the unique ecosystem of the caves and how these formations came to be.

There are also a number of walking trails to explore in the park, with the Wetlands Walk Trail an easy, two-kilometre walk around Loch McNess and its abundant birdlife.

2PM // HILLARYS BOAT HARBOUR

As the sun starts to really heat up for the day, head south to Hillarys Boat Harbour for a late lunch overlooking the marina. There are plenty of options for a bite to eat, but The Breakwater offers incredible views from its waterfront deck, while Little C's is an iconic, award-winning pizzeria with over 70 variations on offer.

5PM // AQWA

Once you've refuelled make your way to AQWA to learn more about Western Australia's unique under water world. For a captivating experience, snorkel with the sharks in the Shipwreck Coast aquarium where you'll come face to face with seven shark species, loggerhead turtles and schools of fish.

6PM // DINNER

After a day of exploring, enjoy a drink or bite to eat with spectacular sunset views over the ocean at Odyssea City Beach.



turquoise waters, long stretches of white sandy shores, accessible lakes, secluded islands, and protected marine parks mean your next aquatic adventure is always on the horizon.

Whether by boat, kayak, SUP (stand up paddle board) or surfboard, glide alongside friendly dolphins and discover an underwater world of colourful marine life when cruising the waters off Rockingham's expansive 37km coastline.

The Rockingham Foreshore is a hub of activity where the coast truly comes to life. Rent a stand up paddle board at Rockingham Beach, soak in coastal views while on an e-scooter along the Foreshore Flow, cast a line to chance a catch off Val Street Jetty, or laze away the afternoon on one of the colourful sun chairs.

A stone's throw south, settle in at Palm Beach, the only north facing beach in the Perth metropolitan area. This protected slice of paradise is blessed with calm, glassy waters, and is the perfect spot to spend the day with the family.

Feeling more adventurous? Dive the Churchill Park Dive Trail about 50m out from the foreshore and observe the passing parade of sea life, including Western Australian seahorses. Take the plunge and book in for a tour or lesson with Scubanautics Diving Academy. Once you've worked up an

appetite, you'll find a smorgasbord of cafés and fine dining options along the bustling foreshore strip. Dine on fresh seafood and hearty steaks at Latitude 32 or share a mix of Mediterranean tapas with sangria at Rustico Tapas & Wine Bar.

Stay along the foreshore at Cee & See Caravan Park or one of the many hotels or apartments to wake up to refreshing coastal views.

POINT PERON

A short drive southwest of the foreshore will take you to the iconic Point Peron / Boya Kaarla. TIP// Take an immersive, guided tour of Cape Peron with a local operator like Djurandi Dreaming.

SHOALWATER ISLANDS MARINE PARK

Spanning 6,000 hectares, the protected Shoalwater Islands Marine Park is a treasure trove of aquatic activity and home to spectacular sea animals like playful bottlenose dolphins, sea lions and little penguins. Dolphins thrive in Rockingham's waters and can be found gliding through the surrounding beaches.



FUN FACT // Secret Harbour is the only beach in the Perth metropolitan area with waves all year round.

Cavernous reefs like The Sisters make for otherworldly scuba diving or snorkelling expeditions, while the Saxon Ranger Dive Wreck in Warnbro Sound is a renowned underwater playground.

The famous Penguin Island is the ultimate jewel within the marine park's chest, beckoning you to its shores. Accessible by a short ferry ride, once you arrive, maximise your chances of observing the marine park's collection of wildlife on a Dolphin, Penguin and Sea Lion Cruise with Perth Wildlife Encounters. Stroll the boardwalks, walkways and lookouts to learn more about the burrowing

Also experience Lane Poole Reserve from a new perspective on an Aboriginal cultural tour with Kaarak Dreaming or an adventurous nature tour with Off the Beaten Track WA, awarded gold for Excellence in Accessible Tourism, 2023 WA Tourism Awards.

If you're feeling peckish after all that activity, bite into ripe fruit plucked fresh from the local orchards. Visit the stunning Caraholly Orchard on select open weekends to pick your own box of seasonal produce, or Vergone's Farm Shop & Café just out of town. Visit Wine Tree Cidery for small-batch, locally made wines and ciders.

Where good food and tranquil landscapes reside, creativity flourishes. Explore galleries showing local and visiting artists, like Lost Eden Creative, where



inspiration is often drawn from the abounding nature that surrounds. Stay in the charming, art deco accommodation adjoining the gallery, The Gallery House.

PINJARRA

In Pinjarra, the Murray River flows with grace under sparkling sunlight and, heritage and culture thrive. Visit the iconic Edenvale Heritage Precinct – a celebration of the town's people, history and stories - to explore vintage machinery, local arts and crafts, and community initiatives with family and friends. Across the road, the recently rejuvenated Exchange Hotel (opening in 2024) is a mustexperience heritage attraction. Constructed in 1866, the hotel has been transformed into a modern hospitality venue, overlooking the Murray River.

The river is renowned for its Murray River Pub Trail. Launch your boat at one of its four boat ramps and meander along the Murray on a scenic trail, stopping at historic pubs along the way for refreshments and wholesome feeds. The Ravenswood Hotel is iconic for attracting famous musicians to put on a show.

Lining the streets of town, you'll discover street art and an array of boutiques to browse – from the high-end D.D.'s Fashions, to the antique hub Blue Moon Collectibles and Antiques, to the contemporary giftware store, The Crosswalk. Tuck in to one of the award-winning pies at the Pinjarra Bakery while exploring the main street.

For family fun, Ranger Red's Zoo is highly recommended. Immerse yourself in a natural sanctuary with the opportunity for hands-on animal interactions, plus over 150 species of brilliant birds to observe and native wildlife. For a true slice of Pinjarra culture, the country races at Pinjarra Park Race Club and Pinjarra Harness Racing Club will have you jumping out of your seats with anticipation as energies soar.

WAROONA

Magnificent forest and abundant farmland ignite all senses as you explore Waroona's incredible landscape. Bathe in the beauty of Waroona Dam or Lake Navarino at this bush lovers' wonderland. Swim, fish, canoe, picnic, bushwalk and birdwatch at the picturesque Drakesbrook Weir or have a 4WD adventure on the incredible Preston Beach.

A DESTINATION FOR LONG AFTERNOON LUNCHES UNDER BLUE SKIES AND SUNSHINE, THE SWAN VALLEY / WURERUP IS WESTERN AUSTRALIA'S OLDEST WINE GROWING REGION AND AN IDYLLIC WINE COUNTRY ESCAPE.

FIELDS OF LUSH greenery and grapeladen vineyards are interspersed with quaint country cottages and charming farmhouse homes, nestled along Perth's iconic Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan in the Swan Valley. The bountiful landscapes give way to world-class wineries, breweries and distilleries, making the region a popular weekend getaway for vino enthusiasts, while a strong grower and producer culture supports fantastic restaurants and boutique provedores.

A twenty-five minute drive from the Perth city centre will have you in the heart of the Swan Valley, or spend a little over an hour cruising up the Swan River in style ahead of a day of winery hopping. Wine making forms the heritage of the valley, where vines date back to 1839, with Sandalford Wines one of the oldest wineries within the region and it's Chenin Blanc a stand-out variety.

Popular with local foodies, producers are abundant around the Swan Valley,c while local purveyors offer preserves, dried fruit, chocolate, nuts, and more. Visit The House of Honey, a sustainability-focused sanctuary for local bees and hives offering



raw honey and sweet mead; or there's Morish Nuts for decadent sweet, savoury, and spicy treats; and Mondo Nougat for fresh nougat and biscotti, home-made with the best ingredients.

Boutique distilleries abound, with Old Young's Pavlova vodka a musttry summertime favourite.

Wildflower trails and sumptuous bushland also encourage visitors to step off the beaten track and explore the beautiful landscapes around them, offering endless nooks for romantic picnics where you can enjoy the goods you've gathered. Popular with picnickers, Bells Rapids offers views of white water rapids amid towering gums and paperbark. With two dedicated short walking trails in the area, wander stunning bushland that blooms with wildflowers from August to November. There are nine dedicated food

and drink trails to help visitors navigate and immerse themselves in the Swan Valley. Those who have come to the region to experience the many boutique beverages on offer will enjoy exploring unique and complex drops on the Fortified Wine Trail, sipping on award-winning wines on the Fine Wine Trail, and discovering sparkling ciders and boutique ales on the Cider and Ale Trail. Learn more about the processes used by local distillers on the Distillery Trail and meet artists and makers on the Wine and Art Off the Beaten Track Trail. Foodies might choose to sample macarons and nougat on the Sweet Temptations Trail, buy delicious fruit and veg direct from the growers on the Fresh Seasonal Produce Trail, or learn about native foods and foraging on the Bush Tucker & Beyond Trail. The Kids in the Valley Trail follows family-friendly experiences around the Swan Valley, including getting up close and friendly with baby animals and enjoying a round of mini golf.

GUILDFORD

The gateway to the Swan Valley, Guildford is known for its history and heritage, with the area dating back to the early 1800s. The rich background of the once pioneer town makes it a natural choice for local antiquers, who are often found sifting through the vintage wares at the many antique stores along the

James Street heritage strip. Nearby cafés and heritagelisted establishments offer a place to enjoy a drink and a bite to eat when it's time for a break.

CHITTERING

Venture north of the Swan Valley to find Chittering, sprawling countryside dotted with charming weatherboard-clad farmstays and cottage-style homesteads. The region is home to an abundance of producers, and a weekend trawl through the rural escape will unearth roadside stalls selling fresh and seasonal produce including oranges, mandarins, lemons, avocados, mangoes and pumpkins. During the spring months the easy-to-navigate Chittering Farm Flavour Trail is a great way to taste the many delights of the region. On your journey pick up some juicy mandarins from Oversby's Citrus, collect avocados from Avalon Orchard, and sample the local olives, honey and goats cheese, along with freshly baked goods, from Bindoon Bakehaus.

The annual Chittering Spring Festival invites locals to experience the bounty the countryside has to offer.

PARKS OF THE VALLEY

A 4,000ha conservation and recreation bushland reserve, Whiteman Park is a haven for families with many walking trails, family-friendly playgrounds and precincts to explore.

The park's Woodland Reserve conservation program is particularly famed for its nocturnal woylie walks, which offer a unique opportunity to spot some of these critically endangered creatures.

Caversham Wildlife Park is a jewel in the crown of Whiteman Park, offering close encounters with koalas, possums, wombats and penguins, while a walkthrough enclosure allows the whole family to feed the kangaroos and wallabies.

For a glimpse of the past and antique mechanical splendour, visit The Motor Museum of WA where historic cars and motorcycles can be admired on display.

FREE RANGE KIDS

9AM // GREAT VALLEY RALLY Take the kids on a cryptic-clue based treasure hunt, the Great Valley Rally, around the Swan Valley and make sure to register ahead of time to get your clues. You'll start at the Swan Valley Visitor Centre, and should finish there too to claim your certificate, with the trail taking around three hours to complete.

2PM // OUTBACK SPLASH

Cool off with a couple of hours at Perth's Outback Splash. Outback Splash is home to an epic water park, open September to April, as well as year-round attractions. Play a round of mini golf or get lost and found in one of the mazes, or observe the resident koalas and kangaroos.

Food is available from the onsite Burger Bar or Snack Shack, while the seasonal Gage Roads summer pop-up offers the brewery's signature range and frosty cocktails to cool down.

6PM // DINNER

Finish up your day with dinner at the Swan Valley's most familyfriendly beer garden, The Henley Brook. Nestled in a three-acre paddock, the beer garden is a scenic spot to unwind while the

kids frollick nearby in the nature play area. Enjoy 20 craft beers on tap and flavoursome gastro-pub fare. Take a 10-minute drive to spend the night at The Vines Resort – luxury accommodation featuring a pool, golf course and more.

FOOD & WINE AFICIONADOS

9AM // BREAKFAST

Start your day with a sweet feast to stimulate the taste buds. Take your pick from the incredible range of freshly handmade macarons, pastries and cakes on offer at the fabulous French Maison St Honore. Or order the famous meringue munro buttermilk pancakes at Guildford's picturesque Padbury's Café Restaurant.

Embarking on one of the Swan Valley's food and wine trails is a perfect way to explore the region's picturesque countryside. The Fresh Seasonal Produce Trail is ripe with juicy, vibrant fruits and fresh vegetables to find when perusing the region's collection of roadside stalls and local farms.

You'll also find plenty of jams and preserves, oils and vinegars, and freshly baked bread along the trail, so take a market bag and gather your own feast.



IPM // WINERIES

You can't leave the Swan Valley without sampling some of the incredible wine on offer. Heading down Great Northern Highway you'll find a number of wineries set just off the main road, including award winners Oakover Grounds, Sittella Winery, Olive Farm Wines, Nikola Estate, Upper Reach Winery, Talijancich Wines and Lamont's Winery.

Settle in at Nikola Estate and embark on a sensory experience of five premium wines paired with local and European cheeses and providore.

Note: Most wineries close by late afternoon.

6PM // DINNER

Settle in at Mandoon Estate's Wild Swan Restaurant or Sandalford Wines on a Friday or Saturday evening to finish a day of fresh produce with fine food. Both wineries are institutions within the valley. On any night of the week, there's also Mandoon Estate's more casual Homestead Brewery. Spend the night on the property at Maya Maya at Mandoon Estate - a sleek enclave of 32 rooms overlooking the historic Verdelho vines on one side and out towards the banks of the Swan River from the other.



MUNDARING

Get above the treeline for an awe-inspiring view of the Perth Hills and beyond in history-steeped Mundaring. The area is home to the recreational Lake Leschenaultia, popular for secluded camping trips and family days out on the water, with canoe and stand-up paddleboards available for hire in the warmer months. The Mundaring Weir is also a scenic destination that, like Lake Leschenaultia, offers easy access to a number of walking tracks through the looming marri and wandoo trees, particularly popular during the wildflower season.

Revel in Mundaring's rich history with a wander along the Railway Reserves Heritage Trail – a 41km loop on railway formations - and

stop at historic taverns dotted along the way for a refreshment and a breather.

Finish up at the federation style Parkerville Tavern, a family pub and local mainstay since 1902.

KALAMUNDA

A hub among the hills, quaint Kalamunda is known for its village charm. On weekends, the local farmers market takes centre stage in the town. Seasonal fruit and vegetables are abundant, but you'll also be able to stock up on artisanal breads, pickles, jams, oils and cheeses, and sample locally made pastries and coffee. Come with an appetite to taste as much of the incredible produce on offer, and a bag to fill for later.

The first Saturday of each month you'll also be able to experience the Kalamunda Artisan Market, a melting pot of bohemian artists



and passionate crafters, selling everything from soy candles to bespoke pottery.

Nearby Bickley Valley is home to the heritage-listed Perth Observatory, where powerful telescopes bridge the gap to the stars and also celebrate the history of Noongar celestial storytelling and Aboriginal astronomy.

Having taken in some celestial culture, turn to local viticulture with a trip through the scenic Bickley Valley, home to boutique wine and cider makers. And, with a short drive, find your way to Pickering Brook to the artisan cidery, bistro and farm, Core Cider – a stunning venue to spend the afternoon cider tasting or even fruit picking. In Pickering Brook, book into the Italian treasure La Fattoria for a wholesome food and wine experience, with grapes grown and

ARMADALE

wines made onsite.

Connecting contemporary living and heritage attractions, Armadale is nestled among a number of scenic parks and blossom-leaden orchards. Among vast untouched bushland is Araluen Botanic Park, which features winding walks

TIP // Take a guided tour of the hills with award-winning operators Off The Beaten Track WA and The Hike Collective.

through 14 hectares of developed garden among almost 60 hectares of native forest that make for a stunning backdrop to concerts and festivals throughout the year. Although home to many native plants, the park is particularly famed for its Springtime Tulip Festival, where visitors can take in the breathtaking view that is more than one hundred thousand tulips in a multitude of vivid hues.

Within the Darling Scarp Regional Park, lies the colourful Armadale Settlers Common, offering rich history and over 318 species of flora. Divided into two networks, within an important flora conservation, the bushland offers beautiful scenery, picnicking spots and walking trails guiding you through diverse landscapes.

SERPENTINE-JARRAHDALE

Scenic walk, bike and horse trails wind through Serpentine-Jarrahdale's expansive stretches of jarrah tree-filled bushland, revealing hidden, trickling brooks and picturesque vistas. The region



The lush Perth Hills landscapes are home to many stunning waterfalls from winter to spring, but Lesmurdie Falls on the Darling Range is arguably the best known. The waterfall takes a 40m drop over the rocky edge of the range, into the Lesmurdie Brook nestled below in the valley, and is surrounded by luscious bushland as far as the eye can see. Lesmurdie Falls is particularly popular for the metal walkway that runs parallel to the waterfall, allowing visitors to view the rushing water up close. For the more adventurous, there are two walk trails winding through the dense bush, surrounded by a cacophony of wildflowers come spring.

is home to the Serpentine National Park on the Darling Scarp. Come spring, multihued wildflowers dot the park in an otherworldly array of colour. A rock-rimmed pool at the base of the Serpentine Falls proves a popular swimming spot, with the cascading water making for an awe-inspiring backdrop from winter to spring.

For bursts of flavour worth remembering, Jarrahdale's boutique Millbrook Winery is a must-visit. Its restaurant is renowned for the variety of heirloom produce, picked fresh from its one-acre garden, that inspires the seasonal menu. Shiraz and Viogner are its top varietals, thriving in the climbing hills.

9AM // ORCHARDS

Local orchards open their doors to seasonal fruit picking, with a huge range of produce on offer including stone fruit, apples, pears, figs, persimmons and avocados. While popular during the summer months with locals looking to hand-pick juicy summer fruits, many of these orchards really shine in spring when pink and white blossoms erupt over the endless rows of trees.

No matter the time of the year, the orchards of the Perth Hills make for a stunning backdrop for a photo opportunity. Core Cider, S&R Orchard, Waterwheel Persimmon Orchard, Carmel Cherry Farm and The Fruit Corner are a few to add to your list.

1PM // WINE & CIDER TRAIL

Sip and graze your way through the Perth Hills on a half-day Bickley Valley Wine and Cider Trail tour with local tour guides, Up Close and Local. Visit three premium Perth Hills wineries where you'll taste delicious drops made from estate-grown grapes. Tours typically include a visit to the award-winning artisan cidery Core Cider, a highlight for the region. The artisan cidery offers apple, pear, ginger and berry ciders, while the Orchard Bistro serves up a farm-to-table menu to

be enjoyed alfresco.

If you have some spare time up your sleeve on another afternoon, return to tour the apple shed to learn more about the cider-making process. Tours depart from Perth City, Crown Perth or Lesmurdie.

6PM // DINNER

Finish your day at The Parkerville Tavern, a beautifully restored twostorey federation-style pub nestled near numerous walk and cycle trails. A large beer garden is perfect for soaking up the last rays of sun and the incredible smells drifting over from the outdoor pizza oven. The venue offers casual and classic pub fare, and is a favourite among locals.

OUTDOORS EXPLORER

8AM // ARALUEN BOTANIC PARK

Head to the Araluen Botanic Park and wander pathways among abundant blooms covered in morning dew and shady trees as you breathe in the crisp, early air. In spring, enjoy the kaleidoscope of colour that is the tulip festival and dreamy cherry, pear, apple and plum blossoms, while summer sees thousands of rose bushes and sunflowers bloom throughout the grounds. Autumn brings canopies of incredible fall foliage, while winter is optimal for viewing Araluen's extensive camellias.

LIONS LOOKOUT, KORUNG NATIONAL PARK

11AM // BRUNCH

Fuel up for an afternoon of more adventuring with brunch on central Kalamunda's café-lined Haynes Street, about 25 minutes north of Araluen Botanic Park. You'll find plenty of options for a freshly roasted caffeine hit and a bite to eat, but check out Jack & Jill or Haynes Street Larder to live like the locals.

After a gentle start to the day it's time to strap on your walking shoes. A 10-minute drive will get you to Lesmurdie Falls National Park or drive 20 minutes to the Ellis Brook Valley Reserve.

With an option to suit every skill level, take your pick of five walking trails at Lesmurdie Falls, which get you up close and personal with one of the Darling Range's most impressive waterfalls, or four at Ellis Brook Valley - offering incredible wildflower scenery during the spring months.

6PM // DINNER

Wind down from the day with a relaxed dinner at Kalamunda Hotel. Tuck into crispy Atlantic salmon or a flaky beef & Guinness pie. Finish with a wellearned apple and blackberry crumble or sticky date pudding.

PICNIC AT SCENIC spots along the river, admire brilliant blooms of wildflowers in season, listen to babbling brooks roll by, and gaze up at brightly coloured hot air balloons floating through the sky as you discover the Avon Valley.

TOODYAY

The diverse town of Toodyay is peppered with inquisitive trails offering insights into its fascinating colonial and convict past, wartime history, and rich natural landscapes.

Explore Toodyay's plethora of picturesque parklands and reserves along the Toodyay



Reserve Trails and marvel at the abundance of flora and fauna that surrounds.

Reflect back on the era of the infamous convict Moondyne Joe when visiting the Newcastle Gaol Museum to learn about his dramatic escape from the Toodyay Convict Depot lock up.

Admire quaint country townscapes, the best artisan bakery, the iconic heritage Connor's Mill, and charming boutiques like the cheerful Toodyay Christmas shop Christmas 360, a provider of delightful decorations for the festive season and beyond, open April – December.

NORTHAM

Best known for its otherworldly hot air balloon experiences, lift off at dawn and float gently over the rolling hills and meandering streams of Northam, illuminated by the first rays of daylight. With

BEVERLEY

Discover beautiful boutiques and eclectic art galleries lining the streets when immersing yourself in the farming town of Beverley. Admire impressive examples of the town's colonial architecture and arts attractions on walking trails. The iconic Perth-born artist James Giddy has also made his mark on the town, with five spectacular murals decorating the buildings along Vincent Street.


TIP// Create something that brings you joy when joining for an arts or crafts workshop in the creative town of Beverley.

YORK

Straddling the Avon River and as the first inland settlement built in the state, the truly charming town of York offers fine examples of colonial architecture to be admired, including lovingly preserved buildings of opulent Victorian and Federation style.

Dive into its interesting past at the York Residency Museum and the Old Gaol and York Courthouse precinct, and marvel at vintage and veteran automobiles and memorabilia at the iconic York Motor Museum.

Local artisan and antique stores line the streets, with the Antique and Collectibles Fair in April one of many of the town's annual events. Visit in spring for the two-week York Festival celebrating community and creativity and base yourself





at one of the beautiful bed and breakfasts or many restored manors for your stay.

GOOMALLING

In Goomalling, natural splendour is bountiful, with the shire being one of Australia's 15 national biodiversity hotspots and the striking blood red spider orchid erupting all around in spring.

Arts, crafts, and country markets make this town warm and welcoming, with a relaxed, rural atmosphere.

TIP// While in the valley, visit Australia's only monastic town, New Norcia. Join practicing monks in prayer at their private chapel, pick up freshly baked bread from the monastery and olive oil from WA's oldest olive groves.

AVON VALLEY ITINERARIES

NATURE WANDERERS

5.50AM // HOT AIR BALLOONING The day begins in Northam floating in a hot air balloon, like a dream, over a magic patchwork quilt of rolling hills, lush green fields and meandering streams. From April to late November, Windward Balloon Adventures and Liberty Balloon Flights have been creating special memories for customers for years.

9.50AM // BURLONG POOL

Take about two hours to stroll the relatively easy Dorntji Koorling-Burlong Pool riverside hike, and admire various native birds along the way. You'll see black and white swans, spoonbills, ducks, herons and coots. Stop at Burlong Pool and cast a handful of sand into the water as a mark of respect to its status as an important Aboriginal site, the summer home of the Wagyl (Rainbow Serpent).

IPM // PICNIC

Make your way to Toodyay and look out for silos bearing artwork from renowned international artists, Phlegm and Hense, along the 30-minute journey. Stop for a picnic amongst abundant wildflowers in spring at the Bilya Walk Track where – after you pick up delicious pies and pastries

from the famous Toodyay Bakery – you may spot waterbirds and long necked turtles. After, walk part of the sign-posted 7km track offering splendid views of the Avon River.

5.50PM // PELHAM RESERVE

Finish the day with a short drive up to Pelham Reserve looking over 50 hectares of bushland featuring York Gum, Jam Woodland and Wandoo. In spring, its steep slopes are covered in carpets of everlastings. Stay on and watch a spectacular sunset before settling in for the night at a historic hotel like The Toodyay Manor or The Victoria Hotel, where the classic Australian pub fare will warm your soul.

HISTORIANS AT HEART

8AM // BREAKFAST

Wake up at the luxurious Laurelville Manor, famous for its breakfast, before taking a leisurely wander down York's Avon Terrace lined with heritage buildings.

10AM // YORK COURTHOUSE

Step inside the York Courthouse Complex and marvel at the grandeur of the courtroom built in 1859 and its transformation into an art gallery. It's now a showcase for Aboriginal culture and a history of colonial impact.

11AM // YORK MOTOR MUSEUM

You can't visit York without checking out the only communityowned and operated motor museum in Australia. York Motor Museum, opened in 1979 by the late Peter Briggs and James Harwood, has a fascinating collection of vintage cars and bikes.

12PM // RESIDENCY MUSEUM

Whip over to Brook Street and delve back into the past at the awardwinning Residency Museum located inside a Victorian, Georgian style house, which is the last remaining part of York's Convict Depot.

2PM // WALKING TOUR

Drive 45-minutes to Toodyay for a bite to eat before taking a selfguided walking tour. Visit Connor's Mill to discover historic machinery, explore the era of Moondyne Joe in the Newcastle Gaol Museum precinct, and wander past the old Butterly Cottage and through Duidgee Park before returning via the banks of the Avon River. Pass St Stephen's Anglican Church and Stirling Terrace along the way.

4PM // CHARCOAL LANE

Admire Toodyay's public murals in Charcoal Lane behind IGA, including the bright birds mural by Morangup artists Nicola Cowie and Kat Ferguson.

Unsure where to begin? Take a local tour to discover prime locations for breath-taking blooms, gain insightful information along the way, and see wildflowers from a new perspective. Whether you go by bike on GoGo Active's Pedals & Petals Tour, as part of Kings Park Festival; embark upon walking trails on a guided tour with Gravity Discovery Centre and Observatory (between September and November); or take one of many inspiring Perth wildflower photography tours — the opportunities are endless.

There are also countless hotspots and self-guided trails to explore through Perth's national parks and designated bushland, each one a vision of colour and cacophony of bird calls. Discover trails as close to the city as Kings Park, and all through the natureenveloped sanctuaries of Perth Hills, Avon Valley and beyond.

KINGS PARK

Kings Park's combination of carefully cultivated gardens and wild bushland is the ideal way to experience the Perth wildflower season without having to stray from the city. The expansive park one of the largest inner-city parks in the world — offers city-dwellers a unique opportunity to peruse pastel-hued native wildflowers in abundance.

The horticultural artistry of the Botanic Garden is the jewel in the crown of the park. With over three thousand species of flowering plants growing in the Botanic Garden alone, visitors are treated to brilliant carpets of everlastings, the stunning reds of scarlett honey myrtle, soft whites and yellows of rice paper flowers, and even sightings of the rare black kangaroo paw during a wander along the Botanic Garden Discovery Walk. For those seeking a more curated experience, the park hosts its annual Everlasting Kings Park Festival, where visitors can join in guided walks and workshops.

PERTH HILLS

With its picturesque, meandering bush trails and numerous sparkling waterfalls, the Perth Hills are a favourite escape for many and only a short drive east of the city centre. There are simple wildflower trails to be explored through the Beelu and John Forrest National Parks, showcasing abundant banksia, wattle, myrtle and kangaroo paws; while Lesmurdie Falls is a popular lookout spot dotted with the whimsical purplepink petals of the enamel orchid. The famed Bibbulman Track, which at its full length stretches close to 1000km from the Perth Hills to Albany, is a hotspot during the spring months as bright yellow wattle, purple hovea and startling blue leschenaultia line the dirt trail and creep around the trunks of towering jarrah and marri trees. The Perth Hills bushland boasts more than 150 species of native orchids, alongside milkmaids, honeypots and mountain bells.

AVON VALLEY

The Avon Valley is a sea of colour come spring, the region awash with buttercups, orchids, lilies, and dreamy fields of everlastings. The



region is vast, covering Beverley, Northam, Toodyay, York and Goomalling; and the range of wildflowers is diverse. The Brooking Street Reserve trail in Beverley is a popular walk, boasting more than twelve species of native orchid including the famed pink fairycowslip orchid hybrid, while the Bilya walk track in Toodyay takes



explorers along the Avon River to view the many flowers growing by the banks of the water, including incredible banksia displays. The region is also a hotspot for native animal sightings. Cockatoos, galahs and water dwelling birdlife are abundant, while you might also spot the occasional wallaby or echidna.

MORE TO DISCOVER

Continue your hunt for diverse flora within the many other rich destinations of Perth. Whiteman Park in the Swan Valley is abundant in walking trails and home to hundreds of flowering species; while the Bells Rapids Walk Trails nearby are beautiful options set to the sounds of gushing water in spring. Rottnest Island / Wadjemup is home to more than 1,500 native species of wildflowers, most notably the blue Rottnest Island Daisy found only on the island. Venture a little further from Perth city and pockets such as Chittering and Yanchep National Park are also ripe for wildflower discovery.
