The Latest:

- The PLCB is prioritizing the processing of Wine Expanded Permit (WEP) and Transporter for Hire applications.
 - WEP costs \$2,000 and allows a licensee to sell up to 4 bottles of wine in a single transaction. Wine can be purchased from the PLCB or a state winery.
 - Transporter for Hire costs \$160 and permit holders can deliver beer (and only beer) to individuals in the Commonwealth.
 - To apply for either permit, visit <u>PLCB+</u>.
- We continue to work with the PLCB and should have answers soon on how licensees can acquire more product during the shutdown.
- The National Restaurant Association is collecting information on the economic impact of the recent Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. <u>TAKE</u>

- The Pa. Industrial Development Authority (PIDA) yesterday approved guidelines for the new <u>COVID-19 Working Capital Access program</u>. Over \$60 million is available in the form of no-interest and low-interest loans for small businesses with 100 or fewer full-time employees. *PIDA is expected to open the program to applications later this week*.
