WASTE MANAGEMENT

Cut down on immediate environmental impacts from your event

TIPS & TRICKS TO CUT DOWN ON EVENT LITTER



Consider setting up signs around your event to remind people that trash belongs in the can, not the sand.



Follow the Disney method and place at least one trashcan every 20—30 feet around your event to cut down on littering.



Identify a clean up crew for the event; the more people focused on keeping trash off the ground the better.



Set up a post-event clean up plan. One way to do this is have every person working the event line up and sweep the area for trash to pick up and throw away.



Avoid contaminating rainwater run off by having dog waste stations and cigarette butt receptacles.

HOW KPAB CAN HELP

- Connect with us to set up volunteers for your event.
- KPAB has thirty 40gal recycling bins that can be borrowed.
- Contact Cameron Fowler to get event signs for reminding attendees to not litter
- We also have recycling frames with clear bags best suited for indoor events.
- We have cigarette disposal containers that can be borrowed as well.

VENDOR INVOLVEMENT

Empower your event with vendors offering environmentally responsible products and services

RECOMENDATIONS



Reduce single use plastics and styrofoam, like using rope or bungee cords instead of zip-ties.




Use eco-friendly swag, branded reusable water bottles and tote bags are great sellers at local events.



Create eco-friendly prizes, for example the winner of a game or raffle can choose a local organization for the vendor to donate to like the Port Aransas Nature Preserve or the ARK.

HOW KPAB CAN HELP

- KPAB can share their network of organizations that you can donate to:
 - Port Aransas Preservation and Historic Association
 - Port Aransas Community Theatre
 - Port Aransas Art Center
 - Port Aransas Education Foundation
- Discuss creative ideas to reduce single use plastic. Eliminate straws, bags, and any disposable plastic by replacing with more sustainable options. Rent or purchase reusable items like water pitchers, tablecloths and flatware.

Organic, plant based offering more vegetarian or vegan options is a great way to decrease your event's carbon footprint



Responsibly sourced seafood Look for vendors that are "Certified Ocean Friendly".



Consider donating leftover food to a local food pantry.

TRANSPORTATION

Navigate the path to sustainability with transportation choices that reduce your carbon footprint

RECOMENDATIONS



Commission eco-friendly hybrid or electric vehicles to shuttle your attendees



Incentivize public transportation and carpooling - Provide parking discount or VIP parking to carpools



Promote attendees to ride bicycles to event and provide bike racks

ENVIRONMENTAL FUN FACTS

- Vehicles on the Road Can Release an Average of 1 Pound of CO2 Per Mile.
- Public Transportation Helps Reduce CO2 Emissions by 45%.
- An Estimate of 37 Million Metric Tons of CO2 is Saved Annually in the US Due to Public Transportation.

ENERGY & LIGHTING

Navigate your event with the brilliance of alternative energy and lighting that's gentle on the night

RECOMENDATIONS



Consider renting trailer-mounted solar and/or wind generators to replace gasoline generators for food trucks or area lighting.



Be sure to use Dark Sky approved lighting for your events as artificial light pollution can greatly affect local wildlife. For example, sea turtle hatchlings navigate towards the water by the light of the moon—artificial lighting can confuse them and make them go away from the water.

WHAT IS LIGHT POLLUTION?

Light pollution is the human-made alteration of outdoor light levels from those occurring naturally.

WHAT ARE THE EFFECTS?

Light pollution disrupts <u>wildlife</u>, impacts <u>human health</u>, wastes <u>money and energy</u>, contributes to <u>climate change</u>, and blocks <u>our view of the universe</u>.

INTERNATIONAL DARK SKY ASSOCIATION

The International Dark Sky Association is a group dedicated to providing leadership, tools, and resources for individuals, policymakers, and industry, in order to reduce light pollution and promote responsible outdoor lighting that is beautiful, healthy, and functional.

Choose local suppliers and services to reduce your event's carbon footprint and strengthen local connections

RECOMENDATIONS



Choosing decorations, rentals, vendors and other supplies within the area supports local commerce and reduces the carbon footprint of traveling from out of town.

Support local businesses: When you choose to shop at local stores, you're directly supporting small businesses, artists, farmers, and other entrepreneurs in the community. This helps them thrive and grow, contributing to the overall health of the local economy.

WILDLIFE ACTION PLAN

Protect local wildlife by implementing sustainable practices in every event

RECOMENDATIONS



List the places to call if injured wildlife is encountered, share with vendors and attendees.



Post signs showing the negative effects which litter has on wildlife. Remind participants to dispose of garbage properly



Survey the area to ensure no nesting birds are present. If nesting birds are identified, fence the area to keep participants out to minimize disturbance to the nests.



- Turtle nesting season in Port A runs from early April to mid-July, you can help keep them safe by doing a Turtle Check before setting up your beach events.
- Port Aransas attracts more than 400 species of birds, one way to help keep these birds safe is to have educational materials around your event about why feeding the birds harms them.
- Portuguese Man O' Wars, also known as Bluebottles, are stinging jellyfish that tend to wash ashore from spring to late summer, keep your guests safe at beach events by properly removing the painful beauties from the area.
