



Marine Safety Information Bulletin (MSIB) 19-021, Hurricane Dorian

Weather Advisory

Return to Seasonal Port Conditions

Time: 03:00 p.m. / Date: Tuesday, September 3, 2019

The Captain of the Port has determined the Port of Miami, Miami River, and Port Everglades are safe for marine traffic/operations and has lifted Port Condition Zulu. The Port of Miami, Miami River and Port Everglades may return to seasonal watch preparedness in accordance with MSIB 19-007. Port of Palm Beach and Fort Pierce will remain in Port Condition Zulu at this time.

Prohibited Operations: There are no restrictions to the Port of Miami and Port Everglades, however, bridge reopening process is still underway and some bridges may not be able to open until evening time or tomorrow. Restrictions from Port Condition Zulu still apply to Port of Palm Beach and Fort Pierce.

Authorized Operations: Port of Miami and Port Everglades are authorized to resume operations.

Future Actions: The Captain of the Port anticipates lifting Port Condition Zulu from Port of Palm Beach and Fort Pierce upon tropical storm force winds subside and port assessments are completed.
