First stop is Portchester Castle – the best preserved Roman fort north of the Alps. After the Norman Conquest a castle was built in one corner of the fort, which grew into an impressive royal residence. The castle was also used to house foreign prisoners of war, most notably during the wars with France between 1793 and 1815.

Royal Armouries Museum, Fort Nelson

Fort Nelson is home to some of the biggest guns ever made, 19 acres of ramparts, outer fortifications, secret underground tunnels, and ammunition bunkers. Discover what life was like for soldiers in the Victorian garrison's barrack rooms, hospital and kitchen.
