Charles Dickens' Birthplace Museum

Visit the home where Charles Dickens was born on 7 February 1812 and discover what life would have been like for this literary great.

The furniture, ceramics, glass, household objects and decorations faithfully re-create the Regency style. View furnished rooms plus a small collection of memorabilia: the couch on which he died at his house in Kent, together with his snuff box, inkwell and paper knife, poignant reminders of an author celebrated for his prodigious talents and creative output.


