Eight colleges and universities have campuses in the Providence/Warwick area, making an indelible impact on the region's intellectual, cultural and social life.

**Brown University** is a leading lvy League institution with a distinctive undergraduate academic program, a world-class faculty, outstanding graduate and medical students and a tradition of innovative and rigorous multidisciplinary study. A commitment to diversity and intellectual freedom has remained a hallmark of the University since its establishment. Founded in 1764 in Warren, RI, Brown moved to Providence's East Side in 1770 and has been a dynamic force in the community ever since. Notable alumni include John F. **Johnson & Wales University** (J&W) offers its students a unique blend of hands-on experience and classic academic instruction. The Downcity Campus, in the heart of the downtown area, houses the Hospitality College and the College of Business, while the Harborside Campus, on the edge of the city, is home to the College of Culinary Arts. J&W was founded in 1914 and continues to leave its mark on the city, most notably through its impact on the critically acclaimed restaurant scene. RISD Museum's Chace Center was designed by Spain's Pritzker Prize-winning architect José Rafael Moneo and features the premiere exhibition space for RISD students on campus. **Providence College** (PC) is primarily an undergraduate, liberal arts, Catholic institution of higher education. Founded in 1917, PC makes its home in the city's North End.
