



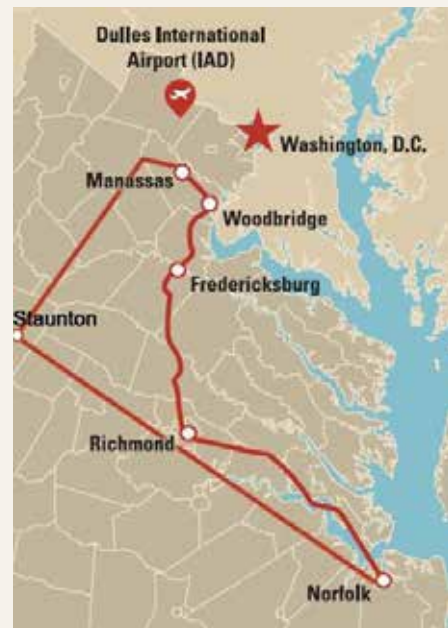
Staunton
