

- onto Dawson-Miller Road.
- Take Dawson-Miller Rd approximately 1.5 miles until it runs into Pisgah Covered Bridge Road and continue for approximately 5.7 miles to where Pisgah Covered Bridge Road forks to the right.
- Go approximately 1.5 miles; the entrance to parking for the bridge is on the left—just past Union Community Building.

his historic structure, one of North Carolina's two remaining covered bridges, was built in 1911 at a cost of \$40. The bridge is 54 feet in length and crosses the West Fork Branch of the Little River within the Uwharrie National Forest. The bridge provides a direct connection to Randolph county's past mode of transportation when horse and wagon were common and automobile travel was in its infancy. Therefore, the Randolph County Board of Commissioners designated the Pisgah Covered Bridge as a Local Historic Landmark on March 1, 2010. The bridge is a great spot for photography, picnics and nature walks along the surrounding quarter-mile walking trail. Picnic tables and public parking is available.
