#### Cowboy Quick Hits

The Cowboys are 13-2 and 7-1 in conference duals heading into their final weekend of the regular season. Oklahoma State defeated Stanford its last time out, 25-9, led by bonus points from Travis Wittlake and Luke Surber.

John Smith and the OSU staff signed seven wrestlers in the early signing period for the class of 2023. With two of the top-five prospects in the class, including top-ranked Christian Carroll, the group should be in contention for the No. 1 signing class in the country.

Five Cowboy seniors will be recognized before the dual on Thursday, including Kaden Gfeller, Wyatt Sheets, Dusty Hone, Jalin Harper and Gavin Stika. The 2023 Gallagher Award will also be presented to Ricky Stewart prior to the start of the match.

## MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

### CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Reid Romine in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (reid.romine@okstate.edu or 210-860-5959). Credentials can be picked up at the southeast pass gate of Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days. Credential pickup will be available one hour prior to the start of each dual and will close five minutes before the duals begins.

### INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith, assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Reid Romine in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interviews before practice starts on Tuesday (usually around 2 p.m. CT), but other arrangements can be made.

### MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending duals at Gallagher-Iba Arena should park in the lot just south of Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

### VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-serve basis.

### PHOTOS AND VIDEO

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench. Photographers and videographers must stay seated while shooting to avoid obstructing fans' views.

## COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt is in his 39th year broadcasting Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasional events are aired on 105.5 KGFY-FM radio or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. # Head Coach John Smith



## John Smith

Head Coach | 32nd Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Smith begins his 32nd season at Oklahoma State in the 2021-22 season, after accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater in 1992. The accolades and accomplishments since that time are remarkable. In his 31 completed seasons at the helm five NCAA team titles in 1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006, and he has coached 33 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowboys have brought 21 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 129 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. He has seen his student-athletes earn All-America recognition 150 times, an average of 4.8 All-America honorees per year.

## The Basics

The No. 6 Oklahoma State wrestling team (11-2 overall; 6-1 Big 12) will look to close out the regular season strong against Oklahoma and No. 2 Iowa. The Cowboys will put a four-match win streak on the line when they host the second round of the Phillips 66 Bedlam series on Thursday at 7 p.m. before traveling to Iowa City for a bout with the second-ranked Hawkeyes on Sunday at 3:30 p.m. CT.

## On the Air

Oklahoma State's dual with Oklahoma will be streamed on Big 12 Now on ESPN+ with J. Carl Guymon and Hardell Moore on the call. It can also be heard on Hot 93.7 KSPI-FM with Rex Holt going on air at 6:30 p.m. Live stats for the match can be found on Trackwrestling.com.

## The Series - Oklahoma

The Bedlam dual series dates back to 1920, a bout that Oklahoma State won a staggering 50-0 in Stillwater. OSU leads the all-time rivalry series 148-27-10. Sunday's dual marks the 186th time the two teams have met for dual competition.

OSU has dominated the series of late as it has won the last 16 matches with the most recent win for the Sooners being a 16-15 win in Norman in 2013. In the first meeting this season, the Cowboys fell behind 12-4 before winning four of the final five bouts after intermission, including Luke Surber's fall in the final match to give the Cowboys a 21-15 win in Norman.

Oklahoma State holds an 81-12-2 advantage in Stillwater where they will wrestle on Thursday, and has won 22 straight home matches against the Sooners. John Smith has gone 55-6-3 against OU as head coach of the Cowboys, while Lou Rosselli is 0-11 against OSU since taking over the Sooner program in 2016.

## About the Cowboys

No. 6 Oklahoma State is 13-2 on the season heading into the final weekend of the regular season in which it will host Oklahoma on Thursday before traveling to Iowa City to face the second-ranked Hawkeyes on Sunday.

The Pokes return four All-Americans who have earned All-America honors a total of eight times, headlined by three-time NCAA finalist Daton Fix. Wyatt Sheets and Travis Wittlake are both two-time All-Americans for OSU, while Dustin Plott is coming off of his first appearance on the podium last season.

The OSU lineup has seen some movement from a season ago with weight changes from past starters opening opportunities at 165 pounds and heavyweight. Wittlake moved up two weight classes to 184 pounds in the offseason where he is 15-3, while Luke Surber dropped down a weight to 197 pounds. In their places, Wyatt Sheets has filled the void at 165 pounds, while redshirt sophomore Konner Doucet has gone 14-7 as the starter at heavyweight and placed third at the Scuffle.

Big 12 champion Kaden Gfeller decided to return to Oklahoma State for his final season in August and has put together a 16-5 record so far 157 pounds, while talented freshman Victor Voinovich has started every dual at 149 pounds. With Sheets and Gfeller back for their COVID seasons, the middleweights could see some different looks throughout the course of the season.

## Cowboys in the Polls

Oklahoma State's roster features 10 wrestlers ranked in various polls this week, with four holding spots inside the top-10. Senior 133-pounder Daton Fix is the consensus No. 2 wrestler at his weight and is the highest ranked Cowboy as the reigning Big 12 champion and a national finalist the last two seasons. Following Fix, Dustin Plott appears as high as No. 7 at 174 pounds after earning All-America honors for the first time last season with a sixth-place finish. Travis Wittlake makes holds the No. 10 ranking in three of the four polls, while Kaden Gfeller (157) is back in the top-10 in Intermat's poll after upsetting No. 8 Jarrett Jacques against Missouri.

Carter Young holds steady at No. 15 at 141 pounds, while Luke Surber climbed up the rankings as high as No. 15 at 197 pounds after taking down No. 1 Rocky Elam in a vital upset in OSU's win over Missouri. Victor Voinovich (149) and Konner Doucet (HWT) land at No. 20 and No. 22 in Intermat's rankings this week, but are a few spots higher in other polls. Wyatt Sheets is ranked at No. 19 by FloWrestling at 165 pounds as he continues to navigate a gauntlet of a schedule to close out the regular season. At 125 pounds, Reece Witcraft made his first appearance in Intermat's rankings where he sits at No. 28.

### Climbing the Ladder

In 2018, coach John Smith assumed the title of winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I wrestling when the Pokes defeated Minnesota on Nov. 19, inside Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Smith reached yet another milestone in last season's 36-4 dual win against Little Rock. The victory was Smith's 443rd and moved him past Gary Taylor and into the top three on the list of all-time Division I coaching wins.

OSU's victory over Stanford to open the 2021-22 season marked Smith's 450 dual win as head coach of his alma mater. He needs 18 more victories to pass Harold Nichols and move into second place.

### Senior Day

Five Cowboy seniors will be recognized for their time with the program before Thursday's dual against Oklahoma. Kaden Gfeller, Jalin Harper, Dusty Hone, Gavin Stika and Wyatt Sheets have all spent five or more years in Stillwater and have all held a starting role at some point in their careers.

Gfeller and Sheets will wrestle in Gallagher-Iba Arena for the final time against the Sooners as they close out decorated careers in the orange singlet. Gfeller, a two-time Big 12 champion, has compiled a 75-19 career record, while Sheets has earned All-America honors twice and has a career record of 84-53.

Hone was the OSU starter at 141 pounds in the 2019-20 season where he placed third at the Big 12 Championships and was a national qualifier. Harper and Stika have both made appearances in the OSU lineup in replacement roles, wrestling at multiple weight classes in their careers.

### Two Cowboys Chasing the Century Mark

Cowboy seniors Daton Fix and Wyatt Sheets are both nearing 100 wins in their collegiate careers.

The active leaders on Oklahoma State's roster with 92 wins for Fix and 84 for Sheets, the century mark could be within reach toward the end of this season. Sheets elected to return to OSU for his COVID season, while Fix is one of the winningest wrestlers in program history based on winning percentage and still has another year of eligibility he could take advantage of.

OSU has had 44 wrestlers reach the 100-win mark in their career, most recently accomplished by Nick Piccininni during the 2020 season.

### A New Look Lineup

While the names may look largely the same to last season's starters for Oklahoma State, multiple weight changes during the offseason have shaken up the Cowboy lineup.

Travis Wittlake, a two-time All-American at 165 pounds, bumped up two weight classes to 184 pounds, leaving his former weight class up for grabs. Wittlake has started the season 15-3, which included a 5-0 run to claim the Southern Scuffle title.

With the departure of Wittlake from 165, Wyatt Sheets has filled the void. Sheets has been the Cowboys' starter at 157 pounds where he earned All-America honors in 2021 and may move back down to the weight at some point during the season. Two-time Big 12 champion at 149 pounds, Kaden Gfeller has bumped up to 157 pounds where he is 16-5 this season and picked up the highest-ranked win of his career against No. 2 Brayton Lee of Minnesota on Dec. 4.

At the upperweights, Luke Surber has returned to 197 pounds where he went 8-1 in extra matches as

a true freshman. He went 14-10 as an undersized heavyweight last season, which included a run to the Big 12 finals. With Surber back down to his preferred weight class another member of the top ranked signing class of 2020 will get his opportunity to shine. Redshirt sophomore Konner Doucet went 10-2 in open tournaments last season and is 15-7 this season.

### Dominance Against the Pac-12

Oklahoma State has had an enormous amount of success against members of the Pac-12 conference in the program's history.

OSU's all-time record against current members of the conference is 108-4 (96.4%) heading into Sunday's dual with Stanford. The Cowboys have an undefeated mark against five of the six programs in the conference with their only blemishes coming to Arizona State, with the last loss coming in 1993. OSU is also 54-0 against the Pac-12 in duals taking place in Stillwater.

### Tuttle Teammates Turned Rivals

The 186th edition of Bedlam will consist of a matchup between former high school teammates at 197 pounds. Luke Surber will wrestle OU's Carson Berryhill on Thursday, years after they were teammates at Tuttle High School, along with Dustin Plott.

They led Tuttle to multiple state titles under the leadership of Surber's father, Matt. All three of the Tuttle alumni also won individual state titles at the 2019 Oklahoma High School state championships.

In addition, the 2019 state tournament consisted of 11 state champions who are currently on one of the two Bedlam rosters. Seven of those title winners are expected to be wrestling on Thursday, including Josh Heindselman, Tate Picklo and Berryhill for OU, and Surber, Plott, Konner Doucet and Reece Witcraft for the Cowboys.

### Coached by the Best

When wrestlers come to compete at Oklahoma State, they are coached by some of the greatest to ever step on the mat. John Smith holds six world championships and two Olympic gold medals. Smith, Zack Esposito, Chris Perry and Tyler Caldwell also combine for five NCAA championships and 13 All-America honors. Smith brings in a plethora of international coaching experience. Most recently, he coached the 2017 USA Women's Cadet World Team, for which he was named USA Wrestling Women's Co-Coach of the Year alongside Campbell's Kary Kolat.

Esposito has had a hand in coaching World teams for the past four years, including two Cadet World Teams, a first-place Junior World Team and title-winning World Cup Team.

### John Smith's Coaching Tree

John Smith's coaching tree is undoubtedly the largest in the collegiate wrestling world.

Seven of Smith's former wrestlers at Oklahoma State are now head coaches running their own programs across the nation, not to mention the numerous assistant coaches, along with Glen Lanham, who was a teammate of Smith at OSU and a head coach in the ACC.

Smith has had the advantage over his former wrestlers carrying a 23-1 dual record against them

when they match up head-to-head as coaches. His only loss came from Pat Popolizio when NC State defeated the Cowboys 19-15 in 2015.

### All He Does is Win

Since breaking into the starting lineup for Oklahoma State as a redshirt freshman in the 2018-19 season, Daton Fix has become one of the winningest wrestlers in program history.

At 92-4 in his career, Fix has a winning percentage of 95.83%, which puts him into 10th place on the list of highest winning percentages ever among OSU wrestlers. With 56 career bonus-point victories, including five major decisions, four falls and a tech fall this season, he also boasts a career 58.3% bonus win percentage.

### Wrestling's House of Horrors

No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-Iba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 44 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home, the most recent coming in 2021. One of the program's longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, with no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 507-45-6 overall record in the arena.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before Oklahoma broke the streak, 19-13.

OSU's home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30, 1993.

The Cowboys most recent 26-match winning streak at home, dating back to Jan. 27, 2018, was broken on Jan. 29, 2022 as Northern Iowa defeated OSU, 19-15. At 26, the run was the fourth-longest streak in program history.

NORMAN, Okla. - With the match tied at 15 a piece heading into the final bout of the dual, Luke Surber pinned No. 28 Keegan Moore 34 seconds into the first period to give the Oklahoma State wrestling team its 16th straight win over the Sooners, 21-15.

"I knew I was going to have to win to win the dual," Surber said. "I went out and got in on my shot and went for the cradle and he rolled onto his back. I had him pinned like five times probably."

Oklahoma jumped out to a 12-4 lead after the first five matches, with the lone Cowboy victory coming in a 14-5 major decision from No. 2 Daton Fix over No. 30 Wyatt Henson.

Following intermission, Kaden Gfeller got Oklahoma State back on track with a 7-1 decision over No. 29 Jacob Butler. Gfeller used a reversal in which he caught Butler on his back for a four-point near fall to separate the score in the second period on his way to a comfortable win.

Following a close Sooner victory at 165 pounds, the upper weights for the Pokes came up big winning the final three matches to close the score on the Sooners and set Surber for his heroics. Beginning at 174 pounds, Dustin Plott was dominant in a 21-6 technical fall over No. 19 Darrien Roberts.

Travis Wittlake followed Plott with a takedown in sudden victory to clinch a 6-4 decision over No. 29 Greyden Penner to tie the match at 15 heading into the final bout.

"In those first five matches at some weights it looked like a bit of a repeat from Minnesota losing those tight matches," head coach John Smith said. "We knew what we needed to do. We needed to win four out of the five after the showing we had in those first five weights. That's what we did. We went out and won four out of five to win the dual."

The early deficit for the Cowboys came from close losses, including two in overtime. Konner Doucet and Victor Voinovich each dropped their bouts to higher-ranked Sooners in overtime, while Trevor Mastrogiovanni and Carter Young dropped matches by two points each.

STILLWATER – The Oklahoma State wrestling team jumped out to an early lead and rode the momentum to a dominating 34-3 win over Wyoming in its home opener in Gallagher-Iba Arena on Friday night.

The Cowboys took an early 9-0 lead behind a hard-fought 2-0 decision from Trevor Mastrogiovanni over Wyoming freshman Jore Volk, who won a U20 world championship in freestyle this summer. Following Mastrogiovanni, Daton Fix collected his 75th career win in style with a first-period fall over Aidan Noonan to extend the OSU lead to 9-0.

The only win of the night for Wyoming came in a close match at 141 pounds where Job Greenwood fought off a late shot from Carter Young to clinch a 4-3 decision.

From there, the rout was on for No. 10 Oklahoma State as it won the final seven matches to close out the dual. Wyatt Sheets won the lone ranked matchup of the night, defeating No. 21 Cole Moody, 6-2. After a scoreless first period, Moody took a 2-0 lead in the second period behind two stall calls against Sheets and an escape, but Sheets responded with a late takedown to send the match to the third period tied at two. At 174 pounds, Plott recorded a pair of takedowns in both of the first two periods before putting up seven points in the third period on his way to a 16-6 major decision over Brett McIntosh. Surber just needed one takedown and a turn to end his match as he collected his first fall of the season in 1:38 over Tyce Raddon.

Victor Voinovich, Travis Wittlake and Konner Doucet all moved to 3-0 on the season with comfortable decisions over their Cowboy counterparts, while Kaden Gfeller earned his first victory of the season with a 6-3 win over Logan Ours behind a second period that included a reversal and near fall from Gfeller.

"I thought from a team standpoint, it kinds of reminds me of seeing guys getting their season started and finding a rhythm of how you want to wrestle, it takes some matches," head coach John Smith said. "It just seemed like we struggled a little bit with some sort of rhythm, and give credit to Wyoming, (Mark) Branch had his team ready to fight and they did fight. With that comes a few of them where they were satisfied to get a win rather than trying to stretch scores out, continuing to develop their offense in some of these matches."

Even in this dual meet, it's like I said, I got a lot to work with. They exposed us a little bit. This is by far the best team we've wrestled and it's a good team. It gives us something. If we wrestled them in two weeks, hopefully I'd see a different level of performance. I'm not going to say we'd win, I just think we recognized a little bit real quickly that to win tough, hard matches, you've got to wrestle tough and hard."

The early deficit for the Cowboys came from a run of four consecutive losses from 184 pounds to 125 pounds as Travis Wittlake, Konner Doucet and Trevor Mastrogianni all suffered their first defeats of the season, while Luke Surber fell to 2-2 on the year at 197 pounds.

"We looked maybe a little lethargic in some of those early matches, just not ready to go punch someone," head coach John Smith said. "Losing at 165, 174, 184 and 197, that wasn't ideal, but I was pleased with Konner Doucet. I was pleased with Trevor Mastrogianni and I was pleased that Daton Fix hammered out the team victory by extending the score to a major decision to put us up by five going into the last match. Carter Young with the win was a nice separation to close it out."

Trailing 12-7 heading into the final four bouts, Doucet turned the momentum in favor of the Cowboys with a 3-2 decision over J.J. Dixon. Doucet's victory ended a run of victories by the Beavers spanning from 165 pounds to 197 pounds/.

When the lineup turned over to 125 pounds, Mastrogianni scored the only takedown of the match in a 3-2 decision over No. 12 Brandon Kaylor to put OSU up in the team score for good. Fix followed up with a 12-4 major decision over No. 18 Jason Shaner as the second-ranked Cowboy moved to 11-0 on the season. Young sealed the dual with a 6-2 decision over No. 23 Cleveland Belton.

With the dual starting at 149 pounds, the Pokes got on the board first behind a 10-2 major decision courtesy of Victor Voinovich. It was the second-bonus point win of the season for Voinovich after earning a major decision at the Southern Scuffle as well. At 157 pounds, Kaden Gfeller moved to 9-3 on the season with a 10-9 decision over Isaiah Crosby.

After the Cowboys went up 7-0, the Beavers responded by winning decisions at 165, 174, 184 and 197, which included No. 4 Dustin Plott suffering his first loss to No. 29 Aaron Olmos at 174 pounds.

STILLWATER – The Oklahoma State wrestling team improved to 7-1 on the season Friday evening, taking down Northern Colorado, 24-10, in their return to Gallagher Iba Arena.

The Cowboys won seven of 10 matches, led by Travis Wittlake and Luke Surber, who collected back-to-back 17-5 major decisions over Branson Britten and Xavier Vasquez, respectively.

“I just think with some of these guys, they’re learning to perform in their match,” head coach John Smith said. “It’s almost like we still need more matches for several of these guys. Two this week. Two next week. Hitting better competition. Regardless of outcomes, I think we got a chance to see maybe us grow during this moment. I think that’s going to give us a good look at what we need to work on and do.”

STILLWATER – The Oklahoma State wrestling team capped off a weekend sweep in Gallagher-Iba Arena with a 28-7 victory over No. 23 West Virginia as it improved to 8-1 overall and 4-0 in conference matches.

The Cowboys won eight of 10 matches, that included bonus point wins from Daton Fix, Travis Wittlake and Luke Surber.

“We did a nice job picking up that first takedown in the first period,” head coach John Smith said. “I think everyone scored a takedown in the first period except for Blankenship and Wyatt. With both teams winning five matches, four by decision and a major decision by Missouri's Keegan O'Toole and OSU's Daton Fix, the match was decided based on the third criteria of match points, which Oklahoma State outscored Missouri, 45-43.

Oklahoma State entered the dual as the underdog in seven of the 10 individual bouts, but were able to pull off three upsets against the higher-ranked Tigers, including Luke Surber's win over No. 1 Rocky Elam, 5-4. Surber opened the scoring with a takedown in the first and after a quick escape and take down for Elam, Surber reversed the Tiger with second left in the period to take a 4-3 lead. Both wrestlers scored an escape in the following two periods leading to a 5-4 decision for Surber, marking the first win over a top-ranked wrestler for a Cowboy since the 2021 NCAA Championships.

Carter Young and Kaden Gfeller also defeated Tigers ranked in the top 10. Young opened the dual with a 4-2 win over No. 7 Allan Hart behind a takedown in the second, a third-period escape and over two minutes of riding time. After Victor Voinovich lost by decision to No. 7 Brock Mauller, Gfeller earned his second top-10 win of the season with a third-period reversal and ride out en route to a 4-3 win over No. 8 Jarrett Jacques.


The match would go back and forth from there as Missouri took a 10-6 lead with a major decision from top-ranked O'Toole at 165 pounds and a decision from No. 10 Peyton Mocco at 174. Travis Wittlake brought the Pokes within one with a 6-4 decision over No. 26 Colton Hawks before Surber put OSU ahead again. The Tigers would take decisions at heavyweight and 125 to regain a 16-12 lead before the final match.

Brookings, S.D. – The Oklahoma State wrestling team defeated No. 16 South Dakota State, 19-12, on Friday for its third ranked win a row.

With the victory, the Cowboys moved to 12-2 on the season and have won nine of their last 10 duals.

Oklahoma State won six of 10 matches, highlighted by ranked wins from four different wrestlers.

In a dual featuring seven ranked matchups, Reece Witcraft set the tone for the Cowboys in the first bout of the night, upsetting No. 25 Tanner Morgan to put OSU out front early. Witcraft opened up a 6-0 lead with a takedown and near fall points in the first period, riding the advantage to an eventual 9-5 decision.

No. 2 Daton Fix built the Cowboys' lead up to 7-0 following an 11-1 major decision over Derrick Cardinal in the following match. Fix again utilized first period near fall points en route to his third consecutive bonus point victory.

After No. 15 Carter Young dropped a tight match to No. 10 Clay Carlson, the Cowboys took the momentum right back with wins at 141 and 149 pounds heading into intermission. No. 21 Victor Voinovich recorded a takedown in the first period and was able to hold onto his lead through the rest of the match, edging Alek Martin, 3-1. In a top-20 matchup, No. 10 Kaden Gfeller defeated No. 19 Cael Swanson with ease thanks to a takedown and turn in the first period. He would go on to pick up an 8-1 decision to give Oklahoma State a 13-3 lead at the break.

In an important match out of intermission, No. 25 Wyatt Sheets took down No. 15 Tanner Cook, 8-6, for his fourth ranked win of the season. Sheets entered the third period trailing, 6-5, but was able to get an escape and takedown to escape the bout with a win.

At the 174-pound bout, No. 13 Cade DeVos got the Jackrabbits back on the board with a 9-5 decision over No. 9 Dustin Plott to cut into the Cowboy lead.


No. 10 Travis Wittlake bounced back in the next match with a victory over No. 18 Cade King, as he dominated from the top position, riding King out for the whole second period before getting a reverse in the third to take the match, 3-0. Wittlake's decision made the team score 19-6, sealing the OSU dual victory with two bouts remaining.

The Cowboys dropped the final two bouts of the night, with No. 16 Luke Surber falling to No. 9 Tanner Sloan and No. 16 A.J. Nevills defeating No. 23 Konner Doucet.

STILLWATER – The Oklahoma State wrestling team defeated Stanford, 25-9, inside Gallagher-Iba Arena on Sunday to improve to 13-2 on the season.

The Cowboys won seven of 10 bouts, which included bonus-point wins from Travis Wittlake and Luke Surber. No. 7 Oklahoma State has now won four straight and 10 of its last 11 duals heading into the final week of its regular season schedule.

Daton Fix and Carter Young began the dual with victories to build up a 6-0 Cowboy lead. Fix notched his 20th win of the season with a 6-1 decision over No. 28 Jason Miranda, while Young took down Jason Miranda twice in the first period en route to a 6-3 decision.

After Victor Voinovich suffered a close loss to No. 11 Jaden Abas at 149 pounds, No. 10 Kaden Gfeller put the Pokes back on track. In his second to last match in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the senior put together a strong second and third period to claim a 9-5 decision over No. 26 Charlie Darracott, avenging a loss to him at the Southern Scuffle.

Wyatt Sheets nearly pulled off a major upset at 165 pounds, but dropped a 4-2 bout in sudden victory to No. 3 Shane Griffith. Sheets reversed Griffith to start the second period, but the former national champion was able to tie up the score with two escapes in regulation. In sudden victory, Griffith countered a shot by grabbing a hold of Sheets' shoe and eventually securing a takedown of the edge of the mat 52 seconds into the overtime period.

The Cowboys' upperweights would clinch the OSU victory beginning with an 11-5 decision from No. 9 Dustin Plott. The junior had dropped his previous two matches heading into Sunday, but was able to rally behind three takedowns to down No. 27 Tyler Eischens.

At 184 pounds, Wittlake racked up eight takedowns on his way to a 19-9 major decision over Brook Byers. Luke Surber followed up with a second-period pin of No. 25 Nick Stemmet. After building a 6-2 lead in the first period, Surber ran a chicken wing into an arm bar and stuck Stemmet at the 3:35 mark in the match.

Konner Doucet would claim a 7-2 decision over Peter Ming to snap a run of four consecutive losses, all of which to were higher ranked opponents. Stanford's Nico Provo would take the final bout of the afternoon with a 5-2 decision over Reece Witcraft at 125 pounds.
