Cowboy Quick Hits

The Cowboys are 3-0 on the season after collecting their first conference win over Wyoming the last time out. So far this season, the Cowboys have outscored their opponents by a combined score of 89-15.

Daton Fix and Wyatt Sheets are tied for the team lead in career wins with 75 a piece. OSU has had 44 wrestlers reach the century mark in career wins in program history.

John Smith and the OSU staff signed seven wrestlers in the early signing period for the class of 2023. With two of the top-five prospects in the class, including top-ranked Christian Carroll, the group should be in contention for the No.1 signing class in the country.

MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Reid Romine in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (reid.romine@okstate.edu or 210-860-5959). Credentials can be picked up at the southeast pass gate of Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days. Credential pickup will be available one hour prior to the start of each dual and will close five minutes before the duals begins.

INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith, assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Reid Romine in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interviews before practice starts on Wednesday (usually around 2 p.m. CT), but other arrangements can be made.

MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending duals at Gallagher-Iba Arena should park in the lot just south of Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-serve basis.

PHOTOS AND VIDEO

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench. Photographers and videographers must stay seated while shooting to avoid obstructing fans' views.

COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt is in his 39th year broadcasting Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasional events are aired on 105.5 KGFY-FM radio or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. Any time the Cowboys are on the air, the live broadcast can also be accessed live on the official website of OSU athletics, www.okstate. com.

Head Coach | 32nd Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Smith begins his 32nd season at Oklahoma State in the 2021-22 season, after accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater in 1992. The accolades and accomplishments since that time are remarkable. In his 31 completed seasons at the helm five NCAA team titles in 1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006, and he has coached 33 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowbovs have brought 21 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 129 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. He has seen his student-athletes earn All-America recognition 150 times, an average of 4.8 All-America honorees per year.

The Basics

The Oklahoma State wrestling team will host No. 13 Minnesota on Dynasty Day at Gallagher-Iba Arena on Sunday at 2 p.m. CT. The Cowboys had a week off following a 34-3 victory over Wyoming on Nov. 18, which opened the home slate for OSU this season.

On the Air

The dual with Minnesota will be televised on Big 12 Now on ESPN+ with J. Carl Guymon and Hardell Moore on the call. It can also be heard on the radio with Rex Holt Sunday afternoon beginning at 1:30 p.m. CT on Hot 93.7 KSPI-FM. Live stats can be found on Trackwrestling.com.

The Series - Minnesota

Oklahoma State and Minnesota have met a total of 42 times since the first meeting in 1941, which was a 18-6 win for the Cowboys. OSU improved its record in the series to 28-14 after winning 23-10 in Minneapolis last season. OSU has won the last six duals with the Golden Gophers after Minnesota had won four of five matches from 2012 to 2014. The Cowboys hold an 11-6 advantage in the series when wrestling in Stillwater ahead of Sunday's match.

About the Cowboys

Oklahoma State moved up one spot to No. 9 in the NWCA Coaches Poll following a 3-0 start to the season after defeating Wyoming in its home opener on Nov. 18.

The Pokes return four All-Americans who have earned All-America honors a total of eight times, headlined by three-time NCAA finalist Daton Fix. Wyatt Sheets and Travis Wittlake are both two-time All-Americans for OSU, while Dustin Plott is coming off of his first appearance on the podium last season.

The OSU lineup has seen some movement from a season ago with weight changes from past starters opening opportunities at 165 pounds and heavyweight. Wittlake moved up two weight classes to 184 pounds in the offseason, while Luke Surber dropped down a weight to 197 pounds. In their places, Wyatt Sheets won his first three matches at 165 pounds, while Konner Doucet has started 3-0 as a Cowboy heavyweight.

Trevor Mastrogiovanni returns for his third season in the lineup at 125 pounds as he looks to make the jump that Plott did a year ago to All-America status for the first time. Carter Young returns at 141 pounds where he went 12-9 as a true freshman, but should benefit from an offseason where he grew into the weight class. Talented freshman Victor Voinovich will start the season at 149 pounds, but could be challenged by reigning Big 12 champion Kaden Gfeller who decided to return to Oklahoma State for his final season in August. Kaden Gfeller got the starting nod at 157 pounds against Lehigh's All-American Josh Humphreys, while Luke Mechler made his dual debut against Bucknell at the weight. Voinovich flashed potential while redshirting as a true freshman posting a 16-1 record and placing third at the Southern Scuffle. With Sheets and Gfeller back for their COVID seasons, the middleweights could see some different looks throughout the course of the season. Those two and Jalin Harper will be challenged by a group of Cowboys looking to break into the starting lineup for the first time, including Chance McLane, Travis Mastrogiovanni, Mechler and talented freshman Jordan Williams.

Cowboys in the Polls

Oklahoma State's roster features 10 wrestlers ranked in various polls this week, with five holding spots inside the top-10. Senior 133-pounder Daton Fix is the consensus No. 2 wrestler at his weight and is the highest ranked Cowboy as the reigning Big 12 champion and a national finalist the last two seasons. Following Fix, Dustin Plott appears at No. 4 at 174 pounds after earning All-America honors for the first time last season with a sixth-place finish

Also making appearances in the top 10 of their respective weight classes are Trevor Mastrogiovanni, Kaden Gfeller and Travis Wittlake. Mastrogiovanni holds down the No. 7 spot ahead of a big-time matchup with No. 4 Patrick McKee, while Gfeller is ranked as high as No. 10 by *Intermat* at 157 pounds and also has an upcoming match with a highly-ranked Golden Gopher. Wittlake has put together a 3-0 start at 184 pounds where he is ranked No. 9 by *WIN Magazine*.

Wyatt Sheets is ranked as high as No. 16 at 165 pounds after a 3-0 start with two ranked wins, while Victor Voinovich (149) is ranked No. 18 by *Intermat*. Luke Surber is ranked as high as No. 17 by *WIN Magazine* as he moves down to 197 pounds, while Konner Doucet lands at No. 16 in the *Intermat* rankings following his 3-0 start. Despite a 1-2 record to start the season, Carter Young remained in the *Intermat* rankings at No. 21 at 141 pounds.

In 2018, coach John Smith assumed the title of winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I wrestling when the Pokes defeated Minnesota on Nov. 19, inside Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Smith reached yet another milestone in last season's 36-4 dual win against Little Rock. The victory was Smith's 443rd and moved him past Gary Taylor and into the top three on the list of all-time Divison 1 coaching wins.

OSU's victory over Stanford to open the 2021-22 season marked Smith's 450 dual win as head coach of his alma mater. He needs 31 more victories to pass Harold Nichols and move into second place.

Two Cowboys Chasing the Century Mark

Cowboy seniors Daton Fix and Wyatt Sheets are both nearing 100 wins in their collegiate careers.

The active leaders on Oklahoma State's roster with 75 wins a piece, the century mark could be within reach toward the end of this season. Sheets elected to return to OSU for his COVID season, while Fix is one of the winningest wrestlers in program history based on winning percentage and still has another year of eligibility he could take advantage of.

OSU has had 44 wrestlers reach the 100-win mark in their career, most recently accomplished by Kaid Brock from 2016 to 2021.

A New Look Lineup

While the names may look largely the same to last season's starters for Oklahoma State, multiple weight changes during the offseason have shaken up the Cowboy lineup.

Travis Wittlake, a two-time All-American at 165 pounds, is bumping up two weight classes to 184 pounds, leaving his former weight class up for grabs. Wittlake defeated Kyle Haas and Gavin Stika in OSU's

ranking matches on Nov. 5 to earn the starting spot. With the departure of Wittlake from 165, Wyatt Sheets got the start in the first three duals, posting a 3-0 record. Sheets has been the Cowboys' starter at 157 pounds where he earned All-America honors in 2021 and may move back down to the weight at some point during the season. Kaden Gfeller and Luke Mechler each wrestled one match at 157 pounds on the first road trip of the season. Gfeller nearly upset Lehigh's Josh Humphreys, who is ranked in the top 10 at the weight, while Mechler dropped his bout to No. 33 Nick Delp of Bucknell in his dual debut.

At the upperweights, Luke Surber has returned to 197 pounds where he went 8-1 in extra matches as a true freshman. He went 14-10 as an undersized heavyweight last season, which included a run to the Big 12 finals. With Surber back down to his preferred weight class another member of the top ranked signing class of 2020 will get his opportunity to shine. Redshirt sophomore Konner Doucet went 10-2 in open tournaments last season and started this season with three wins, including a 2-1 decision over No. 26 Nathan Taylor in the win over Lehigh.

Dustin His Competition

Cowboy 174-pounder Dustin Plott made a huge jump into the national spotlight as a sophomore and will look to take that momentum into his junior year.

He went 21-6 overall with a 13-3 mark in duals and capped off a stellar year with his first individual Big 12 championship and a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. He posted a 13-5 record against ranked wrestlers as a sophomore with his highest-ranked win coming against No. 7 Ethan Smith of Ohio State to secure a spot on the podium at NCAAs.

Following the collegiate season, Plott won the 79 kg bracket at the U23 World Team Trials in June, going 7-0 at the tournament while outscoring his opponents 66-16 in those matches.

So far in the 2022-23 season, Plott has looked sharp as he leads the team in takedowns and has picked up a ranked win and two bonus-point wins to start the year.

Homegrown Cowboys

Oklahoma State has built its roster on Oklahomans staying home to wrestle in Stillwater. Nearly half of the entire roster are Oklahomans, while the OSU lineup is expected to feature six starters from the state of Oklahoma. In addition, Oklahoma City native Kaden Gfeller could return to the lineup at some point in the year at 149 pounds. With the NCAA Championships being in Tulsa for the first time this season, the OSU will have the opportunity to compete for a national title in its home state for the first time since 2014.

Coached by the Best

When wrestlers come to compete at Oklahoma State, they are coached by some of the greatest to ever step on the mat. John Smith holds six world championships and two Olympic gold medals. Smith, Zack Esposito, Chris Perry and Tyler Caldwell also combine for five NCAA championships and 13 All-America honors. Smith brings in a plethora of international coaching experience. Most recently, he coached the 2017 USA Women's Cadet World Team, for which he was named USA Wrestling Women's Co-Coach of the Year alongside Campbell's Kary Kolat.

Esposito has had a hand in coaching World teams for the past four years, including two Cadet World Teams, a first-place Junior World Team and title-winning World Cup Team.

John Smith's Coaching Tree

John Smith's coaching tree is undoubtedly the largest in the collegiate wrestling world.

Seven of Smith's former wrestlers at Oklahoma State are now head coaches running their own programs across the nation, not to mention the numerous assistant coaches, along with Glen Lanham, who was a teammate of Smith at OSU and a head coach in the ACC.

Wyoming's Mark Branch is one of the longer tenured head coaches that have come from Smith's tree. The 2018 Big 12 Coach of the Year is in his 15th season at Wyoming and holds a career record of 131-71. As a wrestler, Branch put together a 100-18 record while being coached by Smith to two individual national titles and one of OSU's 14 career four-time All-Americans. After his graduation in 1997, Branch spent seven years in Stillwater as the Associate Head Coach before taking the head coach position in Laramie in 2008.

Smith has had the advantage over his former wrestlers carrying a 22-1 dual record against them when they match up head-to-head as coaches. His only loss came from Pat Popolizio when NC State defeated the Cowboys 19-15 in 2015.



Dual Notes

All He Does is Win

Since breaking into the starting lineup for Oklahoma State as a redshirt freshman in the 2018-19 season, Daton Fix has become one of the winningest wrestlers in program history. At 75-4 in his career, Fix has a winning percent-

At 75-4 in his career, Fix has a winning percentage of 94.93%, which is good for 13th on the list of highest winning percentages ever among OSU wrestlers. With 48 career bonus-point victories, including one major decsion and a fall this season, he also boasts a career 64.0% bonus win percentage.

Wrestling's House of Horrors

No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-lba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 44 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home, the most recent coming in 2021. One of the program's longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, with no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 503-44-6 overall record in the arena.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before Oklahoma broke the streak. 19-13.

OSU's home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30, 1993.

The Cowboys most recent 26-match winning streak at home, dating back to Jan. 27, 2018, was broken on Jan. 29, 2022 as Northern Iowa defeated OSU, 19-15. At 26, the run was the fourth-longest streak in program history.

MINNEAPOLIS – The Oklahoma State wrestling team improved to 2-0 on the season with a 23-10 victory on the road at No. 11 Minnesota that saw six Cowboys defeat ranked Golden Gophers.

"I thought we looked good at several weight classes," head coach John Smith said. "Our theme this week was to get better, but we didn't get better at some weight classes. We didn't have much killer instinct in us and didn't want to finish some matches off. It's early and hopefully we will improve from this match as we move onto Drexel next weekend."

The sixth-ranked Cowboys got off to a quick start when sophomore Trevor Mastrogiovanni upset No. 5 Patrick McKee, who was an All-American last season. Mastrogiovanni held a 4-3 after the first period, and separated the score in the second with an escape and pair of takedowns to extend his lead to 9-4. He finished off a 10-6 decision to put the Cowboys up 3-0.

"He had a really good effort," Smith said. "There was a lot of confidence in his performance and those takedowns were big and critical. He picked him up when he was in on legs and he did a nice job finishing his shots, which made a difference in the outcome."

Daton Fix moved to 2-0 on the season with an 18-7 major decision over No. 33 Jake Gliva. Dustin Plott, Dakota Geer and AJ Ferrari each moved their record to 2-0, as well, with wins today

Ranked 15th in the nation, Plott took down No. 23 Jared Krattiger with a convincing 6-1 decision. At 184, Geer clinched the victory for OSU with a takedown in sudden victory. Geer and No. 21 Isaiah Salazar, who was 4-0 on the season, ended regulation at a 1-1 tie before Geer sealed his second victory of the season in the first sudden victory period. Ferrari got off to a fast start in his match with Michial Foy as he led 4-1 after one period. He doubled his lead in the second period and used a takedown with three seconds remaining to collect his second major decision in as many matches.

No. 22 Kaden Gfeller and No. 6 Travis Wittlake earned their first wins of the season after dropping bouts to top-10 opponents at Stanford. Down 2-0 after the first period, Gfeller took control of the match in the second period with an escape, takedown and four-point turn. He finished off No. 26 Michael Blockhus by a score of 10-3, while Wittlake defeated No. 21 Andrew Sparks, 8-3.

The Cowboys took seven of 10 matches in the duals with the losses coming at 141, 157 and heavyweight. At 141, true freshman Carter Young dropped his dual debut to Jake Bergeland by a score of 6-4, while Wyatt Sheets dropped his match with No. 5 Brayton Lee, 15-9. Luke Surber had the daunting task of facing top-ranked heavyweight and Olympic champion, Gable Steveson, who collected a 20-7 major decision.

STILLWATER - The Oklahoma State wrestling team jumped out to an early lead and rode the momentum to a dominating 34-3 win over Wyoming in its home opener in Gallagher-Iba Arena on Friday night.

The Cowboys took an early 9-0 lead behind a hard-fought 2-0 decision from Trevor Mastrogiovanni over Wyoming freshman Jore Volk, who won a U20 world championship in reestyle this summer. Following Mastrogiovanni, Daton Fix collected his 75th career win in style with a first-period fall over Aidan Noonan to extend the OSU lead to 9-0.

The only win of the night for Wyoming came in a close match at 141 pounds where Job Greenwood fought off a late shot from Carter Young to clinch a 4-3 decision.


