MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Reid Romine in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (reid.romine@okstate.edu or 210-860-5959). Credentials can be picked up at the southeast pass gate of Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days. Credential pickup will be available one hour prior to the start of each dual and will close five minutes before the duals begins.

INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith, assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Reid Romine in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interviews before practice starts on Wednesday (usually around 2 p.m. CT), but other arrangements can be made.

MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending duals at Gallagher-Iba Arena should park in the lot just south of Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-serve basis.

PHOTOS AND VIDEO

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench. Photographers and videographers must stay seated while shooting to avoid obstructing fans' views.

COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt is in his 39th year broadcasting Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasional events are aired on 105.5 KGFY-FM radio or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. Any time the Cowboys are on the air, the live broadcast can also be accessed live on the official website of OSU athletics, www.okstate. com.

Head Coach | 32nd Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Smith begins his 32nd season at Oklahoma State in the 2021-22 season, after accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater in 1992. The accolades and accomplishments since that time are remarkable. In his 31 completed seasons at the helm five NCAA team titles in 1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006, and he has coached 33 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowboys have brought 21 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 129 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. He has seen his student-athletes earn All-America recognition 150 times, an average of 4.8 All-America honorees per year.

Tournament Notes

The Basics

The No. 12 Oklahoma State wrestling team (6-1 overall; 2-0 Big 12) will wrestle in Gallagher-Iba Arena for the first time in 2023 when it hosts a pair of conference opponents over the weekend. OSU will take on Northern Colorado at 7 p.m. CT on Friday night before hosting No. 23 West Virginia at 2 p.m. CT on Sunday. This will be the first time the Cowboys wrestle in GIA in 2023, having not had a home dual since Dec. 4.

On the Air

Both of Oklahoma State's upcoming matches will be streamed on Big 12 Now on ESPN+ with J. Carl Guymon and Hardell Moore on the call. The duals can also be heard on the radio with Rex Holt going on air 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time of the match on Hot 93.7 KSPI-FM. Live stats for the match can be found on Trackwrestling.com.

The Series - Northern Colorado

Oklahoma State and Northern Colorado have met 17 times for dual competitions in the programs' histories heading into Friday's match. OSU has won all but one contest, tying with the Bears in Greeley in 1963. Since John Smith took over the program in Stillwater, the Pokes are 7-0 against UNC. In those seven meetings the Cowboys have collectively outscored the Bears, 294-13, with an average margin of victory of 40.1 points. The teams have not wrestled since the 2019-20 season when the Cowboys won 36-3 in Stillwater behind six bonus-point wins, including a major decision from Wyatt Sheets and technical fall from Travis Wittlake.

The Series - West Virginia

Sunday's meeting between Oklahoma State and West Virginia will be the 16th dual matchup between the programs and first since 2020. The Cowboys have won every contest in the series and hold a 9-0 record against the Mountaineers inside Gallagher-Iba Arena. John Smith is 11-0 against WVU, while Tim Flynn is winless in his two outings against OSU.

About the Cowboys

No. 12 Oklahoma State is 6-1 on the season and coming off a three-week road stand that saw the team claim a Southern Scuffle team title and then win duals at Oregon State and Columbia.

The Pokes return four All-Americans who have earned All-America honors a total of eight times, headlined by three-time NCAA finalist Daton Fix. Wyatt Sheets and Travis Wittlake are both two-time All-Americans for OSU, while Dustin Plott is coming off of his first appearance on the podium last season.

The OSU lineup has seen some movement from a season ago with weight changes from past starters opening opportunities at 165 pounds and heavyweight. Wittlake moved up two weight classes to 184 pounds in the offseason where he has started 10-2, while Luke Surber dropped down a weight to 197 pounds. In their places, Wyatt Sheets has filled the void at 165 pounds, while redshirt sophomore Konner Doucet is off to a 11-3 start at heavyweight and placed third at the Scuffle.

Trevor Mastrogiovanni is in his third season in the lineup at 125 pounds as he looks to make the jump that Plott did a year ago to All-America status for the first time. Big 12 champion Kaden Gfeller decided to return to Oklahoma State for his final season in August and has put together a 10-3 record so far 157 pounds, while talented freshman Victor Voinovich has started every dual at 149 pounds. With Sheets and Gfeller back for their COVID seasons, the middleweights could see some different looks throughout the course of the season.

Cowboys in the Polls

Oklahoma State's roster features 10 wrestlers ranked in various polls this week, with three holding spots inside the top-10. Senior 133-pounder Daton Fix is the consensus No. 2 wrestler at his weight and is the highest ranked Cowboy as the reigning Big 12 champion and a national finalist the last two seasons. Following Fix, Dustin Plott appears as high as No. 5 at 174 pounds after earning All-America honors for the first time last season with a sixth-place finish. Kaden Gfeller makes his return to the top-10 at 157 pounds for the second time in *The Open Mat's* poll.

Travis Wittlake is ranked No. 12 in each of the four polls at 184 pounds with a 10-2 record, while Trevor Mastrogiovanni is ranked No. 15 in the *FloWrestling* poll at 125 pounds. The remainder of the Cowboys find themselves ranked in some of the polls and left out of others, although it should be noted that *The Open Mat* and *WIN Magazine* only rank the top 20 of each weight class. Victor Voinovich sits at No. 19 in *WIN Magazine's* 149-pound rankings, while Wyatt Sheets (165) is at No. 21, according to *FloWrestling*. Luke Surber (197) and Konner Doucet (HWT) both remain in the twenties at their respective weight classes ahead of a tough conference schedule. Carter Young seems to be the toughest Cowboy to rank as he lands as high as No. 17 and low as No. 32, while being unranked in two polls.

Climbing the Ladder

In 2018, coach John Smith assumed the title of winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I wrestling when the Pokes defeated Minnesota on Nov. 19, inside Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Smith reached yet another milestone in last season's 36-4 dual win against Little Rock. The victory was Smith's 443rd and moved him past Gary Taylor and into the top three on the list of all-time Divison 1 coaching wins.

OSU's victory over Stanford to open the 2021-22 season marked Smith's 450 dual win as head coach of his alma mater. He needs 25 more victories to pass Harold Nichols and move into second place.

Two Cowboys Chasing the Century Mark

Cowboy seniors Daton Fix and Wyatt Sheets are both nearing 100 wins in their collegiate careers.

The active leaders on Oklahoma State's roster with 84 wins for Fix and 81 for Sheets, the century mark could be within reach toward the end of this season. Sheets elected to return to OSU for his COVID season, while Fix is one of the winningest wrestlers in program history based on winning percentage and still has another year of eligibility he could take advantage of.

OSU has had 44 wrestlers reach the 100-win mark in their career, most recently accomplished by Nick Piccininni during the 2020 season.

A New Look Lineup

While the names may look largely the same to last season's starters for Oklahoma State, multiple weight changes during the offseason have shaken up the Cowboy lineup.

Travis Wittlake, a two-time All-American at 165 pounds, bumped up two weight classes to 184 pounds, leaving his former weight class up for grabs. Wittlake has started the season 10-2, which included a 5-0 run to claim the Southern Scuffle title his last time out.

With the departure of Wittlake from 165, Wyatt Sheets has filled the void, posting a 9-5 record this season. Sheets has been the Cowboys' starter at 157 pounds where he earned All-America honors in 2021 and may move back down to the weight at some point during the season. Two-time Big 12 champion at 149 pounds, Kaden Gfeller has bumped up to 157 pounds where he is 10-3 this season and picked up the highest-ranked win of his career against No. 2 Brayton Lee of Minnesota on Dec. 4.

At the upperweights, Luke Surber has returned to 197 pounds where he went 8-1 in extra matches as a true freshman. He went 14-10 as an undersized heavyweight last season, which included a run to the Big 12 finals. With Surber back down to his preferred weight class another member of the top ranked signing class of 2020 will get his opportunity to shine. Redshirt sophomore Konner Doucet went 10-2 in open tournaments last season and is 11-3 this season coming off of a third-place finish at the Southern Scuffle.

Dustin His Competition

Cowboy 174-pounder Dustin Plott made a huge jump into the national spotlight as a sophomore and will look to take that momentum into his junior year.

He went 21-6 overall with a 13-3 mark in duals and capped off a stellar year with his first individual Big 12 championship and a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. He posted a 13-5 record against ranked wrestlers as a sophomore with his highest-ranked win coming against No. 7 Ethan Smith of Ohio State to secure a spot on the podium at NCAAs.

Following the collegiate season, Plott won the 79 kg bracket at the U23 World Team Trials in June, going 7-0 at the tournament while outscoring his opponents 66-16 in those matches.

opponents 66-16 in those matches.
So far in the 2022-23 season, Plott has been sharp as he leads the team in takedowns. He is 5-1 against ranked opponents and has four bonus-point wins, including a technical fall against No. 19 Darrien Roberts of Oklahoma.

Homegrown Cowboys

Oklahoma State has built its roster on Oklahomans staying home to wrestle in Stillwater. Nearly half of the entire roster are Oklahomans, while the OSU lineup features seven starters from the state of Oklahoma. With the NCAA Championships being in Tulsa for the first time this season, the OSU will have the opportunity to compete for a national title in its home state for the first time since 2014.

Coached by the Best

When wrestlers come to compete at Oklahoma State, they are coached by some of the greatest to ever step on the mat. John Smith holds six world championships and two Olympic gold medals. Smith, Zack Esposito, Chris Perry and Tyler Caldwell also combine for five NCAA championships and 13 All-America honors. Smith brings in a plethora of international coaching experience. Most recently, he coached the 2017 USA Women's Cadet World Team, for which he was named USA Wrestling Women's Co-Coach of the Year alongside Campbell's Kary Kolat.

Esposito has had a hand in coaching World teams for the past four years, including two Cadet World Teams, a first-place Junior World Team and title-winning World Cup Team.

John Smith's Coaching Tree

John Smith's coaching tree is undoubtedly the largest in the collegiate wrestling world.

Seven of Smith's former wrestlers at Oklahoma State are now head coaches running their own programs across the nation, not to mention the numerous assistant coaches, along with Glen Lanham, who was a teammate of Smith at OSU and a head coach in the ACC.

Smith has had the advantage over his former wrestlers carrying a 23-1 dual record against them when they match up head-to-head as coaches. His only loss came from Pat Popolizio when NC State defeated the Cowboys 19-15 in 2015.

All He Does is Win

Since breaking into the starting lineup for Oklahoma State as a redshirt freshman in the 2018-19 season, Daton Fix has become one of the winningest wrestlers in program history.

wrestlers in program history.
At 84-4 in his career, Fix has a winning percentage of 95.45%, which puts him in a tie with Steve Mocco for 12th on the list of highest winning percentages ever among OSU wrestlers. With 52 career bonus-point victories, including three major decsions, a tech fall and a pair of falls this season, he also boasts a career 61.9% bonus win percentage.



Tournament Notes

Wrestling's House of Horrors

No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-lba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 44 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home, the most recent coming in 2021. One of the program's longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, with no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 503-45-6

overall record in the arena.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before Oklahoma broke the streak, 19-13.

OSU's home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30, 1993.

The Cowboys most recent 26-match winning streak at home, dating back to Jan. 27, 2018, was broken on Jan. 29, 2022 as Northern Iowa defeated OSU, 19-15. At 26, the run was the fourth-longest streak in program history.

STILLWATER - The No. 11 Oklahoma State wrestling team (5-1, 2-0 Big 12) notched six bonus point wins against Northern Colorado en route to a 36-3 defeat of the Bears on Sunday afternoon in Gallagher-Iba Arena. The victory marks the Cowboys' second conference win of the year.

"When you wrestle someone you need to dominate, it's hard to ever get what you want out of those matches," coach John Smith said. "I knew there were several matches that were going to be competitive."

The Pokes took nine out of 10 bouts from the Bears, starting with a Nick Piccininni 20-5 technical fall over Jace Koelzer. He lit up the scoreboard in the third period, securing four takedowns, and put the Cowboys ahead early. OSU finished the dual with three technical falls and three major decisions.

At 165 pounds Travis Wittlake defeated Macoy Flanagan in the first period, 16-1. Wittlake earned two first-period takedowns and three consecutive turns to end the match in 2:23. It marked the redshirt freshman's third technical fall victory of the season. Also collecting a technical fall for the Pokes was Dakota Geer, who rattled off four takedowns in the second period and capped it with a four-point nearfall to finish the bout in 4:35. He defeated Seth Bogulski, 19-3.

Dusty Hone defeated Christopher Sandoval via major decision, 8-0. The Cowboy scored four points in the second period and didn't give up a point to the Bear. Boo Lewallen remained undefeated, earning his third win over a ranked opponent this season. He upended 17th-ranked Andrew Alirez, 11-7, behind a six-point effort in the third.

"I'm just trying to figure out how to make matches go the way I want them to go, which I think our whole team is trying to clean up these matches and continue to put pressure on guys and score points. Yeah, I separated the score when it got hard late in the match, but I'd like to do that earlier in the match, where I open up the score a little more early on and then wrestle through the match like that.

Coming off a third-place finish at the Southern Scuffle, Wyatt Sheets collected a 17-4 major decision over Nathan Moore behind a four-takedown final period. Senior Andrew Shomers collected his second dual win of the season at 174 pounds with a shutout victory over Northern Colorado's Billy Higgins.

Anthony Montalvo defeated Alan Clothier in a close, 6-3, decision to claim his fourth dual win of the season.

Austin Harris closed out the dual with a 4-3 victory in the heavyweight match. He picked up a third-period takedown and held off a late attack to secure the one-point decision and his third straight dual match win.

Reece Witcraft had the only loss of the day in a tough match against No. 19 Mosha Schwartz, 12-11. Schwartz earned a takedown late in third to give him the advantage.

"I thought we looked pretty good overall," coach John Smith said. "We didn't focus on riding time that much, it just materialized that way. Overall, it was a pretty good effort. We did a good job with our takedowns and our riding. Tomorrow we are going to need all that plus some."

Boo Lewallen and Anthony Montalvo led the way, both scoring falls for the Pokes in the dual. The two Cowboys picked up fall No. 2 on the season in the first period of their matches. For Montalvo, the 2:30 pin marked his first linside Gallagher-Iba.

"Anthony did a good job," Smith said. "He stayed hungry with the over bar and running the chicken wing. You love the pins. Those bonus points are big."

Senior Nick Piccininni and Reese Witcraft got the dual underway with a horde of scoring in back-to-back technical falls. Piccininni took out West Virginia's Joey Thomas in one period with a takedown and four straight turns. It took Witcraft just more than five and half minutes to top Lucas Seibert, 17-1.

Dusty Hone collected his second straight dual win with a 7-2 decision over Caleb Rea just before Lewallen dropped Liam Lusher in the first period of his bout.

The Pokes followed that match with three straight major decisions for Wyatt Sheets (157), Travis Wittlake (165) and Andrew Shomers (174). Sheets collected dual win No. 4 with the 12-point shutout against Alex Hornfeck. Wittlake remained undefeated in dual action with a 12-3 advantage over Nick Kiussis and Shomers collected his loth win of the season, 11-3, over Scott Joll,

OSU's two losses on the evening came at 197 pounds when second-ranked Noah Adams pinned Dakota Geer, and in his first match of the season, Cornelius Putnam lost to Brandon Ngati in sudden victory.







STILLWATER - The Oklahoma State wrestling team jumped out to an early lead and rode the momentum to a dominating 34-3 win over Wyoming in its home opener in Gallagher-lba Arena on Friday night.

The Cowboys took an early 9-0 lead behind a hard-fought 2-0 decision from Trevor Mastrogiovanni over Wyoming freshman Jore Volk, who won a U20 world championship in reestyle this summer. Following Mastrogiovanni, Daton Fix collected his 75th career win in style with a first-period fall over Aidan Noonan to extend the OSU lead to 9-0.

The only win of the night for Wyoming came in a close match at 141 pounds where Job Greenwood fought off a late shot from Carter Young to clinch a 4-3 decision.

From there, the rout was on for No. 10 Oklahoma State as it won the final seven matches to close out the dual. Wyatt Sheets won the lone ranked matchup of the night, defeating No. 21 Cole Moody, 6-2. After a scoreless first period, Moody took a 2-0 lead in the second period behind two stall calls against Sheets and an escape, but Sheets responded with a late takedown to send the match to the third period tied at two. The 16th-ranked Cowboy used an escape, takedown and ride out in the final period to secure his third victory of the season and 75th win of his career.

Luke Surber and Dustin Plott each picked up bonus-point wins in their matches. At 174 pounds, Plott recorded a pair of takedowns in both of the first two period before putting up seven points in the third period on his way to a 16-6 major decision over Brett McIntosh. Surber just needed one takedown and a turn to end his match as he collected his first fall of the season in 1:38 over Tyce Raddon.

Victor Voinovich, Travis Wittlake and Konner Doucet all moved to 3-0 on the season with comfortable decisions over their Cowboy counterparts, while Kaden Gfeller earned his first victory of the season with a 6-3 win over Logan Ours behind a second period that included a reversal and near fall from Gfeller.

"I thought from a team standpoint, it kinds of reminds me of seeing guys getting their season started and finding a rhythm of how you want to wrestle, it takes some matches," head coach John Smith said. "It just seemed like we struggled a little bit with some sort of rhythm, and give credit to Wyoming, (Mark) Branch had his team ready to fight and they did fight. With that comes a few of them where they were satisfied to get a win rather than trying to stretch scores out, continuing to develop their offense in some of these matches."

STILLWATER - Two Oklahoma State wrestlers earned the highest-ranked wins of their careers, but a late rally fell short as No. 9 Oklahoma State's dropped its first dual of the season to No. 13 Minnesota, 18-12, on Sunday in Gallagher-Iba Arena.

With the dual starting at 165 pounds, OSU trailed 15-3 after six bouts, but charged back in the lower weight matches behind two upsets over Golden Gophers ranked in the top 10 by Carter Young and Kaden Gfeller.

At 141 pounds, Young took the mat to face No. 3 Jake Bergeland. In a scoreless first period, Young set the tone for the match getting deep on multiple shots. He opened up the score in the third period beginning with an escape from the down position and a takedown on his way to a 5-1 decision over Bergeland. Two matches later, Kaden Gfeller knocked off No. 2 Brayton Lee with a 2-0 decision marking the second too-10 win for OSU on the day.

Daton Fix and Dustin Plott each improved to 4-0 on the season with comfortable decisions over Golden Gophers.

"It's just a process, right," head coach John Smith said. "We've talked about development as we go through and the experiences that we've had. Even in this dual meet, it's like I said, I got a lot to work with. They exposed us a little bit. This is by far the best team we've wrestled and it's a good team. It gives us something. If we wrestled them in two weeks, hopefully I'd see a different level of performance. I'm not going to say we'd win, I just think we recognized a little bit real quickly that to win tough, hard matches, you've got to wrestle tough and hard"

The early deficit for the Cowboys came from a run of four consecutive losses from 184 pounds to 125 pounds as Travis Wittlake, Konner Doucet and Trevor Mastrogiovanni all suffered their first defeats of the season, while Luke Surber fell to 2-2 on the year at 197 pounds.

Wyatt Sheets battled in the opening bout of the match, but dropped a close 5-4 decision to No. 27 Andrew Sparks, while the Golden Gophers clinched the dual with a 3-1 decision at 149 pounds where No. 17 Michael Blockhus topped No. 18 Victor Veinovich
