Providence, Rhode Island

Distance From NYC: 3.5-hour drive (or 3 hours by train)

The capital city of the smallest state in the nation has a larger-than-life art scene. With the Rhode Island School of Design in town, Providence is home to a huge population of burgeoning artists, resulting in cool galleries like <u>Public</u> and <u>The Wurks</u> that keep visitors occupied even beyond a weekend stay. Check out each space's calendar and stop in to peruse the latest exhibitions. Alternatively, plan your visit around <u>WaterFire</u>, a celebration of the city's waterfront where more than 80 crackling bonfires light up the river and fill the area with aromatic wood smoke in a captivating art installation.

Lean into the city's vibrant culture even further and book a room at <u>Dye House</u>. Set in a wool-dyeing factory built in 1880, the boutique hotel and event space is a design lover's dream. The team tapped local talent to contribute to the design, furniture, and even ceramics found in each room, and you're practically guaranteed to find a cool artist popup or other event going on during your stay.

Newport, Rhode Island

Distance From NYC: 4-hour drive (or 3.5 hours by train)

Get a <u>taste of Europe without pulling out your passport</u> in Newport, Rhode Island. This coastal destination has been a beloved destination for the country's elite since the late 19th century, and its grand properties and high-end shopping and dining remain today.

Take a self-guided tour of the iconic <u>Newport Mansions</u>, then walk along the 3.5-mile <u>Newport Cliff Walk</u>, which provides some of the most breathtaking views along the entire Eastern Seaboard. If you want to dive in further, so to speak, get out on the water yourself by renting a boat to sail around Narragansett Bay.

Finally, live like the local elite with a stay at <u>The Vanderbilt</u>, <u>Auberge Resorts Collection</u>, a 33-room hotel that dates back to 1909. Get ready to enjoy five-star service just as the hotel's namesake family would.
