Weekapaug Inn

While the adults relax on the inn's private, two-mile beach, head to the Boathouse, where crewmembers will set you up with everything you need to go crabbing, kayaking, or paddleboarding; or look for fairies in the Land of Paug, a village of tiny houses hidden on the inn's grounds. Through Labor Day, explorers ages 5 to 10 can join the SandCastles program, where YMCA counselors lead scavenger hunts, crafts, and story hours centered on themes like "pirate's paradise" or "rainforest adventure." Watch Hill Flying Horse Carousel

Soar through the air on one of the 20 hand-carved horses at this historic carousel, which was built more than 150 years ago and is one of the oldest in the country. Be sure to get a seat on an outside horse so you can reach for the brass ring, which is good for one free ride.

Misquamicut State Beach

You don't need a special pass or permit for this public beach, where the waves are just big enough for boogie boarding. Head east on Atlantic Avenue to reach the rides and arcade at Atlantic Beach Park, waterslides at the Water Wizz of Westerly, and mini-golf and batting cages at Bayview Fun Park. <u>riparks.com</u>



Stop for sandwiches and, more important, ice cream at this retro café, which has been family-owned since 1887. Pizzeria Longo

It wouldn't be a trip to Rhode Island without some Italian food: The state has the highest percentage of Italian-American residents in the country. Pizzeria Longo is known, of course, for its wood-fired pies, cooked on a 6,500-pound grill imported from Italy, but don't miss the famous meatballs.
