The annual autumn event at Roger Williams Park Zoo was changed to a drive-through experience in 2020. This fall, the event returns to its walk-through format. Held through Oct. 31, the event features more than 5,000 intricately carved pumpkins. This year's event celebrates 150 years of music, with pumpkins depicting the greats of ragtime, swing, rock, hip hop and more. View pumpkins of all shapes and sizes, with some weighing up to 2,000 pounds. Tickets are on sale now and must be purchased in advance.

WaterFire Providence
