# RICHMOND REGION TOURISM BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING MINUTES MAY 18, 2023 LEWIS GINTER BOTANICAL GARDEN HENRICO COUNTY 10:00 A.M.

## I. CALL TO ORDER & WELCOME:

- A. Welcome: Chairman Dan Schmitt called the meeting to order at 10:09 a.m., established a quorum and led the pledge of allegiance to the flag of the United States of America. Chairman Schmitt welcomed the group and introduced Mr. John Vithoulkas, County Manager, who gave a brief welcome to the County of Henrico. Mr. Brian Trader, President & CEO, Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden, also welcomed the group. Mr. J.C. Poma was welcomed to the group representing Chesterfield County and a staff alternate to Mr. Jim Holland, replacing Mr. Clay Bowles.
- B. **MOTION** <u>Minutes</u>: The minutes from the March 16<sup>th</sup> meeting were reviewed. Mr. Todd Parnell made a motion to accept the minutes which were seconded by Mr. Pat Collins. The vote passed.

## II. NEW BUSINESS:

A. <a href="President's Report">President's Report</a>: Mr. Jack Berry gave a personnel update and noted that we have hired a Director of Finance. Michael J. Kerr was hired and began working April 11th. During the process, Kelly Harding, Manager of Accounting, who had been with us for 10 years decided to resign and her last day with us was April 14th. In April, we accepted the resignation from J.C. Poma. J.C. is now the Executive Director of Sports, Entertainment, and Visitation for Chesterfield County. J.C. was with us almost 7 years and has grown our Community Relations Department as well as our Foundation through the RVA Sports Awards program as well as other programs. We are advertising the positions of Vice President of Community Relations and Manager of Accounting and hope to have candidates in place soon.

Mr. Berry reported that Richmond Region Tourism filed for and received Employee Tax Retention Credits in the amount of \$360,000. The financials through February were reviewed and Mr. Berry reported that expenses are well within budget. The market trends through March were reviewed and the REVPAR for March was the highest on record. The overall tax revenue collections are 16% ahead for the fiscal year.

B. **MOTION** Governance Committee Update: Ms. Bridgette Bywater, committee chair, presented the following proposed slate of officers:

# Proposed Slate of Officers for FY24 & FY25:

The Governance committee recommended the adoption of the slate of officers, effective July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2025. Mr. Brian Anderson made the motion, seconded by Mr. Pat Collins to approve the slate of officers. The motion passed.

The Governance Committee has also worked with legal counsel and staff to propose edits to the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. The red-lined documents were distributed for review and the summary points include:

- Remove ChamberRVA from Class A Membership (not contributing monetarily)
- Create Ex Officio seat for ChamberRVA
- Create Ex Officio seat for TID Chair or Vice Chair of the TID Governance Committee of the board
- Remove Richmond Region Hospitality Association Seat and Rename to Hotel Seat and put it into the section of appointed by the RRT Board seats

The vote on the Articles and Bylaws will be held at the July 13<sup>th</sup> Board of Directors meeting and attendance is encouraged since 2/3rds of the directors will need to be in attendance.

C. **MOTION** <u>Tourism Improvement District (TID) Update</u>: Ms. Katherine O'Donnell, Executive Vice President, updated the board on the progress of the TID. The ordinance has passed in all jurisdictions except for the City of Richmond and City of Colonial Heights. The City is expected to vote in June and Colonial Heights in the fall. A webinar will be held on June 6<sup>th</sup> to address the fee ordinance and remittance procedures with the hotels.

The TID Governance Policy was presented. The initial members of the committee will be appointed by the RRT Board of Directors. Two-thirds of the committee members shall represent owners of a lodging business paying a TID fee with 41-149 rooms; one-third of the committee members shall represent owners of a lodging business paying a TID fee with 150 rooms or more. No one lodging business ownership shall hold more than three seats on the committee. The RRT Board chair and RRT President & CEO will have non-voting seats on the committee. The policy was reviewed and recommended for adoption. Mr. Perry Miller made a motion to adopt the policy, seconded by Ms. Lisa Sims. The vote passed. The initial committee members are as follows and was approved by motion from Mr. Pat Collins, seconded by Mr. Perry Miller. The vote passed.

D. <u>Sports Tourism Strategic Plan Updates</u>: Ms. Jerrine Lee, Vice President of Sales, updated the board regarding the Sports Tourism Strategic Plan Updates. In 2019, Richmond Region Tourism contracted Huddle Up Group (HUG) to conduct a Sports Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan provided (3) primary recommendations and (3) secondary recommendations with action items for the Richmond region to remain competitive as a premier sports tourism destination. The recommendations were distributed to the board and reviewed in length. RRT has contracted with Collective Best to help move several of the recommendations

forward. We are well underway with phase one of our partnership around the region-wide venue master plan and gap analysis and should have this finalized before June 30, 2023. Phase two will be the creation and implementation of a sports tourism advisory group to be finalized by December 31, 2023.

## III. OLD BUSINESS & WRAP-UP:

A. <u>Annual Meeting & Awards Breakfast Recap</u>: Ms. Tamera Harris, Director of Community Relations, gave a brief recap of the May 11<sup>th</sup> Awards and Annual Meeting that was held at the Greater Richmond Convention Center. The event celebrated Richmond Region Tourism's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary and the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Convention Center. The Love, RVA video series was also debuted and launched at the event.

Ms. Katherine O'Donnell showed the 60 second Inspiration Campaign video that will launch June 1st. This marks a historic opportunity for us to invest more than double our normal budget for one marketing campaign, thanks to the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding given to our jurisdictions to drive back visitation following the Covid-19 pandemic. The campaign, "Speaks for Itself" is a first-of-its-kind campaign for the Richmond Region using a sound-focused ASMR video approach centered around the authentic character of our destination. Our goal was to differentiate this campaign from others in our industry and to be flexible enough for our stakeholders to incorporate it into their marketing efforts. The launch includes:

- 15- and 30-second video ads on connected TV
- Digital display ads
- Out-of-Home digital billboards
- National & local press releases
- Social media posts
- Email to partners with a link to an online toolkit

In the coming weeks, we also will be advertising reels on Instagram, created by local influencers who will "speak for themselves" about their love of the region and some of their favorite locations. The campaign was developed by Padilla, a Richmond-based creative agency, that was selected by Richmond Region Tourism in partnership with ChamberRVA and the Greater Richmond Partnership.

Recognition of the Chair: Ms. Angela Kelly-Wiecek, along with the help of Mr. Jack Berry, honored outgoing chair, Dan Schmitt for his service as Chairman of the Board of Directors from January 2020 June 2023. Mr. Schmitt was presented with a memory book and gavel plaque and the board acknowledged him for his outstanding service to the community while serving the Richmond Region Tourism Board of Directors as Chairman.
