Major Openings, Exhibitions, Anniversaries

[Traveling Bricks: An Exhibition Made of LEGO® Bricks](#) | Virginia Museum of History & Culture |

A collection of interactive Holocaust survivor biographies developed by USC Shoah Foundation. Using the innovative tool of AI technology, this exhibit enables museum visitors to engage in conversations with pre-recorded video images of Holocaust survivors and other witnesses to genocide including Halina Zimm, a resident of Richmond.

Featuring 20 of the world's most innovative skyscrapers built using half a million bricks by one of only twelve LEGO®-certified professionals worldwide, this exhibition showcases the science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) involved in architecture and design. Get inspired and show off your master builder skills in the interactive construction area stocked with 200,000 loose LEGO® bricks.

[Virginia's Missing in Action: The Search Continues](#) | Virginia War Memorial | Opening September 19, 2025

The Virginia War Memorial will unveil its newest exhibit on National POW/MIA Recognition Day (the third Friday in September). The exhibit will be presented on behalf of the surviving family members of the more than 1,200 Virginia Veterans who are still missing in action (MIA) and on behalf of the more than 700,000 veterans who call Virginia home. The exhibit will explore the scientific process behind searching for and recovering the remains of those individuals by the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA).

[Fall Line Trail](#) | In Progress

The Fall Line Trail is a 43-mile paved, multi-use trail that promises to transform the region for active transportation, connecting communities, and economic development. Named after the geographic feature on which the Richmond Region sits, the trail will traverse seven localities in a region of 1.3 million people.

Arts, History, and Culture

[The Impending Crisis](#) | American Civil War Museum | Now Open

Take a deeper look into the events, individuals, and topics that led to the division of the United States on the verge of civil war. Explore multiple perspectives and view exclusive artifacts from this period in our nation's history. Part of a multi-year series of exhibitions.

[Virtual Reality Tour](#) | Wilton House Museum | Now Open

Experience a virtual recreation of Wilton's original property from the 1780s. Using Quest 3 VR headsets, visitors can tour the original property and outbuildings while learning about the land, buildings, and tobacco cultivation.

[Maymont Mansion Renovations](#) | Ongoing

The Maymont Mansion is closed in preparation for the biggest preservation project in its history, including a fresh new red slate roof and upgraded climate control system. The Robins Nature Center, the Stone Barn Welcome Center, and the 100-acre park, including historic gardens, farm animals, and rescued Virginia wildlife, remain open for visitors.

[A Prescription for Change: Black Voices Shaping Healthcare in Virginia](#) | Black History Museum & Cultural Center of Virginia | Now – March 15, 2025

Learn about the tremendous contributions that Black healthcare workers have made to the field of medicine, improving patient outcomes for generations beyond their own, especially in predominantly Black communities where equitable access to healthcare is still a challenge.

[A Better Life for Their Children](#) | Virginia Museum of History & Culture | Now – April 20, 2025

Julius Rosenwald and Booker T. Washington joined forces to create schools throughout the nation for Black children who had no access to publicly funded education, ultimately building thousands of schools, shops, and teachers' homes across 15 Southern states. Learn about the Rosenwald Schools program through photographs of interiors and exteriors, schools restored and yet-to-be-restored, and portraits of people with compelling connections to these schools.

[Turning Points: Richmond in the 1890s](#) | The Valentine | Now – February 2, 2025

This exhibition details the tensions that arose as a new generation took over Richmond's segregated economic, municipal, social, and cultural institutions thirty years after the Civil War – and how the effects of this decade can still be felt today.

[American, Born Hungary: The Hungarian American Photographic Legacy](#) | Virginia Museum of Fine Arts | October 5, 2024 – January 26, 2025

This exhibition of more than 170 photographs plus related ephemera will examine the works of Hungarian-born American artists and their influence on photography since the early 20th century.

Encounter the everyday lives and ordinary places captured in evocative photos that contemplate the region's central role in shaping American history and identity and its critical impact on the development of photography.

This exhibition explores the lives of free Black Virginians from the arrival of the first captive Africans in 1619 to the abolition of slavery in 1865.

Event concludes with a dramatic re-enactment of Mr. Henry's ride off to Richmond and St. John's Church to secure his place in history.

Trail of the Enslaved: The City of Richmond plans to commission a 12-foot-tall bronze sculpture on the banks of the James River to mark the spot where enslaved people arrived. The name of the trail (formerly known as the Richmond Slave Trail) is also being updated.

Expected completion: TBD
