

The national passenger-rail operator Amtrak stops at four metro-region stations. Rail service is located just minutes from interstates 95 and 64 at 7519 Staples Mill Road, and downtown at Main Street Station, 1500 E. Main St. Amtrak also has a station in Ashland at 112 N. Railroad Ave. and in Colonial Heights at 3516 South St. Stations are wheelchairaccessible, and baggage service is available. GETTING TOWN

Richmond is a drivable city with bike lanes that allow for safe pedaling. Here's what the region offers to assist with navigation.

RVA is within a day's drive of half of the U.S. population courtesy of I-95 and I-64, the major corridors through the area. And once you're here, locals tout that no matter where you are in the region, you're only 15 to 20 minutes away from anywhere you'd like to go. There are multiple vehicle rental agencies throughout the metro area, including eight at Richmond International Airport.

ARRIVE IN STYLE

James River Transportation (jamesrivertrans.com) provides charter bus trips and service to and from Richmond International Airport. Service is also available from other area companies. See flyrichmond. com/ground-transportation for more information.

BE CHAUFFEURED

Taxi service is available throughout the region from multiple providers. Rideshare services include Uber and Lyft. Visit uber.com and lyft.com for details.

RIDE LIKE A LOCAL

The Bus Rapid Transit system, the Greater Richmond Transit Co. (GRTC) Pulse, travels a 7.6-mile route along Broad Street connecting Willow Lawn in Henrico County to Rocketts Landing in Richmond. Tickets can be purchased at vending machines located at the 14 platform stops or through the GRTC mobile app. GRTC also offers bus routes in the city, the neighboring county of Henrico and parts of Chesterfield County. Visit ridegrtc.com for bus routes, schedules and updated safety measures.


SCOOT THE STREET

The city has fleets of Bird and Lime electric scooters. They are available to rent via each company's app. Visit bird.co and li.me for details.

WELCOME TO THE

SETTING UNLIKE ANY OTHER

The James River flows through the Richmond Region, the only site in the country offering Class III and IV rapids in an urban environment. Multiple local water sports companies offer whitewater rafting, kayaking and stand-up paddleboarding (SUP) excursions, including RVA Paddlesports (rvapaddlesports. com) and Riverside Outfitters (riversideoutfitters.com). **Crosswind Paddleboarding** (crosswindpaddle.com) provides tours and lessons in SUP for all skill levels at Robious Landing Park (chesterfield.gov). Nonprofit Beyond **Boundaries** (beyondboundariesrva.org) hosts whitewater rafting, kayaking and fishing adventures for participants with disabilities, veterans and at-risk youth. Waterfront RVA (sites.google.com/view/waterfrontrva) is a walk-up canoe and kayak rental outpost available seasonally near Brown's Island (brownsisland.com). Embark on a pontoon pedal boat journey with a brew via Paddle Club RVA (seasuitecruises.com). Enjoy a narrated tour of Richmond's historic Canal Walk during Riverfront Canal Cruises (venturerichmond.com). There are several ways to spot the endangered Atlantic sturgeon as they breach the water during their spawning migration through the region in September, including on a **Discover the James** (discoverthejames.com) tour and **James** River Association (thejamesriver.org) pontoon boat trip. Plus, catch the resident flora and fauna along the **Appomattox River** in Colonial Heights, a major tributary to the James; the Chickahominy River flowing through the region's counties of Hanover, Henrico, New Kent and the city of Richmond; and the **Pamunkey River**, which locally borders Hanover and New Kent counties. DISCOVER UNIQUE EXPERIENCES AROUND EVERY CORNER

One of the most historic cities in the country, Richmond has evolved into a world-class destination with plenty of new stories to tell. The Richmond Region offers visitors the best of both past and present. Here, historic streets pulse with progress. Beautiful scenery runs right through the urban core. International cuisine is served with Southern hospitality, and time-honored traditions blend with innovative attractions. Whether you're visiting for the first time or rediscovering the city, you'll experience a dynamic destination that's authentic, warm and wonderfully unique. Here is a sampling of experiences you'll find only in RVA.



365 DAYS OF ART

Enjoy free admission yearround to the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, home to an impressive collection that spans from a 4,000-year-old mummy to notable modern art. Don't miss the country's largest public collection of Fabergé and Russian decorative arts, and the impressive sculpture garden including Dale Chihuly's "Red Reeds," and Kehinde Wiley's stirring "Rumors of War" statue. vmfa.museum



Perched high above roaring river rapids and downtown Richmond, Hollywood Cemetery is 135 acres of natural and architectural beauty. Embark on a selfguided drive or one of several guided tour options and see the final resting places of two U.S. presidents and other notables, including six Virginia governors and two Supreme Court justices. hollywoodcemetery.org



THE STORY OF RICHMOND

Learn the significance of Richmond's diverse history at The Valentine. See 400 years of papers, textiles and artifacts, including the graffitied Jefferson Davis statue (on Ioan until June 2023 from the Black History Museum & Cultural Center of Virginia), which was toppled by protesters along Monument Avenue in 2020. thevalentine.org

QUOTH THE RAVEN, 'NEVERMORE'

Tap, tap, tap on the chamber door of The Poe Museum, honoring the renowned dark poet Edgar Allan Poe, who was raised in Richmond. Opened in 1922, the museum is celebrating its centennial in the Old Stone House, the oldest still-standing residential structure in the city (estimated to be built in 1737). Check out special exhibits, two resident black cats and UnHappy Hours in the Enchanted Garden (which incorporates design elements from Poe's life and writings). poemuseum.org



DISGUSTINGLY DELICIOUS

Power up with creative vegan fare and heavy metal music at **GWARbar**, recently highlighted in Southern Living's "Where to Eat in Richmond, Virginia, Right Now." It was opened by Richmond's own long-performing GWAR band, the internationally renowned group that's famous for elaborate, grotesque costumes and over-the-top performances that have inspired comic books, tabletop games and a documentary. With crave-worthy homemade Twinkies and fake blood splatters on the wall, GWARbar is anything but ordinary. gwarbar.com



STEP INTO HISTORY

Walk in the footsteps of an estimated more than 350,000 enslaved Africans on the Richmond Slave Trail. Beginning at the Manchester docks, where enslaved Africans arrived, and stretching to Shockoe Bottom, where they were bought and sold, the trail highlights a tragic history. A new purposeful entrance is being constructed and will open early this year, better orienting visitors with what they're about to experience. Elegba Folklore Society (efsinc.org) offers a guided tour. A digital trail map for self-guided tours is available on the website. rva.gov/media/21606

Topping the list of finance blog Insider Monkey's "10 Most Gay Friendly Cities in that celebrates diversity and inclusivity. OutRVA (outrva.com) is a resource for discovering the region's LGBTQ events, attractions and venues. It serves as a guide to places such as Richmond Triangle Players (rtriangle.org), an internationally acclaimed community theater celebrating its 30th season. The only performing-arts company of its kind in the Mid-Atlantic. RTP showcases the works of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender communities that warm the heart, educate the mind and entertain the spirit.





CYCLISTS START HERE

Bike from Richmond through Henrico County and to Williamsburg on the scenic Virginia Capital Trail. The paved pedestrian and cycling trail meanders more than 50 miles along the James River, over wetlands and through picturesque vistas. Bike rentals and repairs, restaurants, picnic areas, historic attractions, lodging and more are available along the trail. virginiacapitaltrail.org



DINNER AND A SHOW

Catch a live performance at Swift Creek Mill Theatre, housed in one of the country's oldest gristmills dating back to 1663. The active South Chesterfield community theater presents a delightful season of cabarets, musicals, concerts and plays, as well as monthly wine dinners and special events. Dining is also available prior to all Main Stage performances, the menus of which take inspiration from the corresponding show. swiftcreekmill.com

DOWN ON THE FARM

At the Keystone Truck & Tractor Museum in Colonial Heights, step back in time and experience the last century of life on the farm with antique tractors and other farm equipment. This massive collection includes hundreds of farm tractors that date back to 1917 through 1960. Rare machines include the 1938 UDLX Minneapolis-Moline Comfortractor (there are only 25 known working today) and a Graham-Bradley which was sold by Sears, Roebuck and Co. Keystone also has a range of classic cars and vintage memorabilia. keystonetractorworks.com



OUTSTANDING OFFERINGS

Experience authentic Szechuan cooking at one of Peter Chang's local outposts in Short Pump and Scott's Addition. The former chef at the Chinese Embassy in Washington, D.C., was named a prestigious 2022 James Beard finalist for "Outstanding Chef" nationwide. peterchangrestaurant.com

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Look toward the heavens from Historic Polegreen Church, an open-air structural interpretation of the original 1747 building in Hanover County. This was one of the first non-Anglican churches in America, and the teachings at Polegreen Church inspired Patrick Henry's passion for religious freedom and liberty from the Church of England. historic polegreen church.org



THE NEW WORLD

The self-guided New Kent **County Captain John Smith Driving Tour** allows you to trace the steps of the famous English explorer and Jamestown founder. After being captured by members of the Powhatan Chiefdom, Smith famously attributed the chief's daughter Pocahontas with saving his life. A historical marker located along East Williamsburg Road notes where he was abducted, eventually leading to a formal alliance with Chief Powhatan. newkent.net/ historysmith.html



Paddle the Lagoon Water Trail at the Dutch Gap **Conservation Area on** the scenic James River in Chesterfield County. Spot wildlife and explore "The Gravevard" of sunken barges leftover from the mining industry a century ago. chesterfield.gov/ dutchgap



NOW PLAYING

See a first-run movie, a classic film or a concert at the Ashland Theatre in charming downtown Ashland. The historic 1948 venue reopened in 2019 after extensive renovations to restore its original grandeur. ashlandtheatre.org





VINO ESPECIALIDAD

Savor delectable tapas at Restaurant Adarra, a Europeanstyle cafe in downtown's Jackson Ward neighborhood. This Spanish-inspired restaurant was named one of Wine Enthusiast's "50 Wine Restaurants We Love," noting the large selection and staff knowledge of organic, biodynamic wines. restaurantadarra.com

Touted by travel experts like Fodor's and Matador Network, Richmond is quickly becoming a top destination to experience African American culture. The year-round tourism program BLK RVA (visitblkrva. com) celebrates the Black cultural experience in the region, connecting people with a plethora of attractions, award-winning restaurants and thriving Black businesses. Learn about historic sites that have shaped Richmond, such as the Jackson Ward neighborhood, which holds the nickname "Black Wall Street" thanks to trailblazers like Maggie L. Walker, the nation's first African American female bank founder and president, whose residence is open for tours (nps.gov/mawa). The nonprofit JXN **Project** (thejxnproject.org) works to preserve the history of Jackson Ward through information and events.



MORE THAN 30 CRAFT BREWERIES, CIDERIES AND MEADERIES AWAIT

The Richmond Region is a libation destination with global recognition, recently topping VinePair's list of "The World's Top 10 Beer Destinations" and landing on Tripadvisor's "6 East Coast Cities With Dynamic Craft Beer Scenes." The Richmond Beer Trail is your guide to navigating what the area offers with digital and printable maps available at richmondbeertrail.com. Read on to discover a few places along the trail.

BREW WITH A VIEW The region's breweries offer sips with atmosphere



Richmond's flagship IPA, Falcon Smash, can now be enjoyed at the Midlothian taproom of **TRIPLE CROSSING BEER** (triplecrossing. com). The recently opened location abuts the lake at Winterfield Crossing, a modern, mixed-use village with a lighted pathway and walking lanes set among dining and shopping.

Hear locomotives whistle outside **ORIGIN BEER LAB** (originbeer lab.com), the research and development pilot brewery of Center of the Universe Brewing Co. Origin brews limited-production, ambient-yeast beers unavailable anywhere else, right by the train tracks in historic downtown Ashland.

LEGEND BREWING CO.

(legendbrewing.com) is the oldest operating brewpub in the commonwealth, with James River vistas and downtown skyline views. Dusk on Legend's water-adjacent patio is magical: Watch the River City transition from water sports to dining mode.

Near The Diamond baseball stadium, the dog-friendly patio at **HARDYWOOD PARK CRAFT BREWERY** (hardywood.com) hums with live music. Glowing fire pits and New York-style pizzas add to the pleasure of their seasonal saison, stout and Belgian beers made from Virginia fruit.



Seeking the farm brewery experience? Head to TALLEYSVILLE **BREWING CO.** (newkent winery.com/talleysvillebrewing-company), where the verdant beer garden backs up to rural New Kent County. This offspring of New Kent Winery offers free ranging for the kids, plus wine, beer, food trucks and trivia nights.

FUNKHAÜST CAFÉ

VERY SPECIAL ETERNAL SLUMBER (theveilbrewing.com/ rva-fc) The Veil Brewing Co's

casual taproom at its barrel-aging facility offers this decadent imperial stout. With rich vibes of banana bread and fruit cake, this brew is aged in a blend of bourbon, cognac and Laird's apple brandy barrels, conditioned on raw and toasted coconut and additional ingredients.



STRANGEWAYS BREWING ÜBERLIN BERLINER WEISSE

The flagship gose of Chesterfield County's first craft brewery uses local cucumbers for an easy-drinking beverage with a flavor evocative of watermelon candy. Pink Himalayan salt and hibiscus add to this twist on a classic style.


SIP CIDER

Virginia apples are the stars of these creative fermentations

Cider apples are more tannic and bitter than table fruit, earning them the nickname "spitters." You'll want to sample, not spit, the refreshing and innovative tipples at Buskey Cider (buskeycider.com) in the Scott's Addition neighborhood. The cidery releases a new quaff bimonthly, ranging from dry to sweeter options, in its former train car turned tasting room. The Victorian-style tasting room of Bryant's Dry Cider & Brewery (bryantscider.com) in historic Shockoe Bottom is a portal to cider cocktails in an 1850s storefront. Blue Bee Cider (bluebeecider.com) focuses on heritage apples from a restored 1940s stable in Scott's Addition.

IMBIBE MEAD

The historic honey and water beverage updated for the modern palate

Black Heath Meadery (blackheathmeadery.com) netted multiple gold medals in the 2022 Virginia Governor's Cup. Blue Angel, made from Pink Lady apples and Virginia honey, also struck gold in the international Mazer Cup. Variety rules at Funktastic Meads (funktasticmeads.com), where a clean, full-strength mead base ages blueberries, raspberries, blackberries and strawberries, creating the sweet Ballroom Blitz mead — which salutes both the movie "Wayne's World" and the iconic glam-rock band Sweet. Three Leg Run (threelegrun.com) refers not only to the beer, wine and mead made at this Chester fermentation station, but also to the gait of the owners' beloved dog. Find multiple taps of both beer and their fruit-infused mead.

SCOOP THERE I

CREATIVE CONES FROM AROUND THE RICHMOND REGION

From dairy-free gelato to ice cream sandwiches, RVA is a hub for this frozen treat. Chill out at Ruby Scoops with handmade ice cream from Rabia Kamara, who won the Food Network show "Ben & Jerry's: Clash of the Cones" or indulge in a weekly special at Bev's Homemade Ice Cream which was recognized by online magazine Mental Floss as one of the "Best Ice Cream Shops in All 50 States." Whether cup or cone, check out these local spots for sweet satisfaction.



ROASTED PINEAPPLE ROSEMARY SORBET

RUBY SCOOPS

(rubyscoops.com) When Ruby Scoops founder and co-owner Rabia "Ruby" Kamara had extra pineapple and herbs on hand, she put on her cool thinking cap and hit the kitchen. Enter roasted pineapple and rosemary sorbet, a tantalizing, balanced and refreshing warm-weather treat that seesaws between tropical and herbaceous notes.



HAZELNUT GELATO DELUCA GELATO

(delucagelato.com) The family-run DeLuca Gelato makes its own pasteurized hazelnut gelato - or nocciola in Italian. Owner Nick DeLuca roasts the filberts before grinding them into a paste which is then introduced to a milk base just before freezing, resulting in a simple Italian classic.



JUST ASK GELATI CELESTI

(gelatiicecream.com) Developed in 1995, Just Ask starts with white chocolate ice cream that is then loaded with Oreo chunks and crunchy frozen peanut butter. "Last year, we used 13,600 pounds of white chocolate, 4,800 pounds of peanut butter and 156,000 Oreo cookies to make Just Ask," says Gelati Celesti Marketing Manager Heidi LaSalata. "This is one of the most challenging flavors."



ESPRESSO OREO BEV'S HOMEMADE ICE CREAM

(hevshomemade icecream.com) It was owner Beverly Mazursky's son who first inspired Bev's uber-popular Espresso Oreo flavor in her original shop in Lenox, Massachusetts, pouring a shot of freshly brewed espresso over a cup of chocolate ice cream. That impromptu affogato got her thinking that a coffee and Oreo pairing would be a hit, and she was right.

Track down frozen treats across the Region

PINEAPPLE DOLE WHIP CHARM SCHOOL

(charmschoolrva.com) Charm School co-owners Meryl Hillerson and Alex Zavaleta share an affection for Dole Whip, the pineapple-flavored soft serve sold at Disney's theme parks. "When we go to Disneyland, it's the first place you'll find either one of us," Hillerson says. Initially bonding over their adoration for the treat, the duo now have an ice cream shop and wholesale production space under their belts.



STRAWBERRY WITH CANDIED FENNEL SEED **SPOTTY DOG**

(spottydogicecream.com) An experimental ice cream test kitchen with a recently opened brick-and-mortar, Spotty Dog Ice Cream is led by Alex Miller and Hannah Sager. Their New England-style strawberry ice cream — more dense and slightly tacky - is flecked with crunchy, anise-flavored candied fennel seeds reminiscent of the chocolate candy bits topping Little Debbie Cosmic Brownies.

The Richmond Region has something to offer visitors of all ages, no matter the season. From museums that stimulate children's curiosity to beautiful parks and gardens with plenty of space to frolic, from amusement parks to opportunities for old-fashioned fun, there are countless ways to make family memories all year long.



SUMMER

The Metro Richmond Zoo (metrorichmondzoo.com) is home to more than 2,000 animals, from Asiatic bears to zebras, and is one of the few places in the country where you can watch baby cheetahs — 19 cubs were born there last year. After observing the animals, visit Treetop Zoofari (treetopzoofari.com), an adventure park with more than 3,000 feet of zip lines, including a 600-foot line over the zoo's lake. For more thrills, visit Kings Dominion (kingsdominion.com), which boasts more than 60 rides including 13 roller coasters — don't miss Tumbili, Virginia's first 4D spin coaster — and Planet Snoopy for tamer adventures. Cool down at Soak City, Kings Dominion's 20-acre water park with over two dozen slides and a wave pool. It's all included in the admission price. At Pocahontas State Park (dcr.virginia.gov/state-parks/pocahontas) in Chesterfield County (pictured on cover), choose from more than 90 miles of trails for hiking and biking, three lakes for boating and fishing, tent campsites and cabins, an aquatic center with a toddler pool and water slides, and a 2,000-seat amphitheater that hosts the Pocahontas Premieres concert series.






FALL

It's not fall without a visit to the pumpkin patch, and **Ashland Berry Farm** (ashlandberryfarm.com) is the place to be once the temperatures start to drop. Take a hayride out to the fields and try the "all you can carry" pumpkin challenge to take home all the pumpkins your arms can hold, then enjoy a doughnut and kids' activities during the weekend. "Terror on the Farm" is a haunted evening attraction that's fun for teens and adults. In Colonial Heights, the **Keystone Truck & Tractor Museum** (keystonetractorworks.com) offers a look into agricultural heritage, with restored antique farm tractors, trucks, cars and more. Head to **Maymont** (maymont.org), Richmond's beautiful 100-acre Victorian estate and park, when it transforms at sunset for a few weeks each fall during the Garden Glow event. Colorful lights illuminate the park's historic architecture and gardens.

WINTER

The Dominon Energy GardenFest of Lights at **Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden** (*lewisginter.org*) is a can't-miss attraction each year from late November through early January. For many, it's a family tradition to take in the beautiful displays featuring millions of twinkling lights. A 20-foot Christmas tree, model train displays, a bonfire, hot chocolate and s'mores make for a memorable, cozy evening. When it's too cold to spend time outside, head indoors to enjoy **The Circuit** (*thecircuitarcadebar.com*), an arcade bar in the popular Scott's Addition neighborhood where the kids will enjoy playing more than 80 retro and modern video games and pinball machines along with classic Skee-Ball and other games. Get there early — it's 21 and over after 9 p.m. Sunday-Thursday, and after 7 p.m. Friday and Saturday. Midlothian's **Uptown Alley** (*uptownalleyrichmond.com*) is a luxe, two-story venue where the whole family can compete on 38 state-of-the-art bowling lanes. It also has an arcade and a virtual reality arena for hours of family fun.



SPORTING EXPERIENC

ROOT FOR THE HOME TEAM OR TRY YOUR OWN HAND AT A **MULTITUDE OF ACTIVE PURSUITS**

Thrilling fast-paced stock cars, rowdy soccer matches and spirited college basketball games draw crowds in RVA. The atmosphere is electric, where passionate fans cheer on their favorite sports teams. Participating in recreational athletics lets you experience your favorite physical activities firsthand, or try something new. Read on to learn more about area spectator sports and activities that allow you to join the fun.

WATCH IT

RICHMOND KICKERS

Join the River City Red Army as they jump, cheer and wave flags for the Richmond Kickers United Soccer League (USL) League One team (richmondkickers.com). These hardcore fans bring all the passion of European football (soccer in the U.S.) to Richmond's City Stadium. Entering its 31st season, the Kickers are the longest, continuously operating professional soccer club in the country. The nonprofit Richmond Kickers Youth Soccer Club provides opportunities for kids of all abilities to participate in the sport.



RICHMOND RACEWAY

action when America's Premier Short Track hosts the NASCAR Cup and Xfinity Series races April 1-2 and July 29-30. The regular season champion of the Craftsman Truck Series will be named July 29. There's something for everyone at Richmond Raceway (richmondraceway.com), with entertainment, food and parties during race weekends. A FanGrounds pass grants access to the infield, where you can see the team garages, purchase concessions and enjoy prerace ceremonies.



COLLEGE ATHLETICS

The Richmond Region offers many opportunities to enjoy college sports. Virginia Commonwealth University's NCAA Division I basketball teams inspire dedicated fans of the Rams at the university's Stuart C. Siegel Center (vcuathletics.com). See local basketball rivals Virginia Union University (vuusports.com) and Virginia State University (govsutrojans.com) go head-to-head every January during the popular Freedom Classic Festival. The **University of Richmond Spiders** NCAA Division I football team (richmondspiders.com) and Randolph-Macon College Yellow Jackets NCAA Division III football team (rmcathletics. com) create opportunities to watch the sport in the region.

COLONIAL DOWNS

Catch live thoroughbred horse racing at Colonial Downs (colonialdowns. com/racing) during the summer season. The New Kent County site is home to two state-of-the-art tracks, including the Secretariat Turf Course, the country's widest grass racing surface, and at 1 1/4 miles, the dirt track is the second largest in the U.S. For year-round entertainment, check out the rotating roster of live music and performers. Try your luck on one of Rosie's Gaming Emporium's 600 historical horse racing betting machines.

RICHMOND FLYING SQUIRRELS

A Double-A minor-league baseball team, the Richmond Flying Squirrels (squirrelsbaseball. com) host about 70 home games annually at The Diamond stadium. Fun for the entire family, theme nights, merchandise giveaways and spectacular fireworks make seeing the Flying Squirrels more than just a baseball game. Fan-favorite mascots Nutzy and Nutasha keep the crowd energized. The 2023 season opens April 7, when the Flying Squirrels take on the Reading Fightin Phils at The Diamond.



DO IT

SKATE PARKS

Don your rollerblades and grab your skateboards to shred at Richmond's newest skate park at Southside Community Center (rva.gov/parksrecreation). The concrete site features halfpipes, handrails and plenty of ramps. Head to Pole Green Park (hanovercounty.gov/247/Pole-Green-Park), where multipurpose fields and playgrounds can be found near a fenced-in skate park. Bicycles and scooters are also welcome at the Laurel Recreation Area & Skate Park (henrico. us/rec/places/laurel) which features rails, ramps and a bowl.

TAI CHI AND YOGA

To center yourself with movement and meditation, head to Maymont (maymont.org), where Wilson Pitts has led free tai chi classes seasonally on Saturday mornings for the past 40 years. Though he has his regulars, beginners are always welcome. For updates, visit the Friends of Tai Chi in Maymont Park Facebook group. On select Saturday mornings during the Dorey Park Farmers Market (doreyparkfarmersmarket.org), join Michelle Lee Landon of One Drop Yoga (onedropyoga.com) for pay-what-you-can community yoga.

PICKLEBALL

The fastest-growing sport in the U.S., pickleball — a tennis/pingpong hybrid — has also taken the Richmond Region by storm. Play at six recently opened courts at the **Broad Rock Sports Complex (rva.gov/** parks-recreation). Pouncey Tract Park (henrico.us/rec) has 12 courts and due to demand, is planning to start building 12 more this summer. In fall 2022, construction began on four new pickleball courts at Pine Fork Park (co.newkent.state.va.us). And clubs like the Pickleball Club of Chesterfield County (chesterfieldpickle ball.club) and RVA Pickle-ball (rvapickleball.com) foster the sport in the region.

GOLF

Tee off at one of several public golf courses and driving ranges in the region. A taste of Ireland, the Mike Strantz-designed Irish-links-style course at Royal New Kent Golf Club (royalnewkent.com) offers 18 holes of creative bunkers, hand-stacked rock walls and grassy knolls. In Chesterfield County, Magnolia Green Golf Club (magnoliagreengolfclub. com) features a Nicklaus Design in association with Tom Clark lavout. The 18-hole course offers challenges for all skill levels.

YOUTH SPORTS

The Richmond Region is a destination for championship tournaments held year-round. From softball to lacrosse, there are a multitude of youth sports leagues. Nonprofits such as SwimRVA (swimrichmond.org), Richmond Strikers (richmondstrikers.com) soccer and the Richmond Tennis Association (richmondtennis.org) support accessibility for kids. And sports complexes including the Sports Center of Richmond (scorrichmond.com), River City Sportsplex (rivercitysportsplex.com) and the under-construction indoor facility at Virginia Center Commons (expected to be completed fall 2023), provide opportunities for small recreational gatherings and huge tournaments alike.

BIKING

Whether setting off on a trail or joining a guided tour, the

Richmond area is bicycle-friendly. Bike Walk RVA (sportsbackers.org/program/ bike-walk-rva) is an initiative of Sports Backers advocating for safe places for cyclists of all abilities. See their bikeways map at bit.ly/RVABikewaysMap. Explore Richmond's street art, historic sites and the Virginia Capital Trail (virginiacapitaltrail.org) on a guided Basket & Bike (basketandbike.com) tour. For a scenic ride that passes through wetlands, head to the Colonial **Heights Appomattox River Trail** (colonialheightsva.gov).



ALL ACCESS

VISITABLE IS CREATING A MORE WELCOMING EXPERIENCE FOR **VISITORS WITH DISABILITIES**

Founded by Joe Jamison in Charlottesville in 2019, VisitAble has expanded into the Richmond Region, working to provide training for institutions to create a better experience for people of all abilities. Jamison's father has a mobility disability, and he took note of the difficulties his father faced in obtaining accessibility information combined with a lack of etiquette from employees while visiting different businesses and attractions. Armed with these experiences, Jamison worked to develop comprehensive certification programs focusing on inclusion and experience, going beyond compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). A SAMPLING OF VISITABLE ADVOCATE+ **CERTIFIED LOCATIONS**

HISTORIC ST. JOHN'S CHURCH

The site of Patrick Henry's "Give me liberty or give me death" speech, Historic St. John's Church reenacts the famous Second Virginia Convention of March 1775 every Sunday during the summer (and on a few select dates yearround). The site is praised for its staff cultivating a welcoming environment for guests and offering assistance such as opening and closing doors and guiding visitors to their viewing spot. visitable.org/businesses/Historic-St.-John's-Church

HENRICUS HISTORICAL PARK

The site of the second successful English settlement in the New World (the Citie of Henricus, which was established in 1611), this outdoor living-history museum explores Colonial times and the culture of the Powhatan Indians in the Arrohateck Village. Henricus has made upgrades including offering a wheelchair and a walker to help enhance mobility; earplugs for musket firing and historic reenactments (or simply to use as a sensory-friendly option); lightweight cups, lids, and straws for consuming beverages on-site; and whiteboards and markers for an alternative communication option. visitable.org/locations/henricus-historical-park

RIVER CITY SPORTSPLEX

A 115-acre multisport complex, River City Sportsplex features 12 synthetic-turf athletic fields, one of the largest collections in the country. The facility provides golf carts to assist with transportation between different fields upon request and can also store some mobility devices during transport. visitable.org/locations/ river-city-sportsplex

Q&A WITH JOE JAMISON

The VisitAble founder talks about improving the visitor experience for everyone

Why did you create VisitAble?

Joe Jamison: My father has used a wheelchair for my entire life. I noticed it was extremely difficult to see if a place was accessible so my dad and my family could go somewhere, much less knowing if my dad would be treated with dignity and respect. I noticed that sometimes he wasn't treated the same as my family. We may go to a restaurant, for example, and the host or hostess would talk to me the whole time and not necessarily acknowledge his presence. So with VisitAble, we're really trying to bridge this gap I saw between minimal ADA compliance and inclusion for people with disabilities by really trying to create a more positive approach for entities to champion disability inclusion.

What does it mean to be certified by VisitAble?

Jamison: Certification means training, awareness and transparency. It indicates that an entity is working towards disability inclusion and accessibility, and then they're hopefully making that a priority in longterm plans and policies and practices. If certification only indicated accessibility, then we wouldn't be working with the

places who need it the most. Our goal is to partner with potential locations to help them better the user experience for visitors of all abilities.

What impact do you hope VisitAble has on tourism?

Jamison: I hope we can help accelerate accessible tourism and be able to create more information so people can make more informed decisions about where they want to visit, and not only that, but also help improve accessibility of different destinations.

PETS ARE WE

THE RICHMOND REGION PROVIDES HOSPITALITY FOR FURRY FRIENDS

Don't leave Fido at home: RVA is a pet-friendly destination offering all the treats and amenities that will keep your four-legged friend's tail wagging. Whether you want to sit, stay or heel, the region is packed with dog parks, pet spas and activities to give your fur babies a vacation, too. Here are a few suggestions for things to do, places to eat and spots to stay.

EAT

Purchase a day pass to Ruff Canine Club (ruffcanineclub.com), which is part dog park and part bar. Grab a snack at one of the food trucks and enjoy a local brew while Fido makes some new friends. The region offers plenty of dog-friendly patios, including the one at Oak & Apple (oakandapplerichmond.com), a barbecue restaurant that also offers a rotating selection of dog treats. For riverside dining with your pooch, check out Henrico County's **The Lilly Pad** (facebook.com/lillypadcafe), which provides menus for humans and dogs. Pets are also welcome at many of RVA's breweries and wineries, such as Jolene Family Winery (jolenefamilywinery.com), where furry pals will love the family-run lakeside property. At the Midlothian biergarten, **Fest** (*festva.com*), pets are welcome at the outdoor tables where bipeds can enjoy local artisanal sausages and German, European, and American craft beers and ciders.

DO

With pet-centric boutiques including Fido Park Avenue (fidoparkavenue. com) and Sitting Pretty RVA (sittingpretty-rva.com), Stony Point Fashion Park (shopstonypoint.com) offers shopping for dogs and their parents, complete with water stations and a dog park. To check out more stores, visit Short Pump Town Center (shortpumptowncenter.com), where leashed dogs are welcome in common areas and in select stores and restaurants. The region offers an abundance of river activities, and if your pet loves the water, they can join you on an RVA Paddlesports (rvapaddlesports.com) rafting or kayaking trip. When your four-legged friends have some energy to burn or want to socialize, there are plenty of dog park options. Head to Barker Field (barkerfielddogpark.org) at Byrd Park where dogs can enjoy bench swings in an off-leash, fenced-in environment. At **Short Pump Dog Park** (henrico.us/rec/places/short-pump), pets will love the separate synthetic grass areas for small and large dogs. Located in the town of Ashland, Taylor Dog Park (hanovercounty.gov/245/ Dog-Parks) features agility equipment, a time-out pen and benches.



STAY

When it's time for a cat nap, there are plenty of accommodations in the area that cater to humans as well as furrier guests. **Check out Graduate Richmond** (graduatehotels.com/richmond), where pets can stay for a small fee per

night. Inquire about the Puppy Love package, which includes a bag of treats from local Clementine's Dog Bakery and waives the pet fee. The Jefferson Hotel (jeffersonhotel.com) permits dogs for a fee and creates a comfortable experience by allowing exploration of the historic building (except for dining areas) and connecting guests with nearby pet-friendly sites. The Westin Richmond (marriott.com) welcomes dogs for a fee, offering rooms with modern decor and pet amenities that include a walk area, bowls and dog beds. Richmond's boutique Quirk **Hotel** (quirkhotels.com/hotels/richmond) is also dog-friendly with furry friends staying for a fee, 50% of which is refundable upon checkout based on the condition of the room.





HISTORIC HOMES AND GARDENS

1812 WICKHAM HOUSE

A National Historic Landmark built by John Wickham, the house was purchased by Mann Valentine Jr. in 1898 and was the original home of The Valentine museum. Today, guided tours explore everyday life in the early 19th century above and below stairs. Bronze statue commemorating entrepreneur Maggie L. Walker, the first African American woman in the United States to found a bank. Broad and Adams streets. Free.

MANTLE: VIRGINIA INDIAN TRIBUTE

THE NATIONAL DONOR MEMORIAL

"There was no representation of people of color," she says. 




