




















LESS THAN A DAY'S DRIVE

The Richmond Region is within a day's drive of half of the U.S. population thanks to its proximity to I-95 and I-64, both of which run right through the heart of the region.



TAKE TO THE SKY

Richmond International Airport (flyrichmond.com) is just minutes from downtown Richmond. Nine major airlines offer 150 daily flights with nonstop service to major domestic destinations and connecting service to points across the globe.



Interactive museums and historic sites give the full picture of the past, from Native American life and early Colonial days to Richmond's role in the Revolutionary War and Civil War. The region will commemorate Virginia's contributions to the founding of the United States throughout 2025 and 2026.

The Valentine

The safekeeper of Richmond's storied past, this museum houses artifacts representing 400 years of the region's history. Tour the restored John Wickham House and sculptor Edward Valentine's studio, which hosts an exhibit explaining the Lost Cause myth (pictured). thevalentine.org

AFTERNOON

EVENING

EVENING

Catch a baseball game with the Richmond Flying Squirrels (squirrels baseball. com), the Double-A team for the San Francisco Giants, and enjoy spectacular fireworks. Or go DayGlo with the Tri-City Chili Peppers

(chilipeppersbaseball.com), who play under black lights, making uniforms, bats and balls glow.

MORNING

Explore the grounds of historic Maymont (maymont.org), complete with a farm, the Virginia Wildlife Trail and Robins Nature Center,

which features a multistory indoor climbing structure and hands-on fun for little ones.

AFTERNOON

Stop in Carytown (carytownrva.com) for ice cream at Bev's, Kilwin's

or Jeni's. Shop at Bbgb (bbgbbooks. com) for children's books, One Eyed Jacques (oneeyedjacques.com) for unique board and card games, and World of Mirth (worldofmirth.com) for toys and gifts.

EVENING

Order brick-oven pizza at Brambly Park (bramblypark.com), then let the kids play outside while adults sip wine and toast to a memorable trip.

DAY 1

MORNING

(jamesriverpark.org), or indoors at Peak Experiences (peakexperiences. com) and Triangle Rock Club (trianglerockclub.com).

AFTERNOON

Experience the full-throttle excitement of a NASCAR race or Nitrocross event at Richmond Raceway (richmondraceway.com). Take the wheel at the indoor track at

K1 Speed (k1speed.com), or rent a slingshot motorcycle from RVA Hot Wheelz (rvahotwheelz.com) and get out on the open road.

EVENING

Head to the Arts District for an adventurous meal at GWARbar (gwarbar.com), where fake blood splatters the wall and menu items include the Nachos Destructo and Demoned Eggs.

MORNING

Start your day at a Fan District favorite, Lamplighter Coffee Roasters (lamplightercoffee.com). Head out to the American Civil War Museum (acwm.org), then visit the "T-Pott" Bridge and the **Emancipation and Freedom** Monument on Brown's Island.

AFTERNOON

Grab a boxed lunch at Sally Bell's Kitchen (sallybellskitchen.com), a go-to spot since 1924, then take a driving tour of Richmond National

> Battlefield Park (nps.gov/rich), a series of 13 Civil War sites throughout the region.

EVENING

Raise your glass at Unhappy Hour in the courtyard of The Poe

Museum (poemuseum.org) before making your way down

cobblestone streets to The Tobacco Company (thetobaccocompany. com) for dinner in a 19th-century warehouse.

MORNING Visit the Black **History Museum** & Cultural Center of Virginia

(blackhistorymuseum.org), and have brunch at Mama J's (mamajskitchen.com) in historic Jackson Ward, once referred to as America's Black Wall Street.

AFTERNOON

Watch a reenactment of Patrick Henry's 1775 "give me liberty or give me death" speech at St. John's Church (historicstjohnschurch.org), and take a walking tour of Church Hill with the Richmond Tour Guys (richmondtourguys.com).

EVENING

Tour Hanover Tavern, which has hosted American history for nearly 300 years, then tuck into dinner in the dining room or cozy basement pub (hanovertavern.org).

DAY 1

MORNING

Start with breakfast at SB's Lakeside Love Shack (sbsloveshackrva.com), where the menu is inspired by the B-52's hit song. Then, stop and smell the roses at the award-winning Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden (lewisginter.org).

AFTERNOON

Stroll the sculpture garden and admire the incredible collection at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts (vmfa.museum), one of the country's best art museums. Nearby, savor wine and fine cheeses at Truckle Cheesemongers (trucklerva.com).

EVENING

Check in at Linden Row Inn (lindenrowinn.com) in the midst of downtown Richmond. Catch a concert on the riverfront at Brown's Island (venturerichmond.com) or head to Carytown to enjoy a quirky fusion of creativity, music and cocktails at Reveler (revelerexperiences.com).

DAY 2
