GETTING *HERE*



LESS THAN A DAY'S DRIVE

The Richmond Region is within a day's drive of half of the U.S. population thanks to its proximity to I-95 and I-64, both of which run right through the heart of the region.



TAKE TO THE SKY

Richmond International Airport (flyrichmond.com) is just minutes from downtown Richmond. Nine major airlines offer 150 daily flights with nonstop service to major domestic destinations and connecting service to points across the globe.



RIDE THE RAILS

Skip the drive and take a passenger train (amtrak.com/virginia), with Amtrak access from Main Street Station in downtown Richmond, Staples Mill Road Station in Henrico County, Petersburg Station in Ettrick and the Town of Ashland Station.

TRANSIT

Greater Richmond Transit Company (ridegrtc.com) offers bus routes throughout the City of Richmond, Henrico County, and parts of Chesterfield County and the Town of Ashland. The Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Pulse line serves downtown Richmond with buses every 15 minutes (or faster) daily from morning to late evening.



TAXI & RIDESHARE

James River Park System

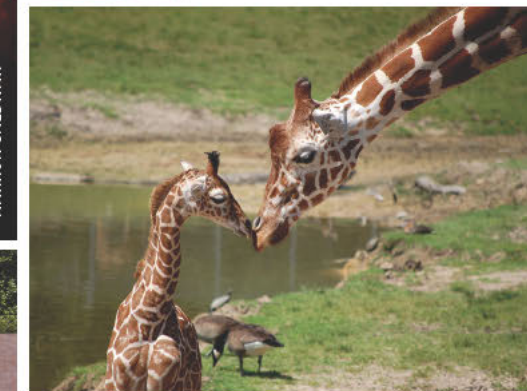
Spanning 600 acres in the heart of Richmond, this popular attraction features 22 miles of walking trails and bike paths, and multiple river access points. jamesriverpark.org

Historic Polegreen Church

The original church, circa 1747, was led by the Rev. Samuel Davies, who inspired Patrick Henry and influenced the struggle for religious freedom. The steel frame outline, designed by architect Carlton Abbott in 2000, was based on sketches made before the church was destroyed during the Civil War. historicpolegreenchurch.org



Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden

Stroll through more than a dozen themed gardens, including a spectacular conservatory and a hands-on children's garden with splash pad and treehouse. 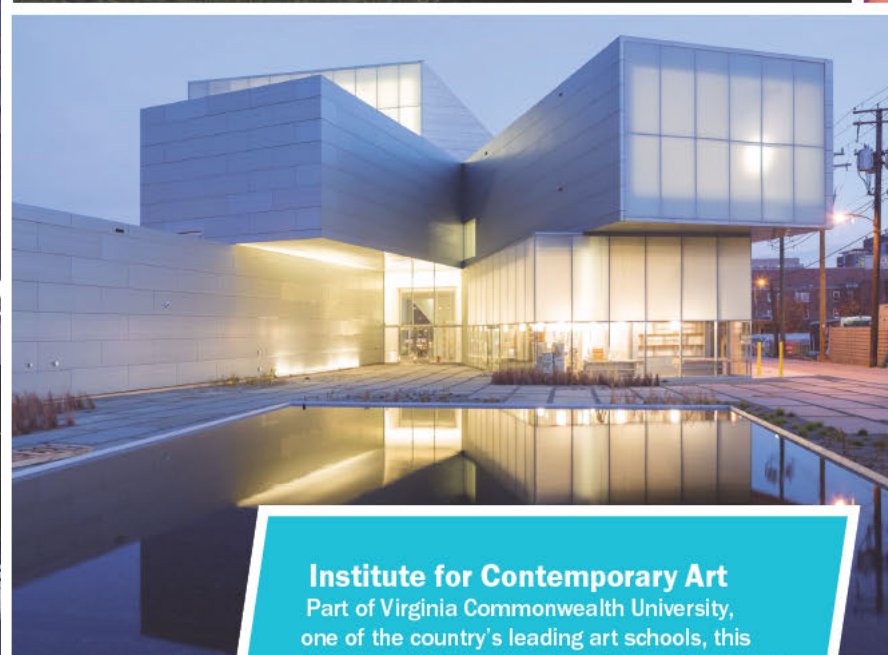

IMMERSED IN HISTORY

The pages of your history books come to life in the Richmond Region. Interactive museums and historic sites give the full picture of the past, from Native American life and early Colonial days to Richmond's role in the Revolutionary War and Civil War. The region will commemorate Virginia's contributions to the founding of the United States throughout 2025 and 2026.

The Valentine

The safekeeper of Richmond's storied past, this museum houses artifacts representing 400 years of the region's history. Tour the restored John Wickham House and sculptor Edward Valentine's studio, which hosts an exhibit explaining the Lost Cause myth (pictured). thevalentine.org

In 1747, the meetinghouse here became vital to the colonists' struggle for religious and civil liberty when Samuel Morris and other Hanover Presbyterian dissenters called the Rev. Samuel Davies (1725-1761) to become pastor. Davies, a great orator who inspired Patrick Henry, was Virginia's first licensed non-Anglican minister. He promoted literacy among enslaved Africans in several colonies with funds he raised in England. In 1759, he became president of the College of New Jersey (Princeton University). Polegreen Church burned in June 1864 just before the Battle of Cold Harbor when Confederate artillery fired on it to dislodge Union sharpshooters.

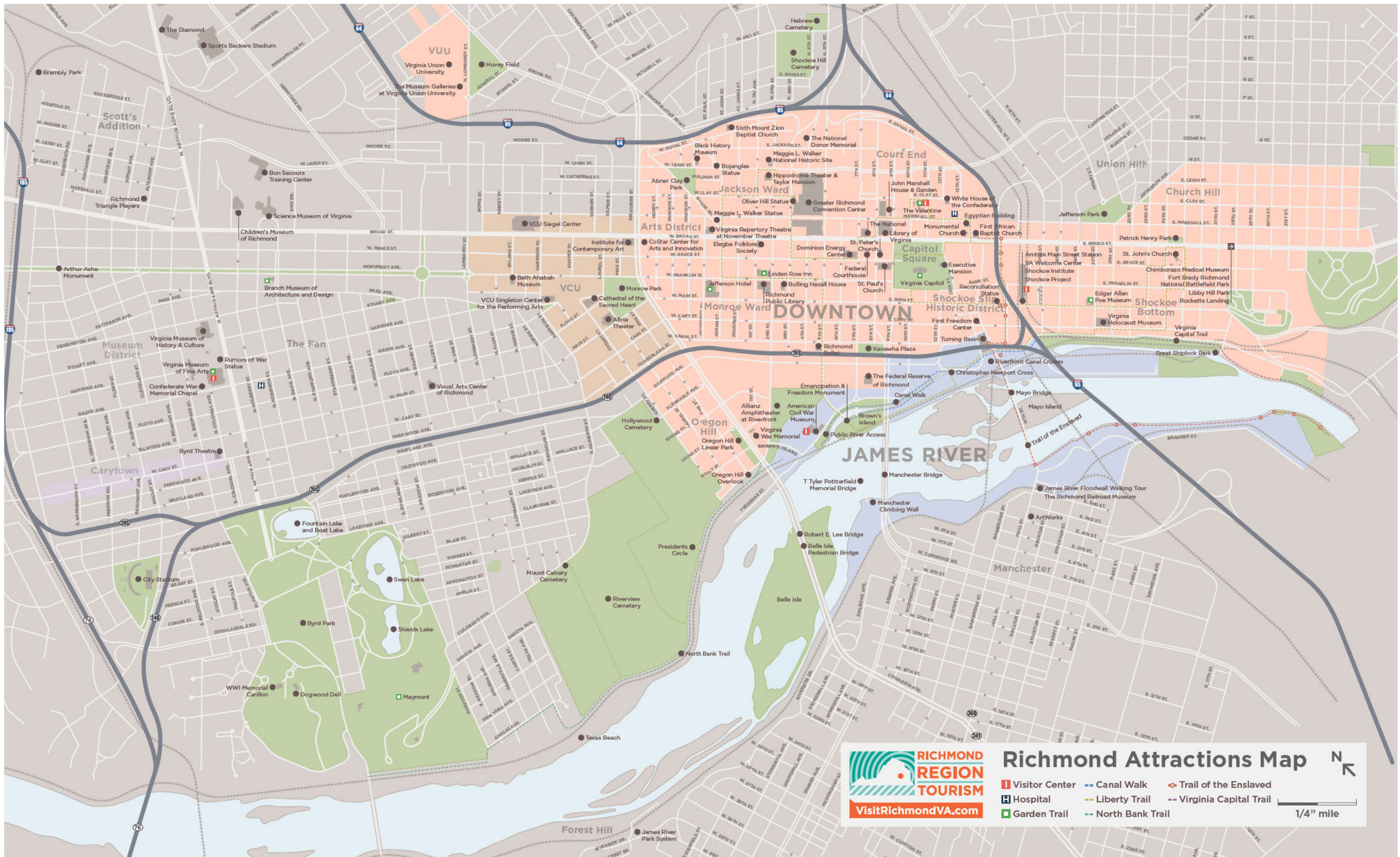

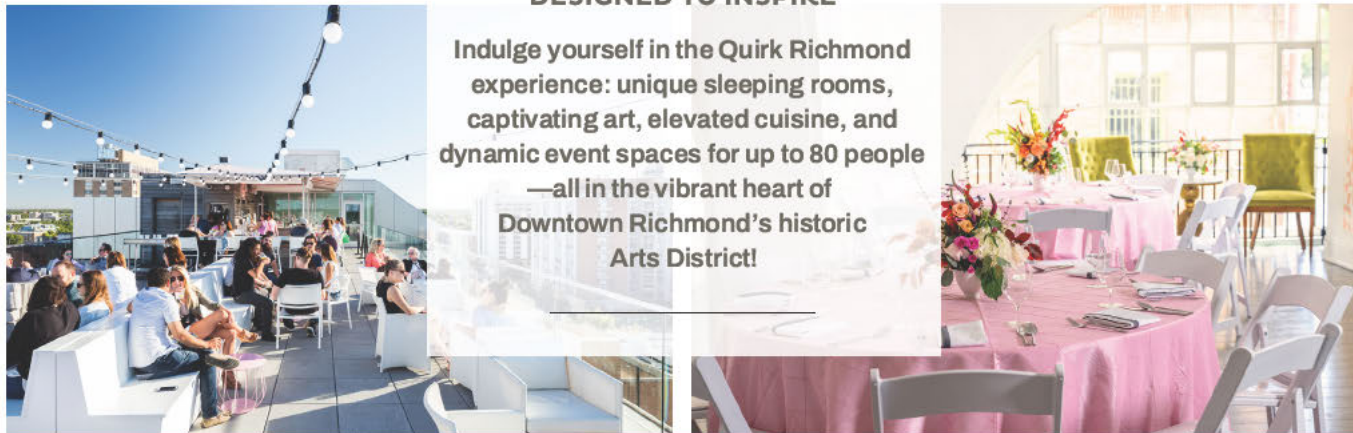

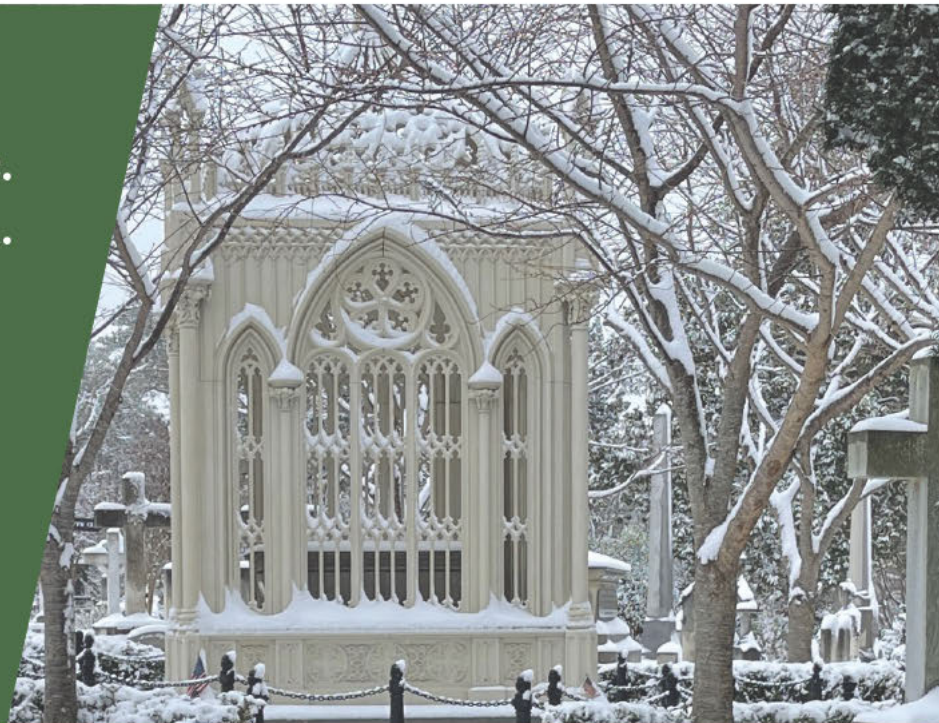
