VIRGINIA TRIPLE CROWN

OVERVIEW

Combining three of the most iconic vistas on the entire Appalachian Trail, the Virginia Triple Crown is a hike that is growing in popularity and represents an excellent outdoor asset to the region. McAfee Knob, Dragon's Tooth and Tinker Cliffs are the primary vistas on the Triple Crown. They are accessed by a ~30 mile section of the Appalachian Trail which can be completed in one direction or as a ~40 mile loop.



QUICK FACTS

- Generally the hike is from the Dragons Tooth parking lot off 311 to 220 in Daleville. A loop can be accomplished by adding the Andy Lane and North Mountain Trails.
- Great distances for a range of weekend hikers.
- Good access to I-81 and population centers.
- Easy way to "check off" major points of interest from the bucket list.
- Majority of the AT land in this section is owned by the National Park Service.
- Unique management landscape creates a variety of challenges.
- International destination for hikers and outdoor enthusiasts
