Historic Gardens

Ellwanger Garden - A living horticultural "museum" maintained by the Landmark Society of Western New York. More than 25 beds of peonies, perennials and ancient pear trees.

George Eastman Museum - This famed museum replicates Kodak founder George Eastman's seasonal gardens of 100 years ago at his East Avenue Mansion.

Maplewood Park Rose Garden - More than 3,000 rose bushes fill an acre of land in an urban setting.

Genesee Country Village & Museum - Stroll 13 heirloom gardens, from a dye garden and Shaker medicinal plot to the formal designs of Victorian times.

Sonnenberg Gardens & Mansion State Historic Park – Nine exquisitely restored Edwardian gardens in Canandaigua, N.Y. A national treasure.

The 1812 Bicentennial Peace Garden Trail – Historic sites (primarily battle sites) along the shores of Lake Ontario.

Gardens of Learning

Warner Castle - Home to the Rochester Civic Garden Center. One of the largest horticultural libraries in the Northeast. Explore a "Sunken Garden" designed in 1930.

Rochester Museum & Science Center - Several hidden gardens, including the Garden of Fragrance.

The Strong's Discovery Garden - Wander through trees, shrubs, and flowering plants that attract butterflies, birds and other wildlife. (Take a peek at enchanting fairy houses, too!)

Year-Round Gardens

Dancing Wings Butterfly Garden® at The Strong Museum – home to the national museum of play. Hundreds of butterflies among tropical plants, delighting all ages.

Lamberton Conservatory in Highland Park – A botanical treat. Tropical forests, desert plants and exotic blooms. The conservatory is over 150 years old.
