Dear Senator Schumer, Senator Gillibrand, Representative Reed, Representative Katko and Representative Morelle,

Impact from the COVID-19 pandemic on the nine-county Finger Lakes region which is comprised of Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Orleans, Seneca, Wayne, Wyoming, and Yates Counties, has and will continue to have far-reaching economic detriment from the loss of jobs, tax revenue, and businesses. Rebuilding and reimagining the tourism industry is critical to the Finger Lakes regional economic ecosystem and financial health. As tourism and economic development leaders in the Finger Lakes region, we seek your support in obtaining federal CARES Act grant funding to aid in the recovery and resiliency of our region as a result of the devastation caused by COVID-19.

Tourism is a significant economic driver representing an industry of more than **\$1.7 BILLION** in the Finger Lakes region, while also serving as one of the largest industries statewide for employment. The industry is comprised of museums and cultural institutions; outdoor recreation; entertainment venues; restaurants and bars; wineries, breweries and distilleries; lodging properties; airports and transportation providers; meetings, conventions and sporting events; and destination marketing organizations.



As reported by Tourism Economics in 2018*, the nine-county region employed a total of **32,905** tourism and hospitality workers.

^{**}Please note that all economic figures relative to the region are provided by New York State through Tourism Economics, an Oxford Economics company. They are released approximately 6-8 months after the close of the prior calendar year, therefor 2018 represents the most recent data available.

Tourism generates more than \$210,000,000 in local and state taxes through the collection of sales and bed tax, and has a direct impact on every single household in the nine-county region. The average household in the Finger Lakes region would have to pay an additional \$452 to maintain the same level of government revenue.

Nationally, the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry has been nine times greater than that of 9/11 and the industry as a whole is anticipating a 45% decline in revenue for 2020. Per U.S. Travel, the COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in over \$157 billion in cumulative losses for the U.S. travel economy. Anticipated loss of visitor spending to the Finger Lakes region during the period of March 15 – June 15 is expected to top \$425,000,000.

The nine-county Finger Lakes region is seeking \$600,000 in EDA CARES Act funding to implement a **Business Development and Sustainability Program.** As a technical assistance and stabilization program, it will support local and regional job creation and growth, and economic diversification strategies targeting affected workers and businesses, while also promoting the region through a travel and tourism-related marketing campaign to drive recovery through visitation. This benefits a broad spectrum of business sectors with a primary focus on tourism, hospitality and recreation, while also helping the growth and enhancement of cultural and natural assets. This program will be open to all businesses located in communities across the nine-county footprint of the Finger Lakes with a focus on existing and new start-up tourism and recreation operations. The focus primarily consists of tourism and hospitality industry businesses; attractions including but not limited to hotels and outdoor recreation; food, beverage and agriculture; arts and cultural institutions; retail establishments; and restaurants and food service businesses.

As such staunch supporters of New York State tourism in the past, we thank you for your continued support. With the assistance of funding through the CARES Act and through thoughtful and strategic collaboration, we are confident that we can drive critical support to the tourism and hospitality industry and businesses in our region who need it most.
