

- Several remote laptops.
- Green screen at Aaron's apartment.
- Ring lights.
- Phone tripods.
- TVU apps for most work phones.




Working From Home

- Five reporters/staff members working partially or solely from home.
- Staggered shifts/hours to limit people in newsroom space.
- At least one anchor on each shift prepared to shift home at moment's notice.
- Social distancing practiced throughout building.

Cooperation
