





MEETING HOTELS

Full-service hotels, affordable inns, and historic bed & breakfasts make up approximately 16,000 hotel rooms in the Sacramento region. Combined, the Hyatt Regency and Sheraton Grand offer more than 1,000 first-class hotel rooms just steps from the convention center. RECREATION




SHOPPING

The city has been on the move ever since, and is now one of the fastest-growing regions in the United States.
