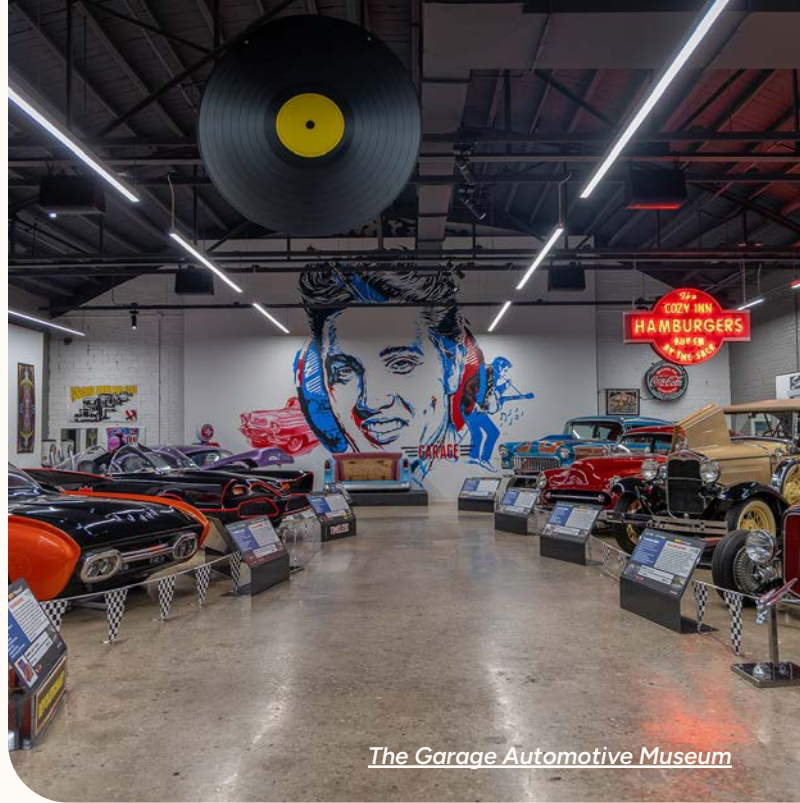

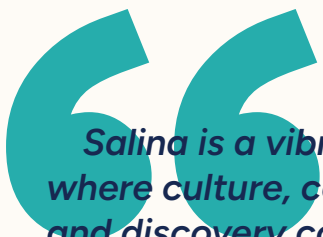

June 11-14, 2026

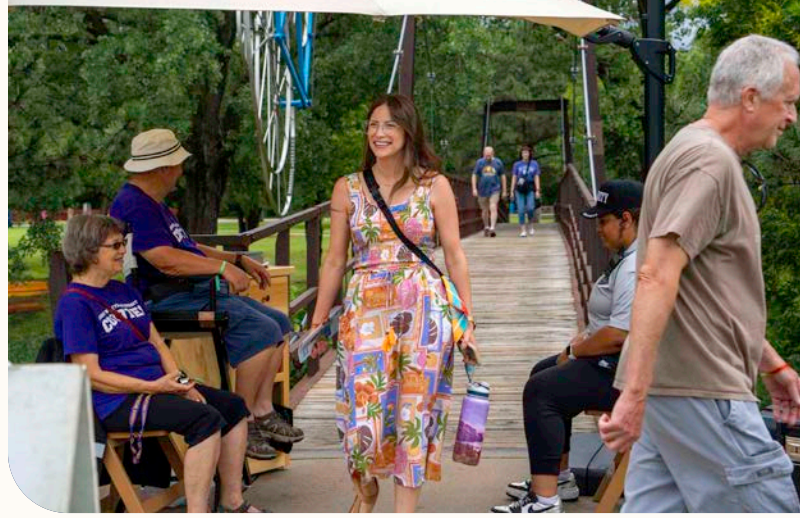

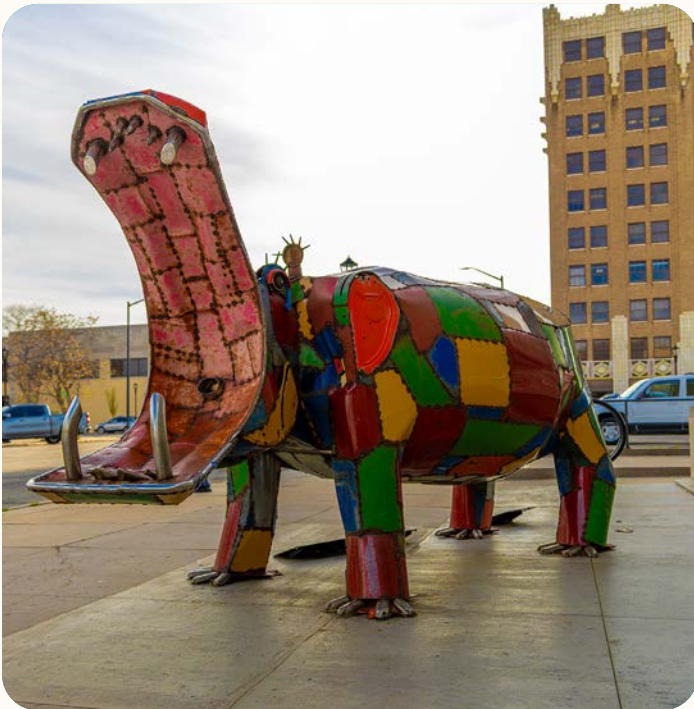

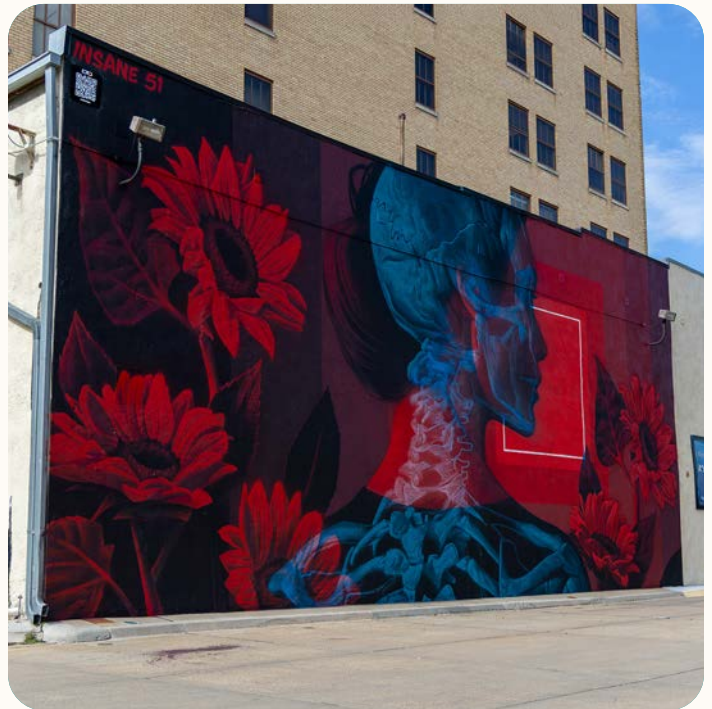

# Where Salina Started



Salina's story begins where rivers meet opportunity. Settled near the Smoky Hill, Saline, and Solomon Rivers, the area quickly became a natural hub for trade and connection in the mid-1800s. Early commerce, including H.D. Lee's wholesale operations, helped shape a growing downtown that still reflects that legacy today, where historic buildings now house modern shops, restaurants, and living spaces.

As the railroad arrived, Salina evolved into a center for industry, with manufacturing and agriculture driving early growth. That spirit of innovation and hard work continues to define the community.

In the mid-20th century, the reopening of Smoky Hill Air Force Base brought new energy and population growth. Even after its closure, Salina adapted by leveraging its central location at the crossroads of I-70 and I-135 to build a strong, diverse economy.

Today, Salina continues to grow with industries ranging from advanced manufacturing to aviation and logistics. With a rich history and forward momentum, it remains a place built on resilience, connection, and opportunity.
