Native American Powwow on New Year's Eve Closes Out Busy 4th Quarter

The **11th Annual New Year's Eve Powwow** made its first appearance at South Towne, having outgrown its previous location. The event featured Native American dances and a drum group from Fort Duchesne. It was one of **68 events** held during 4th Quarter.

The **Primary Children's Festival of Trees** attracted over 100,000 attendees in early December. Other large events included: the **Fall Home Show, Rocky Mountain Gun Show** (x2), the **Hot Tub, Swim and Spa Sale, Salt Lake Family Christmas Gift Show, What a Woman Wants, Crossroads of the West Gun Show, Chevrolet's** *Find New Roads* **Tour** and a **Dicken's Christmas**.

Facility Update

Seismic (earthquake) Bracing — This on-going project is nearing completion with only four braces left to be installed on Monday, January 11th. The project is set to wrap up on January 20th.

Boiler Refractory — The construction and installation of the #2 boiler refractory has been completed. This was the final phase of a three-part project that began in 2014.

Training — In addition to the company-wide training that took place at the Salt Palace in mid-December:

- Facility Director Rick Medina participated in a meeting to discuss emergency preparedness and relief efforts between the public and private sectors in the event of a major earthquake. Representatives from the state of Utah, FEMA, the Emergency Operations Committee and hospitality industry were part of this meeting held at the State Capitol's Emergency Operations Center.
- Chief Engineer Zach Nicholson and Rick Medina worked with Ralph Ley from the US Department of Homeland Security to complete the final vulnerability assessment that will allow STEC staff to plan, prepare and implement safer practices within the facility.
- Zach Nicholson and Rick Medina attended the 2nd annual Disaster Recovery Conference sponsored by Salt Lake County Office of Emergency Services.
- Event Manager Gerri Morgan, Zach Nicholson and Rick Medina, along with representatives from other SMG properties and other large venues from across the state, were part of a discussion conducted by Utah State Intelligence Analyst John McClure on terrorist threat assessment and responses.
- Rick Medina attended the Storm Water SOP training hosted by Salt Lake County's Dan Drumiler. STEC completed the procedural document and has trained key staff on its contents. Medina is a member of Salt Lake County's Storm Water Management Team.
- On December 21, the facility Safety Committee conducted the bi-annual emergency evacuation training and drill.

2015 Wraps Up with Employee Training Sessions and Recognition Luncheon

On December 14th, Supervisors, Managers and Directors attended a half-day K'nekt leadership training session. Katie Wells from the SMG corporate office conducted the training that included lectures, videos and team break-out sessions. In between the two courses, a lunch was served and HR gave an update on open enrollment and other benefit-related issues.

On the 15th, there were three, one-hour presentations by organizations whose work is relevant to our work in public facility management. The first presentation was given by Tracy Ita and Sgt. Tony Russell of the Salt

Lake Police Department on active shooter scenarios. They gave a mixed media presentation on the history of mass shootings and cited specific examples from the Salt Lake City area. They stressed the importance of always being aware of one's surroundings and to follow the police department's advice: If you see something, say something!

The next speaker was Rebecca Sanchez, Director of the Salt Lake County Mayor's Office of Diversity Affairs. Her presentation gave us all tips on how to be more sensitive to people who are not like us,



including understanding gender, race, age and socio-economic differences. The presentation incorporated role-playing using some of the employees in a scenario of interacting with a person with disabilities.

The final presenter was Eric Bonin, the Salt Lake Program Manager for Splore, a national program which offers a variety of indoor and outdoor sporting activities for people with disabilities. He offered a mixed media presentation illustrating the fact that just because someone is disabled doesn't make them unable to enjoy many activities, including rock climbing, river rafting and skiing.

The presentations were then followed by the Employee Recognition Luncheon, catered by Utah Food Services. General Manager Dan Hayes gave a recap of the year's activity at all three SMG facilities and talked briefly about the coming year. Employees who have been with the company for three, five, ten and above years received Years of Service certificates. Employees of the Year were also named from each facility and they received a special certificate and cash award. (See below.) All of this was interspersed with performances by some of the talented people who work at our facilities. Leona Schultz from the Business Center and Bryant Larsen, Salt Palace Office Administrator both sang. Engineer Josh Densley performed a two-part magic show/stand-up comedy routine. Special guests included Erin Litvack and Holly Yocom from the Salt Lake County Community Services Department.
