2nd Quarter Report for the Salt Lake County Equestrian Park and Event Center

Town Hall Meeting on Future of the Equestrian Park Draws Large Crowd, Diverse Interests



Hundreds of people came to the Town Hall Meeting on Monday, April 25, to discuss the future of the Salt Lake County Equestrian Park. Mayor Ben McAdams, along with Councilmembers, user groups, Salt Lake County Parks & Recreation representatives, other stakeholders and Dan Hayes of SMG were front and center in the Event Center Arena at the Park.

The meeting focused on the four options being considered by the County regarding the Park's future and funding: 1) Leave the facility as is, with on-going maintenance and modest improvements; 2) make more significant improvements to attract large, regional

events; 3) reduce amenities and use some of the land for field sports; or 4) close the park.

The County continues to deliberate on the issue. However, the Council did

approved on May 3rd, \$66,000 to amend the aging soil in the 85,000square foot indoor arena.

PARK PERSONNEL CHANGES

Mike Terry has been named the Interim Facility Director with the departure of Susan Hayward. **James King** is the new Jail Crew Supervisor, replacing **Marty Oviatt**, who has returned to the Maintenance crew at the Park. Interviews are currently underway for a new Maintenance Supervisor and **Catherine Cravotta** has accepted the position of Office Coordinator.

Facility Operations Update

Barns

The 500, 600 and rabbit barn stalls received new kick plates at the bottom of the panels and doors; the latches and hinges were lubricated and repaired, as needed; the stalls were painted and prepped; and, the lights changed in anticipation of the Paint Show. Also, 18 stalls were repaired, painted and installed in the rabbit barn for the Paint Show. The A, B, C and D barns' drainage catch basins have been pumped and the gutters have been cleaned in order to eliminate flooding during heavy rain storms. All of the lights have been replaced in the 900 barn.

Facility

New swamp coolers were installed, two in the rabbit barn and two in the track office. The floor drains have been inventoried and jetted to ensure that all drains flow to the sewer and not into the storm drain system. These findings have been sent to the County. The sound mixer and microphones have been replaced.

Arenas

The arenas have been graded to eliminate puddles and to bring some of the footing in from the corners. A new method of working the dirt has been implemented which will eliminate ridges and create a safer footing.

Equipment

A new harrow was purchased for the conditioning of the track. New gussets and teeth were installed on the track conditioner and another piece of equipment had a hose replaced and the hydraulic fluid and filter changed.
