Gordie Howe Sports Complex

The Gordie Howe Sports Complex is the most unique sport complex in Canada. With facilities for ten summer and winter sports including cross country skiing, speed skating, track and field, softball, football, baseball, ultimate disc, hockey, box lacrosse, field lacrosse. It is the heart of sport in Saskatoon. The complex and is home to sports leagues, annual tournaments, provincial and national championships.

University of Saskatchewan

Home of the Huskies! The University of Saskatchewan Huskie Athletics is one of the best university sport programs in Canada. The University of Saskatchewan features two main sport facilities – Merlis Belsher Place and the Physical Activity Complex (PAC).

Merlis Belsher Place is Saskatoon's newest sport facility, featuring two ice rinks and is home to Huskie Hockey and Saskatoon Minor Hockey Association teams. The PAC hosts the Huskies basketball and volleyball programs in a triple gym, with seating for up to 2,400 people.

You will also find on campus Griffiths Stadium, a 6,100 seat football stadium which is home to Huskies Football and has hosted the U Sports Vanier Cup in the past.

SaskTel Centre

SaskTel Centre has been the venue of choice for major sport events in Saskatoon. The area is home to three major sports franchises: The Saskatoon Blades of the Western Hockey League, the Saskatchewan Rush of the National Lacrosse League, and the Saskatchewan Rattlers of the Canadian Elite Basketball League.

Hosting hockey, lacrosse, and basketball games, national and international events, and as well as, a wide variety of world-class concerts, the arena is central Saskatchewan's meeting place and go-to destination for entertainment.

Shaw Centre

The Shaw Centre is a state-of-the-art aquatic and fitness facility, featuring one of the largest volume indoor pools in the world (holding 4.3 million liters of water). Together with a Myrtha stainless steel basin, this facility is used exclusively for the highest calibre swimming events. The pool was also designed to meet Federation Internationale du Natation (FINA) regulations for hosting aquatic events.

The competitive pool also features two one-meter spring boards; two three-meter spring boards; and a three, five, seven and a half, and ten meter diving platforms. The scoreboard and video display, sponsored by the 1989 Jeux Canada Games Foundation, is the largest installation for an indoor aquatic facility in North America.

The Shaw Centre is home to all of Saskatoon's aquatic sports (Swimming, water polo, diving, artistic swimming) and has hosted everything from annual tournaments to national championships.
