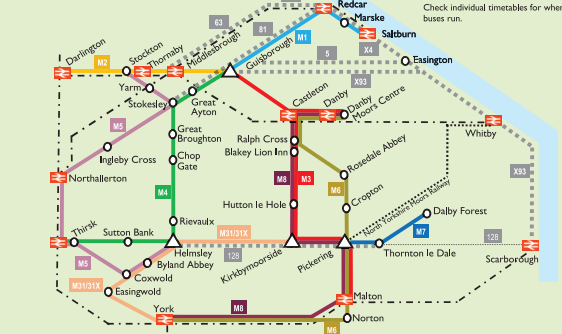

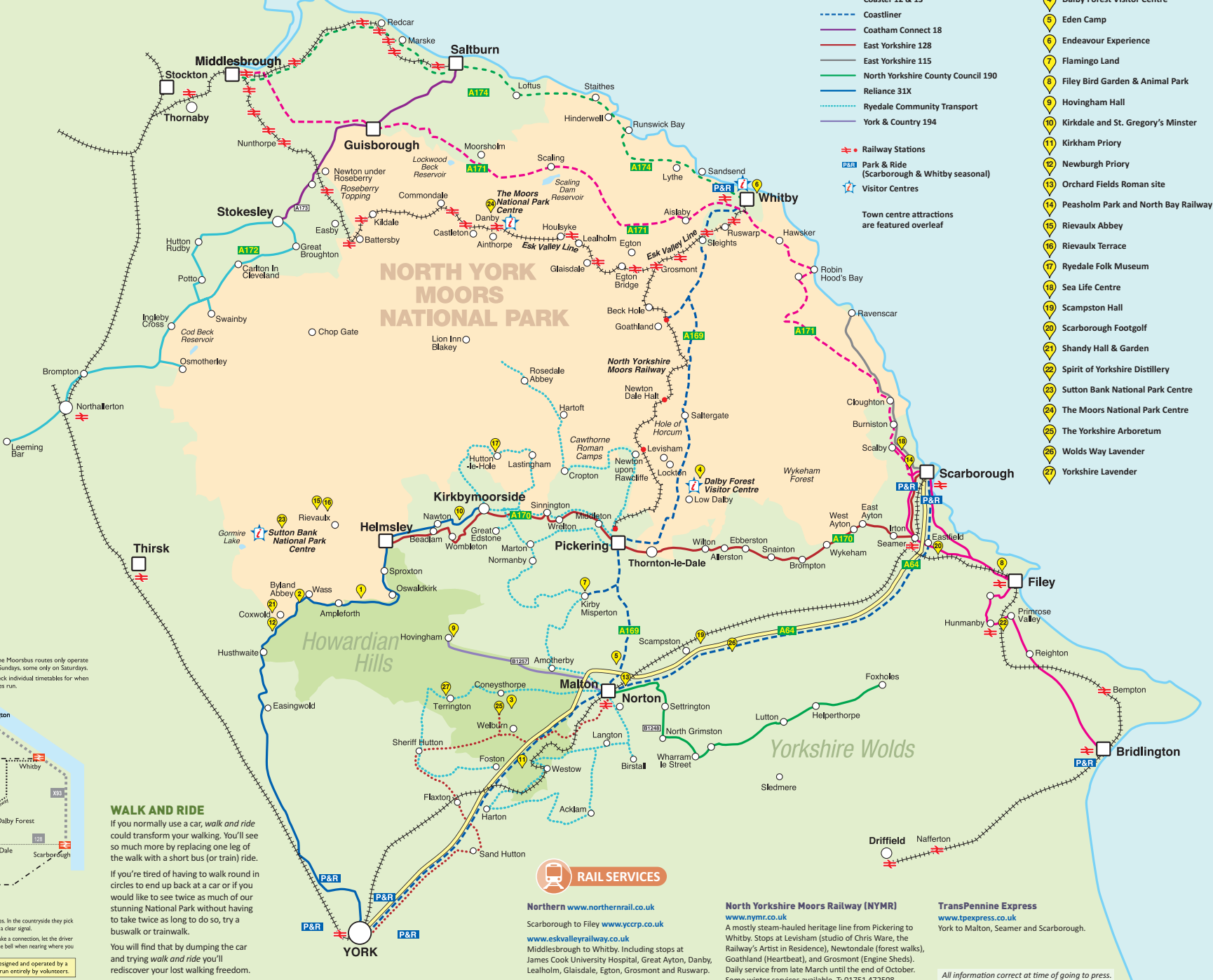

Other services which issue and accept Moors Rover tickets - - If you want to get off at a remote location, or to make a connection, let the driver know when you board the bus, and then just ring the bell when reaching where you want to get off.

With a walk down to Malton Spout waterfall or across moorland to Wheeldale Roman Road. Coastliner 840. Also NYMR service.

A traditional picturesque village set on the edge of the Yorkshire Wolds looking towards the Yorkshire coast over farmland. As you walk through the village you will be reminded of a bygone era with a typical English village setting with its market place, village green, church, traditional chalk built houses, independent shops and pubs.

## COUNTRYSIDE STOP-OFFS

- Robin Hood's Bay**  
Once the haunt of smugglers, this National Park village is famous for its Jurassic-era fossils, sweeping bay and atmospheric alleys. Service Arriva X93 Middlesbrough <> Scarborough.
- Runswick Bay**  
Sheltered village in a lovely coastal setting with a wide bay and fine sands popular for paddling and stand up paddleboarding. Service Arriva X4 Middlesbrough <> Whitby.
- Sinnington village**  
A pretty village, set around a green with river. Good starting point for circular walks and for a picnic. Country Inn in village. Service 128 - Pickering <> Helmsley.
- Thornon-le-Dale**  
An attractive village, well-known for its riverside thatched cottages, motor museum, village walks and gentle walk to Ellerburn (country church). Refreshments and craft shops. On Service 128 Pickering <> Scarborough, Coastliner 840 and Moorsbus network.

## ACCESSIBILITY

Many service buses have low-level access and ramps for easy boarding.  
The North York Moors National Park Authority has developed a number of fully accessible routes for heavy duty wheelchairs and pushchairs through woodland, along riversides, by lakes, overlooking the Heritage Coast, through the heart of the moorland and around important archaeological sites. You can also hire a Trampler, an electric all-terrain mobility scooter, for use from Sutton Bank National Park Centre and Ravenscar Visitor Centre. The Centres have further details or you can find information online [www.northyorkmoors.org.uk/easyaccess](http://www.northyorkmoors.org.uk/easyaccess)  
Pick up a copy of the National Park's 'Out and About' magazine in a National Park Centre for details on places to go, things to do and events.

The North Yorkshire Moors Railway has designated spaces available for wheelchair users. Of the five stations along its eighteen-mile route, four of them are easily accessible to wheelchair users and mobility impaired persons. The only station without disabled access is Newtondale Halt.

Where possible, please advise the railway in advance of your visit so that staff can be on hand to assist boarding. T: 01751 472508 to advise or to discuss your particular access needs.
