



ACCESSIBILITY

Many service buses have low-level access and ramps for easy boarding. The North York Moors National Park Authority has developed a number of fully accessible routes for heavy duty wheelchairs and pushchairs through woodland along riversides, by lakes, overlooking the Heritage Coast, through the heart of the moorland and around important archaeological sites. You can also hire a Tramper, an electric all-terrain mobility scooter, for use from Sutton Bank National Park Centre and Ravenscar Visitor Centre.
