US RETAIL SALES FELL IN OCTOBER FOR THE FIRST TIME IN SEVEN MONTHS

<u>CNN</u>: Retail sales fell .1% in October; first time it's fallen since March of this year. Slowdown has been less than was economists predicted and the decline is on big ticket items purchased with credit (cars, furniture, etc.) but things like food has not seen a decline.

HALF OF HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS WON'T APPLY TO COLLEGES COSTING MORE THAN \$40,000

<u>Forbes:</u> Rising costs of tuition has changed how seniors look at colleges; 89% of students say cost impacts their decision. 53% will not consider colleges costing more than \$40k

COMPANIES WITH FLEXIBLE REMOTE WORK POLICIES OUTPERFORM ON REVENUE GROWTH

<u>Forbes:</u> Companies with flexible policies saw a much higher growth rate compared to companies with required office times
