

#### GOVERNOR HOCHUL'S 2024 STATE OF THE STATE: OUR NEW YORK, OUR FUTURE

<u>Governor.NY.Gov:</u> Few of highlights that are most relevant to Seneca County when it comes to some of Governor Hochul's priorities going into 2024 legislative and budget season-

- Mental health: proposing 200 new psychiatric patient beds and a program for schools looking for resources to start their own mental health clinic
- · Healthcare: eliminating co-pays for insulin
- Housing needs: \$500 million dollar capital fund to support development of up to 15 units of housing on state-owned land (like Willard)
- Empire AI launch: 7 universities and research institutions designed to promote responsible research and AI opportunities for the public good; proposing \$400 million in funding to support the initiative
- Proposing network of advanced manufacturing training centers along I-90 corridor
- Program "Fast NY" state's shuttle ready site program; funded in 2022 state budget but did not get any last year. Asking for \$100 million from this year's budget.
- Natural Resource Protection: Looking to address the root causes of harmful algae blooms
- Trying to encourage more students to enroll in college; requiring school districts to make each student fill out their FAFSA
- Proposal to increase reading proficiency; "Back to Basics" would require schools to
  use best practices when teaching students to read and is asking for \$10 million to train
  teachers in those best practices. \$10 million would train 20,000 teachers.

# STEVE ZIELINKSKI, SUPERINTENDANT OF SOUTH SENEGA SCHOOL DISTRICT

- Public schools are funded both state and federally, so the schools will also follow federal guidelines
- Following the State of the State Address, schools pay attention to what they're going to be mandated to do
- Schools pay attention to what their students need as well as whatever it is that Albany and the State Department of Education says they need to do
- FAFSA mandate is easier than the best practices for reading mandate
- Seniors will be asked to either fill out the FAFSA form or they can fill out a form that allows them to opt out; that will meet the mandate
- Answering to practice around reading instruction impacts every single grade, unlike FAFSA only impacting seniors, and there are a lot of moving parts
- Once the budget is settled schools will know what's expected using public funding that goes to schools and go from there
