NYC'S NON-CITIZEN VOTING LAW RULED UNCONSTITUTIONAL ON APPEAL

<u>Politico:</u> A NYC law that allows non-citizens to vote has been determined to be unconstitutional in the New York State Supreme Court, Appellate Division, Second Department. The law was challenged immediately in 2022 and never went into effect.

NYS DEC COMMISSIONER BASIL SEGGOS TO STEP DOWN

<u>Spectrum:</u> DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos served in the role for 15 years and entered under the Cuomo administration. Most development in the Seneca County area is handled through the DEC with Seggos' involvement.

NY'S ALL-ELECTRIC BUILDINGS ACT TAKES EFFECT IN 2026: ARE WE READY?

<u>RBJ:</u> Bill outlaws natural gas & fossil fuels in buildings under 7 stories high; all new construction will soon need to follow the same guidelines. A lawsuit is currently in effect to stop it from moving forward.

CEC-CERTIFIED COMMUNITIES IN SENECA COUNTY

NYSERDA: Seneca County has 4 CEC-Certified locations in all, one being the county itself. Lodi and Seneca Falls are included; this allows access for additional grants through local municipalities.

WHY THIS LAWMAKER IS FIGHTING SOCIAL MEDIA FEEDS

<u>Politico</u>: A law would prevent algorithmic feeds to show on children's social media accounts. In addition stricter privacy precautions are being sought after. Hochul is working on getting it passed through NYS; there are federal efforts as well.

CONFLICTING VIEWS ON MANDATING MINIMUM WAGE FOR TIPPED WORKERS IN NY

Spectrum: A new bill would phase out the current minimum wage for tipped service workers and make theirs the same minimum wage as the rest of the state. Restaurants are fighting back saying it's harmful to these worker's wages. Seneca County has a large industry made up of service workers and service businesses that this could impact.

RELATED UNWRAPS \$12 B HUDSON YARDS CASINO PROPOSAL

RealDeal: \$12B casino license up for grabs downstate; proposal includes 1500 apartments, 2 million square feet office space, public school, daycare, casino, and resort.

NY'S REMOTE WORK TAX UNDER ATTACK FROM CLOSEST NEIGHBORS

<u>Bloomberg:</u> CT and NJ are incentivizing their residents to sue NYS over the rule about income taxes for nom-residents who work in NYS.





LOCAL SALES TAX COLLECTIONS NEAR FLAT IN JAN. COMPARED TO LAST YEAR

NYSOC: Sales tax revenue was flat for most counties; fewer than half saw a year over year increase in NYS. Seneca County saw an increase of over 3%.

WATERLOO HITS DRI JACKPOT

<u>FL Times:</u> Waterloo was awarded \$10 million dollars; housing is included in the plans for how to use the funds.

- Agriculture census statistics out for Seneca County
- Downturn in number of farms; 516 to 442
- Acreage dropped from 118,545 to 103,156; down about 15,000 acres
- Size of average farm went up by about 14 acres
- Value of land and buildings per form went up; \$1,126,952 in 2022
- Value per acre is at \$461,000
