### MISSED DEADLINES PILE UP AS NY'S CLIMATE LAW TURNS FIVE

**NY Focus:** Five years after New York lawmakers passed a landmark bill to slash greenhouse gas emissions, the state has missed several of the law's major deadlines — and it's about to miss another. When it passed on this day in 2019, the law was heralded as one of the most ambitious climate plans in the world.

### VACATION RENTALS COULD SEE NEW TAXES, REGULATIONS IN NY

**Press Republican:** Short-term vacation rental units would be tracked by New York state, and platforms would have to collect occupancy and sales taxes on reservations the same way they do on a hotel stay, under a bill just approved by the state Legislature last week.

### NY'S EQUAL RIGHTS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT RESTORED TO BALLOT BY APPEALS COURT
