## BRIGHTER DAYS PEDIATRIC MENTAL HEALTH URGENT CARE OPENS JULY 15 AS FIRST OF ITS KIND IN THE

### REGION

<u>URMC.Rochester.edu</u>: The new Brighter Days Pediatric Mental Health Urgent Care Center is the area's first-ever walk-in mental health clinic for young people up to the age of 18, who can show up with no prior appointment to get care. The walk-in clinic offers evaluations and interventions to help young people and their families who are experiencing acute distress. Children must be accompanied by a caregiver for the duration of the walk-in visit.

#### DENGUE FEVER CASES PROMPT CDC ALERT

<u>Democrat & Chronicle:</u> The CDC said it issued the health alert to notify healthcare providers, public health authorities and the public of an increased risk of dengue virus infections in the U.S. in 2024. In 2024, countries in the Americas reported more than 9.7 million dengue cases, the CDC said, which is twice as many as in all of 2023.
