THE BILLS GOV. HOCHUL HAS TO ACT ON SOON

<u>Gothamist:</u> Hochul has until the end of the year to sign more than 100 bills; if she doesn't they will need to be presented again and go through the same process.

ROCHESTER BECOMES LARGEST CITY IN NY TO OPT INTO GOOD CAUSE EVICTION PROTECTIONS

<u>wxxi:</u> Rochester is now the largest city in the state outside New York City to adopt the protections after Gov. Kathy Hochul signed the state's Good Cause Eviction law in April.
