

SENECA COUNTY FARMERS MARKETS SEEKING VENDORS FOR THE 2025 SEASON

<u>FLTimes:</u> Markets include Waterloo (Thursdays), Seneca Falls (Tuesdays), and Ovid (Saturdays), running from June through early fall. Applications are reviewed on a first-come, first-served basis, and vendors can choose to participate in one or all three locations. They are now accepting vendor applications for the 2025 season, inviting local producers to sell fruits, vegetables, baked goods, crafts, and more. Organizers say markets provide a low-cost opportunity to boost business visibility and profitability.
