WXXI News: New York State plans to hold a special session as leaders consider changing rules behind temporary work permits for asylum seekers

SEEKING NEW PLAYBOOK. DEMOCRATS SOUR ON MAYOR ADAMS' MIGRANT APPROACH

Gothamist: Over the past week a number of Democrats have introduced plans to speed up the process of obtaining work permits. Work permits are currently a federal issue, not a state issue. The current average wait time for a permit is 180 days and New York City leaders are pushing to make the process take as little as 45 days.

WHY DEMOCRATS NOMINATED LONG ISLAND ATTORNEY FOR STATE SUPREME COURT IN UPSTATE NY

<u>AuburnPub</u>: A Long Island woman was running for a Brookhaven Supervisor position before having a stroke. The process to withdraw following her stroke is complicated due to the deadline for withdrawal passing three months prior. Now she is being nominated to run for the Supreme Court in the 7th Judicial District.

NEW NY LAW ON BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR AMMUNITION BUYS TAKES EFFECT

Spectrum News: Gun retailers will now need to go through police, who are already backed up with work, to run checks for people buying guns or ammunition in NY. There is now a \$9 gun purchasing fee and a \$2.50 ammunition purchasing fee. Each purchase requires a background check to be covered by the purchaser.

RISING POWER COSTS SPARK FEARS OF CLEAN ENERGY SLOWDOWN

<u>Politico</u>: Renewable energy companies are looking to renegotiate contracts since costs have gone up so much. This casts doubt over whether or not NYS will be able to reach their renewable energy goals they've set already.

MORE THAN 123K NY FOOD STAMPS FOR KIDS GONE UNUSED

Albany Times Union: 1.86 million children in the United States received free breakfasts and/or lunches and their families were sent emergency EBT cards with food stamps on them during the pandemic. Many families either used the cards once then threw them away or thought it was junk mail and threw it away. Now the balances that were loaded onto those cards have been left unused, and educating these families to recognize and use the balance is necessary.

NY TOURISM SPENDING, ECONOMIC IMPACT WAS UP IN 2022, SURPASSED PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS
