recreational facilities and explore the
city's outdoor spaces and family-friendly amenities.

Parks open daily from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. or dusk
(whichever comes first). Visit seward.recdesk.com
for rates, programming and reservations.

- 1 Waterfront Park & Playground (901 & 420 Ballaine Blvd): Scenic park with modern playground, Obhiro Picnic Area, Branson Pavilion, Waterfront/Iditarod Bike Trail, and campgrounds with restrooms and showers.
- 2 Evan Casey Skate Park (311 Ballaine Blvd): Skate and BMX park at Seward Waterfront Park.
- 3 Hoben Park (401 Railway): Downtown green space with seating near Iditarod Historic Trail - Mile 0.
- 4 Urbach Park (306 Fourth Ave): Memorial micro-park with benches, downtown adjacent to City Hall.
- 5 Kawabe Park & Third Ave Playground (237 Fourth Ave and 228 Third Ave): Downtown green space with shuttle stop, restrooms, picnic tables, and playground.
- 6 Mount Marathon Jeep Trail (537 First Ave): Rugged trail with scenic views and access to Mt Marathon Bowl.
- 7 Gateway Playground (1911 Dora Way): Small, family-friendly playground in residential area.

- 8 Two Lakes Park & Trail (809 Second Ave): *closes at 8:00 p.m. Serene park with lake views, picnic area, First Lake Pavilion, and access to Two Lakes Trail.
- 9 Rotary Pavilion & Log Roll Park (1112 Second Ave): Compact park with picnic pavilion.
- 10 Benny Benson Park (211 Dairy Hill Lane): Green space honoring the designer of Alaska's flag.
- 11 Triangle Park (Seward Highway & Phoenix Rd): Landscaped space with benches at city's gateway.
- 12 Whale Tail Park (Port & Fourth): Iconic park with whale-themed sculptures near the waterfront.
- 13 Forest Acres Park (2210 Dimond Blvd): Basketball Court, Bike Park, Campground, and Playground.
- 14 Jon Perry Ball Field, Citizens Pavilion, & Ryan Lewis Ball Field (Ballfield Access Rd): Pavilion and fields for league games and events.
- 15 Little League Ball Field (Fourth Ave & C St): Dedicated youth baseball field.
- 16 Lowell Canyon Picnic Area (225 Lowell Canyon Rd): Picnic spot with access to Lowell Canyon and Mt Marathon Race Trails.
- 17 Wellington Picnic Area (910 Ballaine): Paved picnic area near waterfront and campgrounds.
- 18 Williams Park Day Use Area (B St & Ballaine): Picnic area with grassy spaces, restroom, and access to Ballaine Playground.
- 19 Youth Center Basketball Court (336 Third Ave): Basketball court for youth.
