


Welcome to Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore!

As you look around, you'll see that you've chosen to visit a very unique corner of the United States. The Dunes offer visitors sightseeing, recreational and educational opportunities in all seasons of the year.

In spring, summer and fall, swim and picnic at sugar sand beaches; canoe, kayak or tube on crystal-clear streams; or, simply let the day slip away with a late summer sunset. Wintertime provides a

much different view. Snowshoe, cross-country or downhill ski, snowboard or venture into the wilderness. Your only company will be the Dunes' year-round residents—its natural wildlife.

Our staff at the Lakeshore is proud to preserve and protect this natural environment for you and your family, just as we have for over 40 years. In fact, the Dunes have a very long history of recreation, agriculture and maritime activity, a great deal of which can still be seen through preserved and restored buildings and landmarks.



Learn from Park Rangers. Shaped by glaciers thousands of years ago, the diverse terrain and ecology of the dune environment is alive with opportunity for observing and learning about our natural world and what we can do to help protect it. While you're here, I encourage you to contact National Park Service uniformed employees, or one of the many volunteers that work in the park, if you have questions or need assistance.

> Enjoy your stay in the Sleeping Bear Dunes area. I hope you have a safe and memorable visit.



Park highlights include:

- * 70,000 acres of preserved natural beauty featuring the world's largest moving sand dunes.
- * 35 miles of beaches on Lake Michigan, many miles more on inland lakes and rivers.
- * Breathtaking vistas of lakes and dunes.
- * Canoeing and fishing on seven miles of the Crystal and Platte Rivers and on nineteen inland lakes.
- * Hiking and cross country skiing on 100 miles of trails with interpretive information.
- ▼ Picnicking at four areas; many with spectacular views of Lake Michigan, the Glen Lakes and the Sleeping Bear Dunes.
- * Camping at two campgrounds, one improved, one rustic. Backcountry camping is available at two locations on the mainland, and on North and South Manitou Island.

ENJOY FOUR SEASONS OF BEAUTY

Majestic beauty awaits you throughout the year. In spring and summer the lakes, beaches and streams are bathed in sun, the forests are clothed with lush greens.

Come fall, timbered ridges are splashed with brilliant color that reflects on still waters. The winter follows, when blankets of snow create a tranquil beauty broken only by the sounds of skiing.

In each season, the opportunities are limitless. You can swim, hike, golf, play tennis, sail or ski. Or, you can quietly enjoy the beauty of the environment and the birds and animals that live within it.






THE HOMESTEAD AMERICA'S FRESHWATER RESORT


- * A mile of sandy beach on Lake Michigan, three miles more on the Crystal River.

FIDDLER'S POND AT THE HOMESTEAD


Fiddler's Pond has been redone, inside and out!




STONY BROOK LODGE AT THE HOMESTEAD

THE INN AT THE HOMESTEAD






