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DAY ONE

There are two ideal choices for where to stay during your adventurous days ahead.

MORRO BAY

The charming **Anderson Inn**, overlooking scenic Morro Bay Harbor, is an intimate, luxury boutique inn. The newly renovated inn offers private ocean view suites with spa showers and many with fireplaces and jetted soaking tubs.

After getting settled in and ready for dinner, right below the Anderson Inn is **The Galley Restaurant**, right on the harbor docks. With floor to ceiling windows, every table overlooks the harbor and Morro Rock. The Galley chefs work with the finest purveyors to obtain only the freshest seafood from local waters and beyond and serves organic produce from local family farms.

CAYUCOS

The Pacific Motel's private bungalows offer laid-back luxury, with an old-school beach vibe. It features many high-end in-room amenities, as well as complimentary bike rentals, firepits, plus much more. It's only a few short blocks to the beach and "downtown" Cayucos.

Only a few minutes' walk from the Pacific Motel in Cayucos, is the popular **Café Della Via** Italian restaurant, serving traditional Italian dishes. Located less than a half-block from the ocean, you can enjoy a walk on the beach or pier before or after dinner.

DAY TWO

For breakfast, try **Hidden Kitchen** in Cayucos. Enjoy fabulous blue corn waffles, delicious egg scrambles, salads, tasty bowls, superfood smoothies, "boozy" beverages, and gourmet coffees and teas, all on its oceanfront patio. Or for the connoisseurs of micro-brewed coffee, try **Top Dog Coffee Bar** in Morro Bay.

After your morning repast, take a leisurely 30-minute drive to **Banner Airlines** at the Oceano Airport in Southern SLO CAL. Hop in its 1942 yellow biplane for an exhilarating open cockpit ride, flying high above the ocean and massive sand dunes below. You can also book a sightseeing tour or an adrenaline-pumping "thrill ride" in this vintage biplane. If the time is right, you'll see migrating whales or a school of dolphins.



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If you'd rather stay on land, consider **Pacific Adventure Tours**, also in Oceano. Experience the ride of your life with an expert driver, as you traverse the untamed terrain of the Oceano Dunes in an Xtreme Hummer. Fly over the top of the dunes, hang sideways, from mild to wild. It is "Wheels in the Air" excitement in a real USMC Humvee!

After your white-knuckle day, head back to the North Coast for a bit of R&R. If you're feeling like something casual, try **Taco Temple**, only a few minutes' drive from downtown Morro Bay. With its amazing selection of delectable Mexican dishes along with its cool, laid-back surfer vibe, it's certainly worth making a pilgrimage to the "Temple."

Or if you're in the mood for a more upscale night, the award-winning **Windows on the Water** would be a wise choice. Situated on the second floor, this fine dining restaurant has spectacular views of Morro Bay. The menu features local halibut to beef filet, with the chef sourcing locally raised livestock, seafood, and organically grown produce.

DAY THREE

Between Morro Bay and Cayucos, there are all kinds of Sea & Land Adventures. **The Kayak Shack** rents kayaks, canoes, and paddleboards, and offers guided kayak tours. Explore the beautiful harbor and the Morro Bay National Estuary, which includes Heron Rookery Natural Preserve.

Central Coast Lift offers electric boat rentals, private whale watching, fishing boat or yacht charters, electric hydro foils, and golf cart rentals—all available with exclusive catering services. If you want to get in the water and learn how to surf, **Good Clean Fun Surf Shop** in Cayucos provides private and group lessons, with all the equipment included. It also rents boards and wetsuits for the seasoned surfer.

After a day on the water, you'll undoubtedly have worked up an appetite. You're in luck. Go to **Tognazzini's "Dockside Too"** for lunch or dinner. It serves fresh seafood—all outdoors on its patio overlooking Morro Bay Harbor and Morro Rock. You'll find live music on most days, and it is a dog-friendly establishment. If for some reason the weather is a bit inclement, the original **Dockside Restaurant**, which offers indoor dining, is right next door.

Don't miss the **Libertine Pub** in Morro Bay. It serves 37 handcrafted beers on tap. It is committed to bringing the best beer selection to the Central Coast and that showcases the environment that gives



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its beer a true Central Coast terroir. Their food menu spotlights classic American diner fare. It also features live music and spectacular views across the harbor and Morro Rock.

In Cayucos, you'll find **Schooners' Wharf**. It is a fun and unique bar and upscale seafood shack—with a subtle touch of genteel roguishness—overlooking the Pacific Ocean and Cayucos Pier. The small upstairs bar, inhabited by locals and tourists alike, has excellent cocktails, craft beers, and local wines—and the full food menu is available in the bar, or dine at the restaurant downstairs. An iconic spot on the North Coast!

OTHER POINTS OF INTEREST

Another incredible experience is awaiting you in Cambria with **Clydesdale Horseback Trail Rides**. Enjoy a ride on a magnificent Clydesdale, one of the largest horse breeds in the world. These gentle giants will take you through open fields and an endangered Monterey pine forest, all while taking in panoramic views of the ocean. It also offers vehicle tours throughout the 2,000-acre ranch and where you'll see 50 or more Clydesdale, along with mini donkeys and pet goats.

And don't miss the **Elephant Seal Rookery**, located at Point Piedras Blancas, 7.7 miles north of San Simeon, California or approximately 45-minutes from Morro Bay. Since the first pup was born in February 1992, the colony has grown to an estimated 25,000 elephant seals—the largest seals in the world—along an 8+-mile stretch of coastline. Viewing areas are open every day.
