Luxury Itinerary

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DAY ONE

In Paso Robles, two remarkable hideaways would be ideal places to stay during your culinary treks. **The Geneseo Inn at Cass Winery** is a luxurious boutique inn nestled in the rolling hills of Paso Robles wine country. Perched above the vines on Cass Winery's 145 acres of vineyards, your stay truly allows you to "breathe in the vineyard views." It offers a range of activities, including cooking and wine classes, helicopter tours, and horseback trail rides. It has an on-site wine country café, and private dinners and room service are also available. The exclusive **The Canyon Villa**, also located in Paso Robles wine county, features four gracefully decorated rooms with breathtaking views, delightful amenities, and world-class cuisine. It features a complimentary three-course breakfast and wine hour. Canyon Villa also offers an exclusive Sunday supper, couple's massages, and culinary immersion programs for its guests.

After getting situated at Geneseo or The Canyon Villa and you're ready for a night out, there are no lack of marvelous choices for dinner. In downtown Paso Robles, you'll find **Hemingway's Steakhouse**. A 1920's inspired Steakhouse offering a wide variety of Wagyu, wild game, locally raised USDA prime beef and fresh caught seafood. **BL Brasserie**, also in downtown Paso Robles, features traditional brasserie-style fare with a casual feel in an elegant setting, utilizing local ingredients, paired with local and French wines.

DAY TWO

Take a tour of one of the world's most acclaimed wine regions. At **Sidecar Tours** a certified motorcycle driver—with a one- or two-person sidecar—will be your guide to explore wine country. **The Wine Line** offers private and semi-private personalized tours through the greater Paso Robles Wine Region, and picks guests up at their hotel or vacation rental. Or go to **Tin City**—only a few minutes from downtown Paso Robles— a one-stop location to experience some of the best of northern San Luis Obispo County. This charming food and beverage "industrial park" include wineries, a brewery, an olive oil producer, restaurants, distilleries, and a creamery.

After chilling back at your hotel, start your evening with a private cave tasting at **Eberle Winery** on the East Side of Paso Robles. Its VIP Room is an ideal setting for an intimate tasting experience for up to six guests. By reservation only, the private VIP tasting experience includes a tour of 16,000 square feet of underground caves, a one-on-one interaction with one of the knowledgeable tasting hosts, an artisan cheese plate paired with Eberle wines, all in the ambiance of the caves.



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For dinner, consider these two exceptional restaurants in downtown Paso Robles. **Les Petites Canailles** or In Bloom in downtown Paso Robles. Petites Canailles features a menu created by its

French-born chef, who first worked at prestigious restaurants in France and Las Vegas before landing in Paso Robles. **In Bloom** celebrates Paso Robles' food and wine culture by collaborating with local farms and purveyors. Receiving a Michelin-Mention in 2022, In Bloom takes classic Californian cuisine and gives it a deliciously clever update.

DAY THREE

For a culinary treat, visit **Pasolivo** for a tasting of exceptional olive oils grown and produced in Paso Robles. It offers in-depth tastings and a walk-about with a knowledgeable staff member—which includes two master olive oil sommeliers—that focuses on its orchards and fundamentals of olive oil farming and production. One can also bring a gourmet lunch and a bottle of wine to enjoy a picnic on its outdoor patios.

To continue your journey, head a few more minutes south to **Central Coast Distillery** in Atascadero. Craft distiller and owner—and accomplished chef—Eric Olson takes a culinary approach to the making of spirits. It serves an excellent selection of bourbons, vodkas, and gins for tasting and stellar seasonal cocktails, as well as tapas-style plates.

Or head out to **Halter Ranch**, on the West Side of Paso Robles. Halter Ranch is dedicated to land, art, and legendary terroir-driven wine. In addition to its beautiful tasting room, explore the open spaces of Halter Ranch in a classic Land Rover Defender. On this trek, you'll get to immerse yourself in the rich history of the Ranch, learn about organic farming and viticultural practices as you taste wine across its 2,700-acre wild estate. For aviation enthusiasts, you can fly into the Halter Ranch Estate. Touch down for lunch in the tasting room and take a bottle or two of your favorite wines to go!

For dinner, consider the restaurant at **Justin Winery & Vineyards**, just a few miles away from Halter Ranch. This Michelin-starred restaurant features a prix-fixe menu—prepared with the freshest ingredients grown on its 26-acre farm—along with two options for wine pairing. The winery also has a small inn. With its intimate suites, Just Inn is a lovely—and prudent—way to finish a marathon culinary experience and to begin the next morning with a homemade breakfast. Or back in downtown Paso, **The Hatch Rotisserie & Bar** is a Michelin-Mentioned gourmet rotisserie and bar located a block away from the Plaza. It features excellent entrees such as rotisserie chicken, shrimp & grits, meat loaf, seared salmon, NY strip, along small batch whiskeys and local wines and beers.
