### Scavenger Hunt Locations

#### 1. Buena Vista Winery (Sonoma)

California's first premium winery, founded by Agoston Haraszthy in 1857.

**Action:** Take your photo by behind the frame installation, on the left side as you enter the property.

#### 2. Sonoma Plaza General Vallejo Statue

In the historic Sonoma Plaza across from the Sonoma Barracks sits General Vallejo on a bench.

**Action:** Take your photo sitting next to General Vallejo.

#### 3. Mission San Francisco Solano (Sonoma, 1823)

Mission San Francisco Solano is the last and northernmost of the 21 missions established in Alta California.

**Action:** Take your photo in front of the mission bell.

#### 4. Mission Vineyard at Sebastiani Vineyards & Winery

The first vineyard planted in Sonoma Valley in 1825. The vineyard was initially planted for sacramental wine and later sold to Samuele Sebastiani and became part of the Sebastiani Vineyards and Winery.

**Action:** Take your photo in front of the Mission Vineyard sign.

#### 5. Gundlach Bundschu Winery (Sonoma, 1858)

The oldest continuously owned family winery in CA.

**Action:** Take a picture in front of the old pick-up truck in the driveway.

#### 6. Bartholomew Estate Winery (Sonoma, 1857)

Located on the original Haraszthy estate, the first private vineyard planted in Sonoma.

**Action:** Take a photo of yourself from inside the art gallery, located in the winery's tasting room.

#### 7. Sonoma Valley Wine 200 Years commemorative Flag (Sonoma Valley)

You'll find white and purple flags flying around Sonoma Valley to celebrate our 200th anniversary.

**Action:** Take a photo of yourself with a flag.

#### 8. Gloria Ferrer Winery (Carneros)

Take in the Valley views and have a glass of wine at the Al Fresco walk-in experience.

**Action:** Take a photo of yourself drinking a glass of sparkling wine at Gloria Ferrer Winery.

#### 9. Highway 12 Vineyards & Winery (Sonoma)

Locate their tasting room in a charming red barn tucked off Broadway near the Sonoma Plaza.

**Action:** Take a picture in front of the Highway 12 Vineyards & Winery red barn.

#### 10. Sonoma Valley Wine Directional Arrow Signage (Sonoma Valley)

These directional arrow signs help direct visitors to our member wineries throughout the Valley.

**Action:** Snap a photo of one of Sonoma Valley Wine's white posts with winery directional arrows.

#### 11. Kenwood Vineyards (Kenwood)

Sonoma Valley is known as the Valley of the Moon thanks to Jack London. Since 1976, Kenwood Vineyards has been the exclusive producer of wines from the historic vineyards of the famous Jack London Ranch.

**Action:** Locate and take a picture of the wolf on a Kenwood Wines label or winery entry sign.

#### 12. Fairmont Sonoma Mission Inn & Spa (Boyes Hot Springs)

Boyes Hot Springs is named after its natural hot springs and lush surroundings.

**Action:** Drive into the Fairmont Sonoma Mission Inn property and take a picture in front of the fountain.
