HISTORY MUSEUM ON THE SQUARE

Named by the readers of USATODAY's 10Best. com as the Best New Attraction in America in 2019, the History Museum on the Square features more than 18,000 square feet of exhibits in a 104-year-old former department store building in Downtown Springfield's entertainment district.

Discover the incredible Birthplace of Route 66 exhibit showcasing Springfield's legacy as the heart of the historic mother road. A 66-foot long

time-line and map details the moments and events that made Route 66 such an iconic fixture in American history.

Even more historic gems are on display including exhibits about the history of the region's indigenous people, Springfield's role in the American Civil War and the duel between "Wild Bill" Hickok and Davis Tutt — the first recorded quick-draw shootout of the Wild West era.

Officially recognized as the birthplace of Route 66, it was in Springfield, Missouri on April 30, 1926, that officials first proposed the name of the new Chicago-to-Los Angeles highway. In 1938, Route 66 became the first completely paved transcontinental highway in America, the "Mother Road," stretching from the Great Lakes to the Pacific Coast.

The birthplace of Route 66 offers something for every traveler – from pristine parks and trails to boutique shopping to diverse wineries, breweries and distilleries.

Springfield mixes its past with the future as historic Route 66 borders the downtown Jordan Valley Park. The road that once was to be the east/west thoroughfare for travelers in a hurry to get their

destinations now serves sightseers who take a more relaxed pace and savor every detail.

Below are just a few must-see stops along the historic route through the heart of Springfield.



- STEAK 'N SHAKE 1158 E. St. Louis St., Springfield, 417-866-6109 Outside, this Route 66 icon still offers curb-side service. Inside, enjoy the 1950's-style decor.
- 2 ROUTE 66 SPRINGFIELD VISITOR CENTER 815 E. St. Louis St., Springfield, 417-881-5300 Route 66 souvenirs and all the information you need for your visit.
- 3 ABOU BEN ADHEM SHRINE MOSQUE 601 E. St. Louis St., Springfield, 417-869-9164 Built in 1923, this unique building has a museum and serves as a community event venue.
- GILLIOZ THEATRE 325 Park Central East, Springfield, 417-863-9491 This opulent movie house opened in 1926 and remains a premiere event destination.
- 5 PARK CENTRAL SQUARE Downtown Springfield Designed by renowned landscape architect Lawrence Halprin, it is the site of the 1865 Wild Bill Hickok shootout.
