Red White and Blue Drive-Through Health & Safety, Registration and Route Information

Steamboat Springs, Colorado – June 23, 2020 – Registration is now open for the Red, White and Blue Drive-Through Fourth of July celebration. Locals with everything from classic cars and trucks to unique vehicles are encouraged to participate. Registration is free and required to secure a spot in the drive-through. Participation will be limited to 40 vehicles. Register here.

The drive-through was planned with physical distancing and group size restrictions at the forefront of the decision-making process. The event will follow all current state and local guidelines. It is designed to celebrate Steamboat Springs while bringing the festivities to local neighborhoods to allow for safe viewing, instead of the traditional parade where spectators line Lincoln Avenue. All participants will be in vehicles; no floats, handouts or pedestrians will be allowed

"The Chamber team is asking all visitors and locals to be mindful of all health and safety requirements while enjoying the celebrations this year," said Kara Stoller, Chamber CEO. "We have taken thoughtful steps to be able to welcome visitors back and host this event, and we want to make sure all the efforts the community has taken so far to keep us safe are not forgotten."

In order to ensure the health and safety of the community, it is important that all guests understand current recommendations from local public health officials. We are dedicated to the 5 Commitments of Containment and ask you please follow those guidelines whenever you are in Steamboat Springs. Here are some tips for all visitors and locals to follow to safely enjoy the Red, White and Blue Drive-Through:

- Gather in groups of 10 or less with your family and friends
- Remain at least 6 feet away from other groups
- Spread out along the route
- Wear a mask or face covering when out in public

The drive-through will begin at 10 a.m. in the Strings parking lot and continue through mountain-side neighborhoods before connecting to Hilltop Ln and Amethyst. From there, the drive-through will wind its way downtown and continue to the West side of town. There will be rolling street closures throughout the procession, but no hard closures.
