- Go antiquing at Roller Mills Antique Mall, Antiques at 221, Wilson Ross, and the Street of Shops.
- Buy fresh, local products at the year-round farmers market on Fairground Road on Wednesdays, and at the growers market on Fridays in Hufgnagle Park (late spring to early fall).
- Enjoy the Susquehanna River with Canoe Susquehanna or a picnic lunch in Soldier's Park.
- Experience Rural Heritage Days at the historic Dale/ Engle/Walker House.
- Explore the visual and performing arts at Bucknell's Samek Gallery and the Weis Center for Performing Arts. Listen to live music at many downtown eateries, taverns, and cafes.
- Cheer for the Bucknell Bison at sporting events.
- Attend the Ice Festival in February, Arts Festival in April, July 4th Parade, Stroll Through the Arts in November, and Victorian Holiday Parade in December.





How to find Lewisburg

From the east or west: Take I-80 exit 210A and follow Route 15 south for 2 miles. Turn left onto Rt. 45.

From north or south: Follow Route 15. Historic downtown Lewisburg is located on Rt. 45, one-half mile east of the Rt. 15 and Rt. 45 intersection.

Campus Theatre

View film the way it was intended, at the Campus Theatre, one of America's few remaining singlescreen, Art Deco Movie Palaces. The building's finely appointed interior, from its mirrored lobby and lounge furnishings to the wall and ceiling murals and light fixtures, is marked by luxurious Art Deco quality with its rich materials and novel decorative motifs. Two 12-foot high murals adorn each mid-auditorium sidewall. In 1941, the unique beauty of the Theatre combined with the excellence of the film programming promised to make every event at The Campus a work of art.





Slifer House: A Victorian Museum

Once the home of Colonel Eli Slifer, a distinguished businessman, manufacturer and Secretary of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania during the Civil War, the mansion was so notable it was featured in the 19th century magazine Godey's Lady's Book (1862). The home is now a fine museum filled with all the accoutrements of the Victorian era, from furnishings to china, artwork, toys, and textiles.

Packwood House Museum

In 1936, Lewisburg natives Edith and John Fetherston purchased this former tavern and filled it with art and antiques from Pennsylvania and around the world. The Fetherstons left their home and collections in a trust to create "a Public Museum for the educational benefits of all persons." Today, visitors see not only the historic building, but the Fetherstons' treasures of glass, ceramics, textiles, furniture, paintings, Pennsylvania German decorative arts, and oriental art.
