- Two wheelchair accessible, sandy beaches with nearby refreshments, accessible toilets and outdoor showers.
- Two floating beach wheelchairs are available for use free of charge. Prior booking is essential. Please contact Peter.Beynon@swansea.gov.uk.
- Spectacular views over the Bristol Channel to North Devon and beyond.
- Grab your camera to capture Langland's iconic 1920's and 1930's beach huts.
- Choughs, skylarks, peregrines and buzzards can all be seen along this walk.
- Bloomin' beautiful: come and see stunning wildflowers like gorse, thrift and red and white campions in Spring.

Start & Finish: Bus stop on Caswell Road opposite Caswell Drive, Newton.

Distance/time: About 2 miles (3.2 km), 1 – 2 hours.

Terrain: Surface varies from hard and smooth, to soft and uneven earth. There are steps but no stiles.

Safety: The route crosses the golf course – beware of airborne golf balls! The path runs close to cliffs and slopes along coast. Wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the conditions and season.

Refreshments: Refreshments at Langland Bay and Caswell Bay.

Amenities: Langland Bay – RADAR accessible public toilets, outdoor shower. Caswell Bay – RADAR accessible public toilets, unisex baby change, changing places, outdoor shower. Both free to use and open 09:00 – 19:00 in summer, 09:00 – 17:00 in winter.

Information correct at time of going to print – February 2025.

- Walk back the way you arrived on the bus for a few yards onto Caswell Road. Turn left and after a few yards turn right along Hillgrove (private road, but public footpath).
- Follow Hillgrove until the road ends and it becomes a footpath across the golf course.
- Follow the path towards the ocean where you will see some steps leading down to the coast path. Carefully walk down the steps and turn left along the coast path, following this until Langland Bay.
- Walk past a few beach huts and turn left after Langland's Brasserie. Turn left again on Langland Bay Road and walk towards Langland Golf Club.
- Before the clubhouse, turn right past the 'no entry' sign and follow the narrow path across and then alongside (or adjacent to) the golf course.
- Here you will emerge onto a track. Cross over the track and up the steps onto the higher track, and back onto Hillgrove, the road you followed earlier.
- Turn right and follow the track, retracing your steps back to Caswell Road. Turn left then right to return to the bus stop.
