This local hotspot is brimming with basketball memorabilia including a

treasure trove of artifacts celebrating Bird's time with the Boston Celtics and his days as a Sycamore. And, yes, Larry has been here... a few times!

5. Check Out the Throwback Mural

His mural, featuring the iconic Sports Illustrated cover of Larry Bird in his Indiana State University No. 33 jersey from the legendary 1979 NCAA season, is a fitting tribute to both the basketball icon and Terre Haute's rich basketball heritage.

6. Bonus: Catch a game at Hulman Center

While you're in town, be sure to check out the game schedule for Indiana State University's men's and women's basketball at the Hulman Center - where Larry found his fame - to catch exciting Division I action up close and see Larry's #33 retired jersey hanging on the wall.
